Second-Round Notes – Friday, June 1, 2018

Weather: Cloudy with late afternoon thunderstorms with highs in the lower 80s. NW wind at 5-10 mph. Second-round play was delayed due to severe weather in the area at 4:17 p.m. ET and play resumed at 5:45 p.m. ET for a delay of one hour and 28 minutes.

In the 43 times that the Memorial Tournament has been contested, this is the 26th time play has been suspended at least once.

36-hole cut: 81 players made the cut at even-par 144. The 54-hole cut will be used since there are more than 78 players advanced to the weekend.

Six Things to Know

- Kyle Stanley holds the second-round lead/co-lead on PGA TOUR for fourth time in his career. He is yet to convert the 36-hole lead into a victory.
- Tiger Woods is leading the field in Strokes Gained: Tee-To-Green (+4.142) and is second in Strokes Gained: Approach-the-Green (+3.213) and Strokes Gained: Around-the-Green and third in Proximity to Hole (23'0").
- Niemann, who is one shot back entering the weekend, will be 19 years, 6 months, 27 days on Sunday. With a win this week, would become third-youngest winner in PGA TOUR history (Harry Cooper/19 years, 4 days/1923 Galveston Open, Ralph Guldahl/19 years, 2 months, 3 days/1931 Santa Monica Open).
- Largest comeback after 36 holes at the Memorial Tournament is nine shots by Ray Floyd in 1982.
- Jason Day (T4) or Justin Rose (T9) could overtake Justin Thomas as the leader in the FedExCup standings with a win this week.
- Dustin Johnson and Justin Rose each have guaranteed a shot at taking over No. 1 in the Official World Golf Rankings this weekend with a win. Depending on Thomas' finish, there are a number of scenarios in which either could overtake Thomas without a victory.

- Stanley posted a career-best round at Muirfield Village with a 6-under 66 that included eight birdies and two bogeys.
- Has two top-10s in five prior starts at the Memorial Tournament, including a T6 in 2017 and solo-third in 2013.
- Recorded his fifth consecutive under-par round at Muirfield Village.
- Carded 14 birdies, second best in the field, through two rounds.
- In three prior tries with the 36-hole lead/co-lead, Stanley has finished T24 (2011 Honda Classic), 2nd (2012 Farmers Insurance Open), and T4 (THE PLAYERS Championship 2017).
- Hit 11 of 14 fairways, 14 of 18 greens, and needed 26 putts.
- Former Clemson Tiger finished a career-best 24th in the FedExCup standings a year ago.

Joaquin Niemann (T1) Age: 19 (November 7, 1998) Joined TOUR: Non-member

- Niemann birdied three of his final five holes Friday to take a share of the 36-hole lead with a 4-under 68. It is his first share of the 36-hole lead on the PGA TOUR.
- Chilean was No. 1 in the World Amateur Golf Ranking before making his professional debut at the 2018 Valero Texas Open, where he finished sixth to earn a spot in the 2018 Wells Fargo Championship (MC).
- Leading the field in birdies (15) and putting average (1.517) through two rounds.
- Early in 2017, in Panama, he faced his friend, Toto Gana, in a playoff for the Latin America Amateur title and a Masters berth. Gana won and earned his ticket to Augusta National. Niemann traveled to Augusta to watch. In 2018, Niemann won the Latin America Amateur title to earn a spot in this year's field at Augusta National, missing the cut with rounds of 76-77.
- Prior to winning the Latin America Amateur, Niemann finished T108 at Web.com Tour Qualifying Tournament in early December, failing to gain fully exempt status on the Web.com Tour.
- Last week, Niemann finished T8 at the Fort Worth Invitational.
- Currently owns 180 non-member FedExCup points and requires 89 additional FedExCup points (solo 7th or better) to match No. 150 from last season (269/Rick Lamb) and become eligible to seek Special Temporary Membership of PGA TOUR.

Additional Player Notes

Byeong Hun An (3)

- Tied his lowest career round at Muirfield Village with a bogey-free, 5-under 67.
- Finished in the top 25 in back-to-back years (T25/2017, T11/2016) at the Memorial Tournament after missing the cut in his first start in 2010.
- Has two top-10s in 13 starts this season with a season-best T5 at The Honda Classic.
- Hit 12 of 14 fairways, 16 of 18 greens, and took 31 putts.

Hideki Matsuyama (T4)

- Won the Memorial Tournament in his first appearance in 2014 and returned in 2015 to finish T5. Missed the cut in 2016, T45 in 2017.
- First player from Japan to win the Memorial Tournament and youngest player in tournament history to win the event with his win in 2014 (22 years, 3 months, 7 days).

• Has now shot under-par in 12 of 16 rounds at Muirfield Village.

