Scott Parel, 67-66 – 133 (-11)

- A birdie on the 18th hole was Parel's seventh of the day and closed out a second-round 66. His 36-hole total of • 133 matches his best start on PGA TOUR Champions. Most recently, he opened with rounds of 67-66 and finished T2 at the Principal Charity Classic in June.
- Through two rounds, Parel is 7-under on the eight par 5s. Entering this week, he ranked T18 on Tour in Birdie or • Better on Par 5s (44.44%).
- This is just the second time Parel has led/co-led after any round on PGA TOUR Champions. He was a first-round • co-leader at the 2017 Chubb Classic before eventually finishing T10.
- Parel's last official professional victory came at the 2013 Air Capital Classic on the Web.com Tour. In January, ٠ he won the Diamond Resorts Invitational, an unofficial event that used modified stableford scoring.
- This season, Parel has two runner-up finishes and four top-10s, and he is No. 13 in the Charles Schwab Cup.

Second-Round Lead Notes

- Second-round leaders/co-leaders have claimed 10 of the last 28 Constellation SENIOR PLAYERS • Championships. Most recently, Langer led wire-to-wire and won in 2015.
- In this year's three majors, one player has turned a 36-hole lead/co-lead into a victory. At the midway point of the • Regions Tradition, Miguel Angel Jimenez was one of two co-leaders and he went on to win by three.

Jeff Maggert, 66-68 - 134 (-10)

- After a three-putt bogey on the 18th hole Friday, Maggert settled for a second-round 68 and is T2 at 10-under. His even-par back nine also included a birdie on the par-5 15th, where he <u>holed out from the greenside bunker</u>.
- Through two rounds, Maggert leads the field in Greens in Regulation (33 of 36). Entering this week, he was 29th on Tour in GIR (70.14%).
- At the season's first three majors, he tied for fifth at the Regions Tradition, missed the cut at the KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship, and tied for 49th at the U.S. Senior Open.
- This is his fourth start at the Constellation SENIOR PLAYERS Championship, and his best finish was T12 in 2015 at Belmont Country Club.
- He has five career victories on PGA TOUR Champions, including four wins and two majors in 2015.
- This season, he has four top-10s, including a T2 at the Insperity Invitational, and is No. 22 in the Schwab Cup.

Brandt Jobe, 67-67 – 134 (-10)

- Despite hitting just 17 of 28 fairways (T65 in the field), Jobe is T2 after consecutive rounds of 67. It's the first time he's opened with two rounds in the 60s this season.
- Making his third start at the Constellation SENIOR PLAYERS Championship, Jobe has been in the top-10 after all 10 rounds he's played at this tournament.

- In his two other major starts this season, he finished T16 at the Regions Tradition and T5 at the U.S. Senior Open. He attended his daughter's high school graduation in lieu of playing the KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship.
- Jobe has three top-10s this season and he is currently 23rd in the Charles Schwab Cup.

Other Notes

- The tournament's three most recent champions are tied for fourth at 9-under. <u>Scott McCarron</u> (2017) carded a 68 on Friday, <u>Bernhard Langer</u> (2014, 2015, 2016) shot 67 and Kenny Perry (2013) shot 70.
- Langer has been in the top-11 after each of the last 20 rounds at the Constellation SENIOR PLAYERS Championship, a streak that started with the third round in 2013.
- Peter Lonard carded the day's best round, an 8-under 64, and he improved 46 spots and is T15 at 7-under.
- Kevin Sutherland, the reigning Charles Schwab Cup champion, shot 65 on Friday and improved 22 spots on the leaderboard. He is T11 at 8-under entering the weekend.
- **Tom Byrum** is T4 after finishing with a second-round 68. After a double bogey on No. 2, he rebounded with six birdies on the round, bringing him to 9-under.
- **Bart Bryant** is tied for fourth and finished the day with a second-round score of 69. Bryant nearly played a bogey-free round, but finished the par-4 18th with a 5.
- **Glen Day** posted a 3-under 69 and is 9-under for the tournament, tied with six other players for fourth place. He finished Friday's round with three bogeys and six birdies.
- Vijay Singh and Doug Garwood are the only two players bogey-free through 36 holes. Singh is T4 at 9-under (68-67 135), and Garwood is T24 at 4-under (71-69 140).
- Mike Small, the men's golf coach at the University of Illinois, was the first-round co-leader and birdied his first two holes Friday. He played the remaining 16 holes in 1-over en route to a 1-under 71, and he is T11 at 8-under. In his two previous starts in senior majors, he was T41 (2016 U.S. Senior Open) and T29 (2017 U.S. Senior Open) through 36 holes.
- **Miguel Angel Jimenez**, winner of the Regions Tradition, is T24 at 4-under. He is the only player with top-five finishes in each of the first three majors this year.
- **Paul Broadhurst**, winner of the KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship, shot a second-round 72 and is T49 at 1-under.
- David Toms, winner of the U.S. Senior Open, shot a second-round 69 and is T49 at 1-under.
