Six Things to Know

- Windy conditions, with gusts to 32 mph, led to just five players posting par-or-better scores on day one
- World No. 1 and recent FedEx St. Jude Classic winner Dustin Johnson posted a 1-under 69 as he seeks to become the first player to win a PGA TOUR event and then the U.S. Open the following week
- Tiger Woods opened with a triple-bogey 7 en route to an 8-over 78 in his 20th U.S. Open start
- Jordan Spieth posted an 8-over 78 for his highest score in 22 major championship starts
- Rory McIlroy's 10-over 80 marked his highest score in 29 rounds at the U.S. Open
- Four players tied for the first-round lead is the most on TOUR since six led at THE PLAYERS this year, including Dustin Johnson

- 21 First-round leaders/co-leaders at the U.S. Open to win (most recently Martin Kaymer in 2014)
- 7 First-round leaders/co-leaders to win on the PGA TOUR in 2017-18 (most recently Webb Simpson at THE PLAYERS)
- 63 Low first round in tournament history (63/Jack Nicklaus/1980; 63/Tom Weiskopf/1980)
- Rickie Fowler's opening-round score to lead in 2017 (eventual winner Brooks Koepka was T4 with a 67) 65
- 7 Most players tied for the lead after 18 holes at the U.S. Open (Southern Hills/1977)

- Has now held the first-round lead/co-lead 16 times on the PGA TOUR, going on to win three times (2009 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am/54 holes; 2010 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am; 2013 Sentry Tournament of Champions/54 holes).
- Has failed to carry the first-round lead/co-lead on to victory in his last 10 attempts, including three in major championships (2015) U.S. Open/T2; 2015 Open Championship/T49; 2015 PGA Championship/T7.

- Opened with a 1-under 69 as he seeks his first made cut at a major championship since finishing T2 at the 2016 U.S. Open.
- First alternate out of the Memphis, Tennessee qualifier and added to the field on Monday.
- Holds the lead/co-lead for the seventh time on the PGA TOUR (won the 2012 RBC Canadian Open)

Additional Player Notes

Tiger Woods (T101)

- Making his 20th start at the U.S. Open and playing in his 70th round, posted an opening-round 8-over 78
- Opened with a triple-bogey 7 on the par-4 first hole
- Last time he opened U.S. Open with a double bogey or worse came in 2008 when he went on to win his last of 14 majors

Mickey DeMorat (T13)

• Including a 2-shot penalty for hitting the wrong ball on No. 14, posted an opening-round 2-over 72 on his 23rd birthday.

Patrick Reed (T19)

- Turned in a 3-over 73 as he seeks to win the Masters and the U.S. Open in the same year.
- Six players (seven times) have performed the feat in the past, with Jordan Spieth (2015) the latest to do so.

Steve Stricker (T19)

- Opened with a 3-over 73 as he seeks to make the cut for the 27th consecutive time in a major championship.
- Last missed cut in a major came at the 2009 PGA Championship.

Luis Gagne and Will Grimmer (T19)

Of the 20 amateurs in the 156-player field (the most since 1962), led the way Thursday with matching 3-over 73s.

Justin Thomas (T37)

- FedExCup leader posted a 4-over 74 in his fourth U.S. Open start (MC/2014, 32/2016, 9/2017).
- Is in search of his ninth PGA TOUR victory (and third of the season).

Sergio Garcia (T46)

Making his 76th consecutive start in a major championship, recorded a 5-over 75.

Brooks Koepka (T46)

• Carded a 5-over 75 as he seeks to become the first player to win back-to-back U.S. Opens since Curtis Strange in 1988 (The Country Club in Brookline) and 1989 (Oak Hill).

Phil Mickelson (T87)

- 7-over 77 marked his highest opening-round score in 99 rounds at the U.S. Open (27 starts)
- A six-time runner-up at the U.S. Open, with four of those coming in New York (including in 2004 at Shinnecock Hills).

Jordan Spieth (T101)

• Posted an 8-over 78 for his highest score in 22 major championship starts (79 rounds).

Jason Day (T114)

9-over 79 equaled his highest score in 27 rounds at the U.S. Open (79/R1/2017).

Rory McIlroy (T128)

- 10-over 80 marked his highest score in 29 rounds at the U.S. Open (78/R1/2017).
- Four of seven missed cuts in major championships have come at the U.S. Open, including the last two seasons (2016, 2017).

Scott Gregory (156)

• Posted a 22-over 92 to become the first player to shoot in the 90s at the U.S. Open since Felix Casas shot 92 in 2002.
