


2018 World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship Broadcast Window & Pre-Tournament Notes





ShotLink Keys to Victory for Dustin Johnson

Dustin Johnson picked up his fourth career World Golf Championships title and 14th PGA TOUR victory moving from sixth to third in the FedExCup standings. With his fourth victory in a World Golf Championships event, Dustin Johnson (5 total WGC wins) has the second most WGC victories behind Tiger Woods (18).

Dustin's +2.174 Strokes Gained: Approach-the-Green led the field for the week and was his second-best of his career in a four-round event on the PGA TOUR.

61% of Dustin's total strokes gained for the week came from his approach shot performance where he outperformed the field by +2.174 strokes per round on approach shots.

Dustin Johnson was incredible on approach shots at the WGC-Mexico Championship averaging over 9 feet closer than the field in proximity to the hole on approach shots. His 27' 3" average proximity was the closest by a winner on TOUR this season.

Dustin Johnson struggled from short distances at the WGC-Mexico Championship, tying the mark for most putts missed from inside 10 feet by a winner on TOUR. Dustin missed 16 putts from inside 10 feet going 61 of 77. However, Dustin made a total of 11 putts from outside of 10 feet ranking T2 in the field for most putts made from over this distance.

Last season, Rory McIlroy led the field in driver distance off the tee at Club de Golf Chapultepec, averaging 350.34 yards off the tee. Justin Thomas led all players off the when using a fairway wood, averaging 333.52 yards from the tee. Dustin Johnson averaged 285.13 yards off the tee using an iron, the longest average distance of any player in the 2017 WGC-Mexico Championship.

77 Total Hole Outs: The 2017 WGC-Mexico Championship held at the Club de Golf Chapultepec had the eighth most total hole outs of any course on the PGA TOUR. Club de Chapultepec's 77-hole outs were the most recorded on a course that hosted a World Golf Championship stroke play event since 2003.

Last season, the players at Club de Golf Chapultepec hit 75.93% (1,366 of 1,799) of the greens in regulation from inside 125 yards, ranking as the third toughest GIR percentage from this distance. Nine of the 11 have finished inside of the top-10 and the only player who has won this event and go on to win the FedExCup was Tiger Woods in 2007.




Since the start of the 2013-14 PGA TOUR Season (when HSBC-Champions started receiving FEC points), Dustin Johnson has accumulated 3,524.

Dustin Johnson has recorded 3,524 FedExCup points, marking the most of any player since the start of the 2013-14 PGA TOUR season. In this timeframe, Dustin has five wins and nine top-5 finishes in World Golf Championship events.

Since 2009, there have been only four players who have accumulated over 1,000 FedExCup points at the WGC-Mexico Championship. Dustin Johnson has the most of any player at this event 1,747 since 2009.



Nine players have a chance to overtake the #1 position in the FedExCup standings at this week's WGC-Mexico Championship, Current FedExCup leader, Justin Thomas was the fourth different player this season who has been ranked #1 through the first 15 weeks of the season. Since the 2015-16 PGA TOUR season where there were 11 different players who held the #1 position in the FEC standings, only five held the #1 position last season.

Dustin Johnson

Two-time winner of the WGC-Mexico Championship, Dustin Johnson currently ranks third in the FedExCup standings on the strength of one win and three top-10 finishes this season. Dustin recorded his 11th consecutive season with at least one win at the 2018 Sentry TOC. Johnson ranks fourth for most consecutive seasons with a win to start a PGA TOUR career since WWII.

Justin Thomas won his eighth career PGA TOUR event in his 101st career start on TOUR at last week's Honda Classic. Thomas won his seventh PGA TOUR title in his last 31 starts on TOUR. Thomas regained the top spot in the FedExCup for the 10th week of his career, moving from ninth to first in the FEC standings.

homas moved to #1 in the FedExCup standings in week #15 of he season, marking the third fastest reigning FedExCup champion o regain the top spot in the standings since the start of the edExCup (2007).

Since the start of the 2016 CIMB Classic, Justin Thomas has recorded seven PGA TOUR victories. In his last 31 starts he has the highest winning percentage of any player, 22.6%. Since the start of the FedExCup (2007), Thomas is the 13th player who has led the FedExCup in 10 or more weeks in their career.

Jon Rahm

Jon Rahm is set to make his second appearance at the WGC-Mexico Championship, finishing T3 at this event last season. Rahm averaged the fourth longest Driving Distance when using a Driver, 335.65 yards in the 2017 WGC-Mexico Championship.

Last season, Jon Rahm ranked inside the top-five in several off the tee statistics. Rahm averaged 331.8 yards off the tee on the two measured driving holes, 34.4 yards longer than the field average (297.4).

Tommy Fleetwood

Tommy Fleetwood is set to make his third WGC-Mexico Championship appearance finishing second to Dustin Johnson in 2017. Fleetwood ranks inside the top-five in several statistics, leading the TOUR making 55.56% (10 of 18) of putts from 10 to 15 feet and outperforming the TOUR by +2.212 strokes per round from tee-to-green.



Phil Mickelson outperformed the field by +1.756 strokes per round on the greens at Club de Golf Chapultepec, marking his best event Strokes Gained: Putting performance on TOUR last season.
