#### 36-Hole Cut

64 professionals and 3 amateurs made the cut at 8-over 148.

#### Seven Things to Know

- Dustin Johnson's 4-stroke lead is the largest at the midway point of the U.S. Open since Martin Kaymer led by 6 in 2014
- Making his 20<sup>th</sup> U.S. Open start, Tiger Woods missed the cut in his first start at the U.S. Open since 2015
- Defending champion Brooks Koepka cards second-round 4-under 66 to move into contention
- 8-over 148 marks the highest cut on TOUR since the 2013 Open Championship (8-over 150) and 2013 U.S. Open (8-over 148)
- Notable missed cuts: Jason Day, Sergio Garcia, Rory McIlroy, Jon Rahm, Adam Scott, Jordan Spieth, Bubba Watson, Tiger Woods
- Three of the 20 amateurs in the field made the cut: Will Grimmer (+5), Matt Parziale (+7), Luis Gagne (+7)
- Four players celebrated birthdays Friday but unfortunately none made the cut: Lanto Griffin (73), Richie Ramsey (76), Ollie Schniederjans (76), Michael Block (78).

### Second-Round U.S. Open Lead Notes

- 41 Second-round leaders/co-leaders at the U.S. Open to win (most recent Brooks Koepka in 2017)
- 9/31 Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win on TOUR in 2017-18 (most recent Dustin Johnson at the FedEx St. Jude Classic)
- 6 Largest 36-hole lead at the U.S. Open (Tiger Woods/2000, Rory McIlroy/2011, Martin Kaymer/2014)
- 4 Largest 36-hole lead by a player who did not go on to win (Tom McNamara/1909)
- 11 Best come-from-behind win in the final 36 holes (Lou Graham/1975)

Wins (18); has at least one win in each of his first 11 PGA TOUR seasons (2008-active)

• Seeking to become the first player to win a PGA TOUR event (FedEx St. Jude Classic) and the U.S. Open the following week.

- Largest 36-hole leads at the U.S. Open (6/Tiger Woods/2000/won; 6/Rory McIlroy/2011/won; 6/Martin Kaymer/2014/won; 5/Willie Anderson/1903/won; 4/Tom McNamara/1909/2<sup>nd</sup>; 4/James Barnes/1921/won; 4/Dustin Johnson/2018/TBD).
- Has been 4-under 136 through 36 holes in three of the last four U.S. Opens (2015/T2, 2016/Won, 2018/TBD).
- Has now held the second-round lead/co-lead 16 times on TOUR, going on to win 8 times (most recent at FedEx St. Jude Classic).
- Has now led after the second round 3 times in major championships (2015 Open Championship/T49, 2016 U.S. Open/won).
- Seeking to notch the 18<sup>th</sup> win by a player holding at least a share of the lead after each round at the U.S. Open
- Hoping to become the 22<sup>nd</sup> multiple winner of the U.S. Open
- 4-stroke 36-hole lead is the second-largest of the season (5/Webb Simpson/THE PLAYERS)
- One of 6 multiple winners on TOUR this season.
- A win would mark the third consecutive season with 3 or more victories on TOUR (2/2017-18, 4/2016-17, 3/2015-16).

# Additional Player Notes

# Tiger Woods (+10/MC)

- Making his 20<sup>th</sup> start at the U.S. Open, posted rounds of 78-72 to finish 10-over 150.
- Failed to advance to the weekend for just the third time at the U.S. Open (WD/1995, MC/2006, MC/2015)

# Scott Piercy (T2)

- At even-par 140, makes the cut in a major championship for the first time since finishing T2 at the 2016 U.S. Open.
- T2 in 2016 represents his best finish in six previous starts at the U.S. Open.
- Teamed with Billy Horschel to win the 2018 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, his fourth PGA TOUR victory.
- First alternate out of the Memphis, Tennessee qualifier and added to the field on Monday.

# Charley Hoffman (T2)

- In search of back-to-back top-10 finishes at the U.S. Open, having finished eighth in 2017.
- Second-round 1-under 69 marked just his third sub-70 score in 24 U.S. Open rounds (R4/2011, R3/2017, R2/2018).
- Making his 28<sup>th</sup> major championship start, with four of his five career top-25 finishes in majors coming in his last five starts.
- Best finish in a major is 8<sup>th</sup> at the 2017 U.S. Open.

# Tommy Fleetwood (T4)

- Making third start at the U.S. Open (T27/2015, 4/2017).
- After missing the cut in six of his first seven major championship starts, has since reeled off five straight made cuts, led by his fourth-place finish at the 2017 U.S. Open.

### Henrik Stenson (T4)

- Making 12<sup>th</sup> start at the U.S. Open, led by top-10 finishes in 2014 (T4) and 2009 (9).
- Has five top-15 finishes in his last seven major championship starts, beginning with his win at the 2016 Open Championship and most recently a T5 finish at the 2018 Masters.

# Justin Rose (T4)

- Making his 13<sup>th</sup> start at the U.S. Open with a win in 2013 the best of his three top-10 finishes.
- Hoping to become the 22<sup>nd</sup> multiple winner of the U.S. Open.
- Seeking third win of the season (World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions, Fort Worth Invitational).

### Brooks Koepka (T4)

- Second-round 4-under 66 moves him within reach of becoming the first player to win back-to-back U.S. Opens since Curtis Strange in 1988 (The Country Club in Brookline) and 1989 (Oak Hill).
- Previous-best score at the U.S. Open was 67, posted in the first- and final-round en route to winning in 2017.

### Ian Poulter (T4)

- First-round co-leader was within one of Dustin Johnson's lead until a triple-bogey 7 on his 17<sup>th</sup> hole (No. 8).
- Making his 13<sup>th</sup> start at the U.S. Open with a T12 in 2006 his best finish.
- Hoping to become the seventh multiple winner of the season (Houston Open).
- Wins on the PGA TOUR (3): 2010 World Golf Championships-Dell Match Play, 2012 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2018 Houston Open

# Justin Thomas (T14)

- FedExCup leader enters weekend nine behind Dustin Johnson in his fourth U.S. Open start (MC/2014, 32/2016, 9/2017).
- Is in search of his ninth PGA TOUR victory (and third of the season).

## Patrick Reed (T26)

- Nine behind Dustin Johnson as he seeks to win the Masters and the U.S. Open in the same year.
- Six players (seven times) have performed the feat in the past, with Jordan Spieth (2015) the latest to do so.

### Phil Mickelson (T35)

- Posted a 1-under 69 in his 100<sup>th</sup> round at the U.S. Open (27 starts).
- Marks his 19<sup>th</sup> round in the 60s at the U.S. Open.
- Makes the cut for the 24<sup>th</sup> time in 27 starts at the U.S. Open.
- A six-time runner-up at the U.S. Open, with four of those coming in New York (including in 2004 at Shinnecock Hills).

### Steve Stricker (T58)

• Makes the cut for the 27<sup>th</sup> consecutive time in a major championship (last missed cut came at the 2009 PGA Championship).

# Jordan Spieth (+9/MC)

- One day after posting his highest score in 22 major championship starts (78), bounced back with a 1-over 71.
- Missed the cut in a major for the first time since the 2014 PGA Championship and just the fourth time in 22 starts.

# Rory McIlroy (+10/MC)

• Five of eight missed cuts in major championships (38 appearances) have come at the U.S. Open, including the last three years.
