Five Things To Know

- Beginning the third round tied for the lead with Ian Poulter and Tommy Fleetwood, Justin Thomas shoots a 3-under
 67 to take a three-stroke lead to the final round
- Thomas is in search of his first World Golf Championships title and third PGA TOUR victory of the season to join Dustin Johnson and Bubba Watson as the only three-time winners this season
- Three back of the lead, Rory McIlroy (67) was also three back going into the final round when he won at Firestone in 2014
- Rickie Fowler rebounds from a second-round 74 to shoot a 5-under 65 for the round of the day
- Following a 66-68 start, Tiger Woods cards a 3-over 73 in round three to drop to 3-under for the tournament

- 4 Largest final-round comeback at the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational (Keegan Bradley, 2012)
- Third-round leaders/co-leaders at the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational to win since 1999 (most recent: Tiger Woods/2013)
- Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win on PGA TOUR in 2017-18 (most recent: Dustin Johnson/RBC Canadian Open)

Wins (8): 2015 CIMB Classic, 2016 CIMB Classic, 2017 Sentry Tournament of Champions, 2017 Sony Open in Hawaii, 2017 PGA Championship, 2017 Dell Technologies Championship, 2017 THECJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES, 2018 The Honda Classic

- Defending FedExCup champion made six birdies to combat three bogeys for a third-round 67, highlighted by a chip-in from behind the par-3 12th green
- Has previously held at least a share of a 54-hole lead on the PGA TOUR seven times and converted the victory on five occasions. Would become the first player to convert the 54-hole lead/co-lead at the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational since 2013 (Woods)
- Making his third start in the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational (2017/T28, T33/2016)
- At 14-under 196, puts himself in position to claim his third PGA TOUR win of the season (THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES, The Honda Classic)
- With a win, would join Dustin Johnson and Bubba Watson as three-time winners this season on TOUR
- Is in search of his ninth career PGA TOUR victory and first World Golf Championships title after placing second at the WGC-Mexico Championship in March
- Thomas has not finished inside the top five in a stroke play event on TOUR since the WGC-Mexico Championship
- Comes off a missed cut in his most recent start at The Open Championship
- Will defend his PGA Championship title next week at Bellerive Country Club in St. Louis

Wins (14): 2010 Wells Fargo Championship, 2011 U.S. Open, 2012 The Honda Classic, PGA Championship, Dell Technologies Championship, BMW Championship, 2014 The Open Championship, WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, PGA Championship, 2015 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Wells Fargo Championship, 2016 Dell Technologies Championship, TOUR Championship, 2018 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard.

- 2014 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational champion carded a bogey-free 67 to move into a tie for second and three strokes back of Thomas
- 67 continued a streak of 11 consecutive rounds under par on the PGA TOUR and in the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational. His longest streak of consecutive rounds under par is 16 (2015 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard/R1 – 2015 Wells Fargo Championship/R4)
- Is making his eighth start in the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, having collected top-10 finishes in 2017 (T5), 2014 (1st), 2012 (T5), 2011 (T6) and 2010 (T9)
- 14-time PGA TOUR winner is in search of his second win of the season (Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)
- Began the final round of the 2014 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational three strokes behind leader Sergio Garcia before making birdie on four of the first five holes en route to a 66 and two-stroke win
- A win would make McIlroy just the second multiple winner of the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational (Woods)

Wins (3): 2010 WGC Dell Technologies Match Play, 2012 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2018 Houston Open

- Quick start with birdies on Nos. 2 and 3 to grab the lead, but made four bogeys coming in and finished even for his third round
- Heads into the final round ranked first in Strokes Gained: Putting (5.475)
- Has never finished inside the top 10 in the event. Best showings were a pair of T13s in 2001 and 2006
- Is making his first start in the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational since 2015 (T17)
- In 42 World Golf Championships starts, won the 2010 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play and 2012 WGC-HSBC Champions
- In addition to his win at the Houston Open, finished in the top 10 this season at the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play (T5) and RBC Heritage (T7)
- In search of his first-ever multiple-win season on the PGA TOUR

Additional Player Notes

Jason Day (-10/4th)

- Birdied Nos. 1 and 2 to begin his round for the second day in a row; bogeyed the 18th to fall into solo fourth
- Is making his ninth start at the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, having collected top-10 finishes in 2016 (T3) and 2011 (T4)
- With two prior World Golf Championships titles (2014, 2016 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play), would become the fifth player with three or more WGC titles with a win (Woods, Johnson, Mickelson, Ogilvy)
- Is in search of his 13th TOUR win and third of the season (Farmers Insurance Open, Wells Fargo Championship)
- With a win this week, would join Dustin Johnson and Bubba Watson as three-time winners this season

Rickie Fowler (-8/T7)

- Four-time PGA TOUR winner rebounded from a 74 in round two to shoot his second bogey-free round of the tournament with a 5-under 65
- 65 represented the low round of the day
- Five top-10s in nine career starts at Firestone
- Will begin the final round six strokes back of the lead. His largest come-from-behind victory on TOUR was three strokes at both the 2015 PLAYERS Championship and 2015 Dell Technologies Championship.

Tiger Woods (-3/T28)

- Eight-time winner of the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational carded a 3-over 73 to fall to 3-under for the tournament
- Lone birdie came at the par-3 12th (12′ 3″ putt)
- His 73 is his highest score at Firestone since a final-round 7-over 77 in 2010
