## **Six Things To Know**

- With six birdies in his first seven holes, Tiger Woods shot the low round of the day, a 5-under 65, to take a threestroke lead into the final round in search of his 80<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR victory and first since the 2013 World Golf Championships-Bridgestone Invitational
- Following bogeys on his first two holes, Justin Rose (T2) rallied to card a 2-under 68 and is currently projected to win the FedExCup with Tiger Woods projected No. 2
- Woods' third-round 65 was his fifth consecutive round in the 60s, which stands as his longest streak of the season. It is his best since a streak of six rounds in 2013 (R1/ THE NORTHERN TRUST R2/Dell Technologies Championship)
- Rory McIlroy shot a 4-under 66 to move into a tie for second with Rose. When he won the TOUR Championship in 2016, McIlroy carded rounds of 66-64 on the weekend
- Hideki Matsuyama's second-round remains the only bogey-free round through three rounds
- Bryson DeChambeau, the FedExCup standings leader entering this week, improved by nine strokes in the third round, rebounding from a 75 on Friday with a 4-under 66 to improve to T21

### **Third-Round Lead Notes**

- 53/57 Tiger Woods' record when holding at least a share of the 54-hole lead on the PGA TOUR, including a 42-2 record when holding the outright lead
- 19/31 54-hole leaders who have gone on to win the TOUR Championship (most recently Jordan Spieth/2015)
- 28/46 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win on PGA TOUR in 2017-18 (most recently Bryson DeChambeau/THE NORTHERN TRUST)

### FedExCup Playoffs and the TOUR Championship

• The TOUR Championship is the last of four events of the FedExCup Playoffs and the finale to the PGA TOUR season for the 12<sup>th</sup> consecutive season since the FedExCup Playoffs were introduced in 2007.

- The top-125 players on the final PGA TOUR Regular Season FedExCup points list (following the Wyndham Championship) qualified for THE NORTHERN TRUST (won by Bryson DeChambeau).
- The top-100 players on the FedExCup points list following THE NORTHERN TRUST qualified for the Dell Technologies Championship (won by Bryson DeChambeau).
- The top-70 players on the FedExCup points list after the Dell Technologies Championship advanced to the BMW Championship (won by Keegan Bradley).
- The top-30 players following the BMW Championship qualified for the TOUR Championship. Prior to the start of the TOUR Championship, a "points reset" took place, giving all players in the field a mathematical opportunity to win the FedExCup title. Any of the top-five players in the standings will claim the FedExCup with a victory at East Lake.

The top-five players in the FedExCup standings entering the TOUR Championship will win the FedExCup title should they go on to victory at East Lake.

  - 2007 and 2009 FedExCup champion takes a three-stroke lead into the final round following a 5-under 65, which stood as the low round of the day
  - Front-nine 6-under 30 included birdies on six of his first seven holes
  - Five consecutive 3s to start the round were the most consecutive in his career since 2003
  - Needed just 23 putts in the third round (28/R1, 27/R2) and leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (5.104)
  - Third-round 65 is his fifth consecutive round in the 60s dating back to the third round of the 2018 BMW Championship, his longest streak since he posted six in a row from the first round of THE NORTHERN TRUST 2013 through the second round of the 2013 Dell Technologies Championship
  - Last posted his first three rounds in the 60s in a PGA TOUR event at the 2015 Wyndham Championship; hasn't posted all four rounds in the 60s since THE NORTHERN TRUST 2013
  - Last held the 54-hole lead at the World Golf Championships-Bridgestone Invitational in 2013 (seven shots)
  - Marks 58<sup>th</sup> time Woods has held the third-round lead/co-lead on PGA TOUR, going on to win 53/57 times
  - When having the 54-hole lead/co-lead, has gone on to win the TOUR Championship (1999\*, 2007) \*1999 TOUR
    Championship was held at the Champions Golf Club in Houston
  - Making his 15<sup>th</sup> appearance in the TOUR Championship, but first since 2013. Recorded eight top-10s in the tournament, including two wins (1999, 2007) and four runner-up finishes
  - Would become the fourth FedExCup champion to win after beginning the TOUR Championship outside the top five in the standings (Rory McIlroy/6<sup>th</sup>/2016; Bill Haas/25<sup>th</sup>/2011; Jim Furyk/11<sup>th</sup>/2010)
  - Would become the first three-time champion of both the FedExCup (2007, 2009) and TOUR Championship (1999, 2007)

