Eight Tournament Takeaways

- Paul Casey seven runner-up finishes before today, most recently at the 2016 BMW Championship.
- Russell Henley played 62 holes without a bogey (from No. 5 in round one through No. 12 in round four).
- En route to tying the low round of the week, an 8-under 62, 1997 and 2008 Travelers Championship winner Stewart Cink sank a 14' 1" putt for birdie at the 72nd hole.
- Monday qualifier Chase Seiffert (T4) was T2 after 36 holes at the 2017 Travelers Championship after Monday qualifying. Finished T43 that year.
- Kevin Tway's T6 finish marked his third top-10 in his last five starts (T9/AT&T Byron Nelson, T5/Fort Worth Invitational).
- Defending champion Jordan Spieth posted scores of 63-73-71-69—276 (-4) to finish T42. Only tournament champion to successfully defend his title was Phil Mickelson (2001-02).
- Brooks Koepka posted rounds of 68-69-69-65 to finish at 9-under 271 (T19).
- In his second start at the Travelers Championship (T17/2017), World No. 7 Rory McIlroy finished 11-under 269 (T12).

Bubba Watson (-17/1st)

Age: 39 (November 5, 1978)

Joined TOUR: 2006

- Claims his third Travelers Championship title (2010, 2015, 2018) and 12th on the PGA TOUR in his 288th TOUR start at the age of 39 years, 7 months, 19 days.
- Third win at the Travelers Championship (in 12 starts) is one shy of Billy Casper for the most Travelers Championship wins (1963, 1965, 1968, 1973).
- Becomes the 2017-18 PGA TOUR Season's first three-time winner (Genesis Open, World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play) and moves to No. 3 in the FedExCup standings.
- In a total of 44 rounds at TPC River Highlands, has recorded four scores of 63 or better and 25 rounds of 67 or better.
- Began the final round six strokes behind Paul Casey's 16-under lead. En route to 2010 Travelers Championship win, was also six strokes back after 54 holes. Won in sudden death over Corey Pavin and Scott Verplank.
- The largest number of strokes an eventual Travelers Championship winner trailed by beginning the final round of the Travelers Championship remains seven (Brad Faxon/2005).
- Has now come from behind in the final round to win seven times (11 stroke-play victories).
- 2018 Travelers Championship marks the 14th occasion (of 33) on which a player has come from behind to win in the final round on TOUR this season.
- Since 2000, only six 54-hole leaders/co-leaders have managed to win the Travelers Championship: Jordan Spieth (2017), Freddie Jacobson (2011), Stewart Cink (2008), J.J. Henry (2006), Peter Jacobsen (2003) and Phil Mickelson (2001).
- 2017-18 starts-made cuts-top-10s-wins: 15-13-5-3
- PGA TOUR career starts-made cuts-top-10s-wins: 288-210-61-12

Watson's stats for the week:

R1 – 5 of 14 fairways, 12 of 18 greens in regulation, 3/6 scrambling, 30 putts.

R2 – 9 of 14 fairways, 16 of 18 greens in regulation, 1/2 scrambling, 28 putts.

R3 – 6 of 14 fairways, 13 of 18 greens in regulation, 1/3 scrambling, 30 putts.

R4 – 9 of 14 fairways, 13 of 18 greens in regulation, 4/5 scrambling, 24 putts.

Paul Casey (-14/T2)

- Led by four strokes at 16-under 194 after 54 holes, before a 2-over 72 resulted in a T2 with Stewart Cink, Beau Hossler and J.B. Holmes.
- The loss of a four-stroke lead after 54 holes is the largest on the PGA TOUR since Dustin Johnson was not able to convert a six-stroke lead after three rounds at the 2017 World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions.
- Claims his third top-five finish in his previous three starts at TPC River Highlands (T2/2018, T5/2017 and 2nd/2015).
- Has now claimed eight runner-up finishes on the PGA TOUR.
- Claims his fifth top-10 finish of the season, and 53rd of his TOUR career.
- Would have been the first Englishman to win the Travelers Championship.

J.B. Holmes (-14/T2)

- Posted a 3-under 67 to finish in a tie for second, his fifth runner-up finish on the PGA TOUR.
- In six Travelers Championship appearances, T2 finish supplants previous-best finish T37 in 2012.
- Was in search of his fifth TOUR win and most recent since the 2015 Houston Open.

Stewart Cink (-14/T2)

- 1997 and 2008 Travelers Championship winner birdied six of his first nine holes, and 10 total in the final round, en route to a career-low tying 8-under 62 (2016 The RSM Classic/R1/T10).
- T2 finish marks his best finish since winning the 2009 Open Championship.
- Six-time PGA TOUR winner was in search of his first title since the 2009 Open Championship.
- Needed just 22 putts Sunday to complete his round, seven fewer than any other round.
- Was making his 559th career start on the PGA TOUR. Only five other current players have more TOUR starts.

Chase Seiffert (-12/T9)

- Monday Qualifier was six-under through 10 holes before posting a final round 6-under 64 to finish T9.
- Becomes the fourth Monday qualifier to finish inside the top-10 on TOUR this season, joining Scott Strohmeyer (T4/Sanderson Farms Championship), Trey Mullinax (T8/Valspar Championship) and Julian Suri (T8/Houston Open).
- Last Monday qualifier to win on the PGA TOUR was Arjun Atwal at the 2010 Wyndham Championship.
- Was a college teammate at Florida State University with Brooks Koepka.
- With his top-10 finish, will earn a spot into the A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier field in two weeks.
