Despite carding four bogeys in the final round (more than rounds 1-3 combined), Jason Day converted a two-shot lead to a two-shot victory. He is projected to move inside the top 10 in the Official World Golf Ranking.

Day earned 500 FedExCup points and moved to No. 2 in the standings, up 14 spots.

Third-Round Lead Notes

- Day becomes the sixth third-round leader/co-leader to win the Wells Fargo Championship (David Toms/2003, Jim Furyk/2006, Anthony Kim/2008, J.B. Holmes/2014, Rory McIlroy/2015 and Jason Day/2018).
- Day becomes the 13th third-round leader/co-leader to win on TOUR in 2017-18 (through 26 stroke-play events).
- Day has held 14 54-hole lead/co-leads on TOUR and has won seven of those.
- Day has converted six of his last seven 54-hole leads/co-leads on TOUR, including today. After holding a share of the 54-hole lead at the 2016 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, he finished T3.

The 2018 Wells Fargo Championship marks:

- 12th PGA TOUR title at the age of 30 years, 5 months, 24 days in his 220th career TOUR start.
- Second win of the PGA TOUR season (2018 Farmers Insurance Open); joins Justin Thomas, Patton Kizzire and Bubba Watson as the fourth multiple winner of the season.

Jason Day becomes the:

- Seventh major winner to win the Wells Fargo Championship
- Third international winner of the Wells Fargo Championship (Vijay Singh, Rory McIlroy)

This was Day's first start in the Wells Fargo Championship since 2012.

This is Day's third multiple-win season on the PGA TOUR and first since 2016. Last year was the first season Day failed to win on TOUR since 2014.

Day was one of seven former PLAYERS champions in the field, and the most recent: Jason Day (2016), Rickie Fowler (2015), Martin Kaymer (2014), Tiger Woods (2001, 2013), Phil Mickelson (2007), Adam Scott (2004) and Davis Love III (1992, 2003).

Day led the field in Strokes Gained: Around the Green and was 15 of 16 Sand Saves. He also ranked second for SG:Putting (8.245) and needed only 101 putts for the week, with just 22 in the final round.

Day birdied the first two holes of "The Green Mile" en route to victory. The par-3 17th played the hardest in the final round (3.573). Day was one of three birdies in the final round, almost holing out from 231 yards.

Additional Player Notes

Nick Watney finished T2 for his best showing on TOUR since the 2015 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am.

For the 11th time in his career as a professional, Tiger Woods failed to record a birdie in a round (3-over 74). It was the first time since the final round of the 2014 World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship (at Doral).

Phil Mickelson posted the most birdies of the day, 7 (tied with T.J. Vogel), to finish T5, his eighth top-five result at the Wells Fargo Championship, the most of any player. The Wells Fargo Championship remains one of eight PGA TOUR tournaments Mickelson has made 10 or more starts without a win.

Tiger Woods and Phil Mickelson will play together on the PGA TOUR for the first time since the first two rounds of the 2014 PGA Championship in one of next week's Featured Groupings for THE PLAYERS Championship. They will be joined by Rickie Fowler, who was 12 the last time Woods and Mickelson were paired together at THE PLAYERS (R3/2001) – the round that included the "better than most" putt.

World No. 2 Justin Thomas posted rounds of 73-69-70-70 to finish T21, not enough to claim the No. 1 spot from Dustin Johnson. He remains No. 1 in the FedExCup with a 389-point lead over Jason Day.

Masters champion Patrick Reed recorded weekend rounds of 67-69 for a solo-eighth finish, marking his sixth consecutive top-10 on the PGA TOUR:

Quail Hollow Club member Johnson Wagner recorded his third eagle of the week on No. 7. Wagner posted consecutive eagles on Nos. 14-15 in the first round, becoming the second player to post back-to-back eagles on TOUR this season (Webb Simpson/R4/Masters). A few hours later, John Peterson did the same on Nos. 7 and 8.

The only multiple winner of the Wells Fargo Championship, Rory McIlroy closed with an even-par 71 to finish T16 – his worst finish in seven made cuts (out of eight starts).