- World No. 1 opened with bogeys on his first two holes before birdieing three of his next four en route to a 2under 68
- Came from behind to win in five of his nine career PGA TOUR victories, with four of those instances being a deficit of three strokes or more
- Looking to join Tiger Woods as the only player to win the FedExCup as the No. 1-ranked player in the world
- Saturday's 68 marks the 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive round under par dating to the first round of the 2018 Dell Technologies Championship
- Entering the week leading the PGA TOUR in Total Driving, Rose is second in Driving Accuracy at East Lake after hitting 9 of 14 fairways in round three, pushing his tournament total to 28 of 42
- His best-ever finish in the FedExCup was fifth in 2011
- Second in scoring average on the PGA TOUR (69.0), behind only to Dustin Johnson (68.7)
- Arrived at the TOUR Championship No. 2 in the FedExCup standings and No. 1 in the Official World Golf Ranking for the first time of his career.
- Posted 10 top-10s this season including two wins (WGC-HSBC Champions, Fort Worth Invitational)
- Making ninth start at TOUR Championship where he's had five top-10s in last five appearances (T10/2017, T2/2015, T4/2014, 6<sup>th</sup>/2013, 2<sup>nd</sup>/2012)
- Has never won more than two times on the PGA TOUR in a season (2010, 2018)

- 2016 FedExCup champion moved into a tie for second after a 4-under 66 after making birdie on two of his last three holes
- Also shot a 66 on Saturday in 2016 before carding a final-round 64 to win the tournament in a playoff over Kevin Chappell and Ryan Moore; trailed by two strokes going into the final round in 2016
- Leads the field in driving distance (319.7) and remains No. 1 in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (5.180) through 54holes
- In four previous appearances at the TOUR Championship, has never finished lower than T16 (2015)
- Captured six top-10 finishes on the season, including his first win since 2016 at the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard
- FedExCup Playoffs wins 4 (tied for most with Dustin Johnson)

### Two champions at East Lake

### First timers at the TOUR Championship

Six players are making their first appearance at the TOUR Championship this week, including Bryson DeChambeau, No. 1 in the FedExCup. He is joined by Cameron Smith (10), Francesco Molinari (13), Tommy Fleetwood (19), Aaron Wise (21) and Patton Kizzire (30). With a victory, they would join Chad Campbell (2003), Bart Bryant (2005), Bill Haas (2011), Henrik Stenson (2013) and Xander Schauffele (2017) as players to win the TOUR Championship in their first appearance (not including Tom Watson's win at the first TOUR Championship in 1987).

# Rookies in the FedExCup Playoffs

Eight PGA TOUR rookies advanced to the FedExCup Playoffs to earn their first start at THE NORTHERN TRUST, the first of four Playoffs events. Only Aaron Wise was successful in reaching the TOUR Championship. Wise won his first PGA TOUR title at the AT&T Byron Nelson, before missing the cut in six of his next seven starts (T6/World Golf Championships-Bridgestone Invitational) to enter the Playoffs No. 27 in the FedExCup standings. Wise starts the TOUR Championship at No. 21 in the FedExCup. Here's a look at his progress through the Playoffs:

### **Additional Player Notes**

Kyle Stanley joined the top five on the leaderboard (T4) following a 3-under 67. Currently projected 13<sup>th</sup> in the FedExCup, Stanley has not finished higher than 24<sup>th</sup> (2017) in the final standings.

Tony Finau (T6) improved his standing in round three with a 3-under 67. A solo-second finish Sunday would offer Finau a chance at winning the FedExCup, making him the first player to win the season-long title without a victory.

Entering the week at No. 4 in the FedExCup standings, Dustin Johnson birdied four of his last six holes to shoot a 3-under 67 and move into a tie for ninth.

Bryson DeChambeau, who won the first two Playoffs events and entered the TOUR Championship in the No. 1 position, sits T21 after rebounding in round three with a 4-under 66, including eagles on hole Nos. 6 and 17.

Defending FedExCup champion Justin Thomas (T9) carded an even-par 70 and is currently projected to finish No. 6 in the final standings.

There are four past FedExCup champions (Tiger Woods, Billy Horschel, Rory McIlroy, Justin Thomas) at East Lake this year. Thomas, McIlroy and Horschel can join Tiger Woods (2007, 2009) as the only two-time winners of the FedExCup.
