MARK CALCAVECCHIA (-17)

MARK CALCAVECCHIA: I just didn't think it would happen again. These guys are so good out here. The level of play is just insane, including Mr. Langer obviously. It's so hard, I can't tell you. I think I made enough putts, and sometimes the good Lord pencils you in and this week was meant to be.

Q. Let's go back to 16 where you hit your tee shot. Tell me what was going through your mind on that bogey putt.

MARK CALCAVECCHIA: First of all, on the tee shot, chunking it never crossed my mind. I think sometimes when I get a little nervous, and I felt pretty good over it, I tend to leave it out to the right. So I said stay in the shot and go ahead and hit it, and I shocked it. Then when I got over there to the drop area, the angle was weird and I was trying to get what the yardage was basically. I had a good read on the putt, I knew it went left and I saw Bernhard's go left, of course. I played it a cup outside right and I hit it, and I knew I hit it where I wanted to, and then when it was about halfway to the hole I knew it was on a great line and it just went right in the middle and it was huge.

(Inaudible) I had that one figured out and I left it short. I struggled with my speed all day. Again, I didn't expect Bernhard to miss that putt on 17. When I saw (inaudible) every once in a while, very rarely he gets a little quick with the backstroke and he did it that time. I saw the backstroke and I went oh, he hit a bad putt.

Q. You said a while ago that you didn't think you would ever get back in the winner's circle. With this win now (inaudible)?

MARK CALCAVECCHIA: It does, it sets up the whole year for me, it really does.
