Six Things To Know

- Webb Simpson tied the course record at THE PLAYERS Stadium Course at TPC Sawgrass with a 9-under 63. He's the seventh player to accomplish the feat and the first since Colt Knost in the second round in 2016.
- Simpson tied the 36-hole scoring record at 15-under with Jason Day (2016).
- Simpson's five-shot lead through 36 holes is the largest in THE PLAYERS history, eclipsing the previous fourstroke margin set by Jason Day in 2016.
- This is the fourth time the 36-hole leader at THE PLAYERS has led by at least three shots, and each of the first three leaders went on to win (Jason Day/2016, Greg Norman/1994, Lanny Wadkins/1979).
- Patrick Cantlay will enter the weekend in the top 5 for the second straight year.
- Tiger Woods made the cut on the number at 1-under 143. His third-round tee time is 9:00 a.m.

Second-Round Lead Notes

- 12 Second-round leaders/co-leaders at THE PLAYERS Championship to win (most recent: Jason Day/2016)
- 6 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win on PGA TOUR in 2017-18 (most recent: Patrick Reed/Masters Tournament)

The largest 36-hole come-from-behind victory at THE PLAYERS was seven shots in 2010. Tim Clark was T23 at 5under at the halfway mark, and he closed with rounds of 66-67 to win by one at 16-under.

- Tied the best birdie streak at THE PLAYERS (6) on Nos. 11-16
- Best finish at THE PLAYERS in eight previous appearances is a T15 in 2013
- 11th time he's held at least a share of the 36-hole lead on the PGA TOUR; Converted the victory once in 10 previous occurrences
- Ranks T133 of 144 players in Driving Distance (274) and T7 in Driving Accuracy through two rounds.
- Made 142' 8" of putts in R2, nearly double his 2017-18 average of 76' 3" entering the week. His R1 total was 139' 2".
- Five-stroke lead is the largest through 36 holes in THE PLAYERS history
- Represents the largest 36-hole lead of the 2017-18 PGA TOUR Season through 27 events

- Finished T7 at the CIMB Classic in Malaysia last October for his lone top-10 this season. Missed his last two cuts ahead of THE PLAYERS.

Chesson Hadley (T5)

- Six top-10s in 2017-18 (previous best was four in 2013-14)
- Two missed cuts in three starts at THE PLAYERS (T24/2015)
- Qualified for THE PLAYERS by finishing No. 1 on combined 2017 Web.com Tour Regular Season and Finals money list
- One of three players that has been ranked inside the top 25 of the FedExCup after each week during the 2017-18 season (Chesson Hadley, Brendan Steele, Tony Finau)
- Closed his second round with double bogey-bogey on Nos. 17 and 18

Charles Howell III (T5)

- Playing his 16th PLAYERS (best result: T32/2003).
- Entering this week, he had just three scores in the 60s in 42 rounds at THE PLAYERS (73.33 average). He had broken par just nine times.
- First time carding consecutive rounds in the 60s at THE PLAYERS.
- His 5-under 67 on Friday matches his career-best score at THE PLAYERS (R2/2013).

Record-27 Eagles in R2

27 eagles in R2 is the most in a round in THE PLAYERS history. Of the 27 eagles made, 12 were on the second hole, which surpasses the previous record of nine (R2/1999).

Hole 12 modifications:

- Extend fairway bunker improve definition of left edge of approach from tee, and catch balls landing left and short
- Reduce width of the fairway bunker and widen fairway just short of approach improve visual to right side of approach from tee
- Raise left edge of approach and lower right edge of approach so that tee shots do not feed as severely towards the water
- Double the width of the rough strip along bulkhead and make half of it primary rough height
