## ROUND 2 INTERVIEW June 23, 2018

### **JERRY KELLY (-7)**



# Q. I thought you were going to maybe run the table there. How close did you get on 18 or what kind of chance did you have there?

**JERRY KELLY:** Well, I mean, it was a tough chip with a lot of grass between the ball and the club. I hit just a fantastic chip. I was happy to get it about three feet because that three-footer wasn't fun from up there, you know, left to right, downhill.

Yeah, mud was the story of the day pretty much. I mean, sending balls all over the place. It's almost a penalty to hit it in the fairway today. You know, everybody's playing it, but it's kind of luck of the draw what you get. Unfortunately, I hit a high spinning ball, that's why I hit a lot of fairways and that's why I pick up a lot of mud. Swing still wasn't quite on, but I closed well again, which helps.

### Q. And at the top nobody's gone wild.

**JERRY KELLY:** No. I mean, that's shocking to me. But really, I mean, if you get a decent amount of mud, this mud isn't going anywhere, it's staying on your ball and it's moving your ball 30, 40 yards sometimes. I can see it, it makes us look pretty stupid sometimes. But, you know, everybody's going through it obviously.

I don't know, I was very surprised that I was still hanging in. You don't see a scoreboard until you get to, what, 8 maybe, something like that? Maybe the 9th hole was the scoreboard. So it really surprised me.

But then I got a little too jacked up for the back side and, you know, didn't hit it well there. Yeah, just made some good par saves today, that was the story.

### Q. What did you do at 16 and 17 to make birdies?

**JERRY KELLY:** 16, I hit a really good drive down there, solid. I just had 210 to the hole, kind of topped my 3-iron really low and skidded through the green and hit a little chip that bounced a little bit too much and went about 10 feet and made that one.

It wasn't pretty until the 17th where I hit a 6-iron to about two and a half feet and knocked that one in. So that was definitely the best hole of the day and I did something different, so I'm looking forward to going and trying that something different right now.

#### Q. This is pretty much standard for this tour, you talked about many times out there,

three-round tournaments, it's a horse race until you get maybe to the back nine on Sunday?

**JERRY KELLY:** Yeah, no, it's a horse race from the start. This one, the conditions haven't been that easy. The pins are in some spots where you can't spin it and you have to hit them firm out of these kind of soft fairways, otherwise you could chunk it.

I mean, it's not that easy even though the course is gettable. There's just a few things going on out there to keep the scoring from going too low like it normally does.

Q. Couples got within a shot today and after a long layoff. I know last year at the Schwab Cup after a long layoff you played with him in the final round and got to watch him shoot probably the most effortless 62 in the history of the game. What is it about that guy in your mind that makes him able to kind of flip the switch and play that well at a moment's notice?

**JERRY KELLY:** Because it doesn't matter how deep he's going or if he's going to win, if he's got that effortless going, it just gets even more effortless as it goes. I mean, it's so much fun to watch. I can't do it. I would like to.

Q. It was the grinder against the guy that was just kind of walking through the park.

**JERRY KELLY:** Oh, it was so funny. I had him coming, we were right neck and neck coming down the last and I messed up that 17th hole. Thanks for reminding me of that, appreciate that.

Q. Jerry, do you go home and dream about (inaudible)? There's going to be a lot of guys that are near the top and you're one of them.

**JERRY KELLY:** Go home, drink a bottle of wine and have fun. That's it. I'm going to put some steaks on the grill and enjoy the company at home and I'm going to come out here and just be ready to play. It's all I can do. You don't know what you're going to get. I mean, you really don't. I'll give it my all like I always do.

Q. But you're in position again. I think that's been your calling card of this tour is that you're always there.

**JERRY KELLY:** Yeah. I mean, it's been really nice to be back in that mix because that's kind of the way I was on the PGA Tour for about 10, 12 years. It was close to winning consistently and a lot of top-10s. I'd like to win more out here, no question, but you just keep putting yourself in position and you'll get through a whole lot more of them hopefully.
