

## 2018 Wyndham Championship Broadcast Window & Pre-Tournament Notes



### ShotLink Keys to Victory for Henrik Stenson

Henrik Stenson moved from 75<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> in the FedExCup standings with his victory at the Wyndham Championship marking his 6<sup>th</sup> career victory in his 170<sup>th</sup> TOUR start.

51% of Stenson's total strokes gained for the week came from his performance on the greens outperforming the Wyndham field by +2.207 strokes per round.

Henrik Stenson had all facets of his game working en route to winning the 2017 Wyndham Championship. Stenson averaged 25' 3" in Proximity to the hole ranking 1<sup>st</sup> in the field and marked the 2<sup>nd</sup> closest proximity to the hole by a winner last season (Grayson Murray Barbasol Championship 23' 9").

His proximity of 25' 3" was nearly 7 feet closer than the field average of 32' 1". Stenson averaged 108' 7" of putts made per round marking the 7<sup>th</sup> winner last season to average over a hundred feet of putts and go onto victory.

## **FedExCup Notes**

**Week #40 of the FedExCup Season:** The Wyndham Championship is the last week of the season where players are jockeying to position themselves for the FedExCup Playoffs. The top 125 players in the FedExCup standings after the Wyndham Championship will advance to the FedExCup Playoffs. From that point, it's all about reaching the top 30 in the standings (TOUR Championship) and then most importantly the top 5. At the TOUR Championship, the top 5 players can win the FedExCup with a victory in Atlanta. All 30 players at the TOUR Championship have a mathematical chance to win the Cup.

**The Field:** 2 players inside the top 30 of the standings are in the field attempting to improve their position entering the Playoffs. 2011 Wyndham Championship winner, Webb Simpson (12<sup>th</sup>) finished second in the FedExCup standings in 2011 and is seeking his sixth TOUR Championship appearance & Chesson Hadley (26<sup>th</sup>) is seeking his first TOUR Championship appearance.

In 2016, 11 players inside the top-30 of the standings were in the field, marking the most players 30<sup>th</sup> or better in the standings in the field at the Wyndham Championship.

Every player from the 122<sup>nd</sup> position through the 132<sup>nd</sup> are in the field including **Harris English** who is one of 82 players outside of the top-125 and is looking to avoid missing the playoffs for the first time in his PGA TOUR career.

**Making the FedExCup Playoffs Every Season:** 13 players have qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in each of the first 11 seasons of the FedExCup. Entering this week, **10** of those players are currently ranked inside the **top 125** and **three** are currently inside the **top 30** of the standings.

There are three players currently outside the top 125 who have qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs every season. Two of the three players are in the field and Luke Donald is the only one who will miss the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time in their careers.

Four of the 13 players to qualify for the Playoffs every year are in the field this week (R. Moore, B. Snedeker, S. Garcia & B. Haas).

In the last 7 years of the FedExCup the lowest ranked player to advance to THE NORTHERN TRUST from the Wyndham Championship was 2015 champion Davis Love III. Love III entered the 2015 Wyndham Championship 186<sup>th</sup> in the FEC standings and moved to 76<sup>th</sup> thanks to his victory.

The furthest (highest ranked in final standings) any player has gone starting the Wyndham Championship outside the cut line since 2009 (new point structure) is **Ernie Els** in 2011. Els started the Wyndham Championship ranked 126<sup>th</sup> in the standings and went onto finish 67<sup>th</sup>.

Seven of the last eight players ranked 125<sup>th</sup> in the standings entering the Wyndham Championship have remained inside the cut line entering the FedExCup Playoffs. Whee Kim was the only player failing to make the cut and missed the playoffs by 10 points. This season Whee Kim is in a comfortable position and will make the FEC Playoffs for the second time at 54<sup>th</sup> in the standings.

**Likely Moves & Finishes Needed This Week:**

The following projections are based on the previous 8 years results in tournaments with this year's points system. Based on these calculations 370 points has a chance to qualify and 400 points will likely be enough to qualify for the Playoffs next

week. Players ranked 123<sup>rd</sup> or better entering this week's Wyndham Championship are likely to advance to THE NORTHERN TRUST next week.

With the top 123-players likely to advance into the FedExCup Playoffs, here's a look at where 124 through 130 in the standings likely need to finish this week to earn a berth into the FedExCup Playoffs this season.

At the 2017 Wyndham Championship, **Martin Flores** made an ace on the 16<sup>th</sup> hole in the final round which moved him from outside of the top-125 to inside of the top-125 number and ended up finishing 118<sup>th</sup> entering the 2017 FedExCup Playoffs.

**J.J. Henry** birdied two of his last three holes at this event last season moving from 130<sup>th</sup> to 125<sup>th</sup> in the FedExCup standings. Henry birdied the 16<sup>th</sup>, pared the 17<sup>th</sup> and birdied 18 to finish in the 125<sup>th</sup> position headed into the 2017 FedExCup playoffs. J.J. Henry is the only player who has played himself into the FedExCup Playoffs multiple times when sitting outside of the number heading into the Wyndham Championship (2017 & 2008).

In the 11-year history of the FedExCup, no player has made the TOUR Championship starting the Wyndham Championship outside the Playoffs cut line.

**Last Season:** Four players played their way into the playoffs at the Wyndham Championship including **J.J. Henry** who accomplished this feat for the second time in his career (2008).

**2016:** 2 players advanced from outside the top 125 at the Wyndham Championship (K. Stanley & S. Stefani).

**2015:** 5 players advanced from outside the top 125 at the Wyndham Championship tying the record at this event under the current points structure.

**Biggest Move in Wyndham History:** With his win at the '15 Wyndham Davis Love III moved from 186<sup>th</sup> to 76<sup>th</sup> in the FedExCup standings (110 spots) marking the largest move up the standings in tournament history. Love III is the first player to move more than 100 spots in the standings at the Wyndham Championship.

The furthest any player has gone starting the Wyndham Championship outside the cut line since 2009 is **Ernie Els** in 2011. Els started the Wyndham Championship ranked 126<sup>th</sup> in the standings and went onto finish 67<sup>th</sup> in the standings in 2011.

Entering the 2009 NORTHERN TRUST, **Heath Slocum** ranked 124<sup>th</sup> in the standings. His victory vaulted him 121 spots to 3<sup>rd</sup> in the standings and secured a spot at the TOUR Championship (largest move in the 10-year history of the Playoffs).

### Jhonattan Vegas – 122<sup>nd</sup> in FedExCup

Jhonattan Vegas currently ranks 122<sup>nd</sup> in the FedExCup standings and is seeking to make the FedExCup playoffs for the fifth time in his PGA TOUR career.

Jhonattan has found himself in a similar position when playing the Wyndham Championship. His 122<sup>nd</sup> position in the FedExCup standings marks the third time he has been on the bubble (121<sup>st</sup> to 130<sup>th</sup>) entering this event.