Wesley Bryan (T4)

- Making his first start at the Memorial Tournament, opened with back-to-back 68s.
- Opened season with six straight made cuts before missing the cut in seven of his last nine starts entering this week. Season-best finish was a T27 at the Sentry Tournament of Champions.

J.B. Holmes (T4)

- Holmes' second-round, 6-under 66 is his best round in 34 career rounds at the Memorial Tournament. In 10 prior starts here, his best finish is a T4 in 2016.
- Played the par-5s in 5-under-par during his second round and is 8-under on the par-5s through two rounds.
- Six for six scrambling in the second round

Bryson DeChambeau (T4)

- Opened the front nine with six birdies on his way to a 6-under 30 but posted a bogey at the par-5 11th and double bogey at the par-4 14th before birdies at Nos. 16 and 17 for a 5-under 67.
- Has four top-five finishes in 15 starts this season including a season-best runner-up finish at the Arnold Palmer Invitational. Ranked 22nd in the FedExCup standings.
- Leading the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (+3.090) through two rounds.

Jason Day (T4)

- Hit 9 of 14 fairways, 13 of 18 greens in regulation and needed 28 putts (holed 61'7" of putts).
- Day is one of two players along with Justin Rose who could surpass Justin Thomas for the FedExCup points lead with a win this week.
- One of five multiple winners this season with victories at the Farmers Insurance Open and Wells Fargo Championship.
- In nine prior starts at the Memorial Tournament, T15 in 2017 is his best result.
- Ranked second in proximity in the second round with an average distance from the pin of 19'4".
- Leads the TOUR in SG:Putting (+1.414) but was 97th in Strokes Gained: Putting (-1.365) during the second round.

Tiger Woods (T24)

- One day after playing the par-5s in 1-over-par, Woods played the par-5s in 5-under-par in the second round with three birdies and an eagle.
- Holed out from 95 yards on the par-5 11th for his 13th career eagle at Muirfield Village.
- Ranked first in Strokes Gained: Tee-To-Green (+4.142) through two rounds.
- First in Strokes Gained: Approach-the-Green (+4.691) during the second round but was 119th in Strokes Gained:Putting (-3.686).
- Sits second in Strokes Gained: Around the Green (+1.943) this week.
- Ranked 79th in Strokes Gained: Putting (-4.267) through two rounds.
- Hit 9 of 14 fairways, 14 of 18 greens in regulation and needed 27 putts during the second round.
- Five -time winner at Muirfield Village makes 16th appearance at this event, but first since 2015.

Justin Rose (T9)

- Has one victory (2010), two runner-ups and four additional top-10s in 11 career starts at the Memorial Tournament. Finished runner-up in his last start here in 2015.
- After winning the Fort Worth Invitational last weekend, Rose could overtake Justin Thomas for No. 1 in the FedExCup standings with a win.
- Won twice already in 10 starts this season with victories at the World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions and Fort Worth Invitational, one of five multiple winners this season.

Dustin Johnson (T14)

- Starting on No. 10, Johnson, who leads the PGA TOUR in scoring average at 69.198, played the first three holes in 1over but played his last 15 holes of the second round in 7-under.
- Has two top-10s at the Memorial Tournament in 10 prior starts with a career-best solo-third in 2016.
- Could overtake World No. 1 Justin Thomas with a win. With a solo second, he'd need Thomas to finish worse than solo fifth. With a solo third, Thomas would need to finish worse than fifth. With a solo fourth, Thomas would need to finish worse than 11th, and with a solo fifth, Thomas would need to finish worse than 22nd.

Phil Mickelson (T35)

• After playing his first 26 holes of the tournament in 3-over-par, Mickelson has played his last 10 holes in 7-under-par.

- Through two rounds, Mickelson is 8-under-par combined on the front nine at Muirfield Village Golf Club and 4-over-par on the back nine.
- Has made 14 cuts in 17 previous starts at the Memorial Tournament but has just three top-10s, with a career-best T4 in 2006.

Adam Hadwin (T69)

• Continued a current PGA TOUR-best streak of 16 consecutive made cuts with birdies on two of his last four holes to make the cut on the number after rounds of 74-70-144 (E).

Stewart Cink (MC)

• Missed the cut with rounds of 75-73, snapping a tournament record streak of 19 consecutive cuts made (1998-2015, 2017).

Ryan Armour (T14)

• Former Ohio State Buckeye Ryan Armour opened with rounds of 70-68-138 (-6) in his second career start at the Memorial Tournament. Armour missed the cut with back-to-back 76s a year ago at Muirfield Village.

Jason Dufner (MC)

• Defending champion Jason Dufner missed the cut with rounds of 75-73-148 (+4).
