ROUND 2 INTERVIEW November 9, 2018

PAUL GOYDOS (-14)



Q. You're at the top of the leaderboard again. What does that do for your confidence going into the weekend.

PAUL GOYDOS: Well, I played good. Hopefully, you know, confidence tends to breed confidence. My game tends to -- I think I'm a bit of a momentum player. I played well at PowerShares a couple weeks ago and I played well the first two rounds here, but you still need to -- I mean, we're 14 -- I probably have a one-shot lead. The weather's supposed to be good, the scores are going to be good this weekend. Should be exciting.

Q. What were some of the highlights from your round today?

PAUL GOYDOS: I was happy. I was very, in a sense, for lack of a better word, simple. I hit a lot of fairways, hit a lot of greens and I made six putts for birdie. A couple of them short and a couple of nice mid-range ones. I think what I take out of it is I didn't put a lot of pressure on myself. I never got -- I don't think I had too many long par putts, if any at all, and it was just a nice, easy day.

Q. Attack this weekend, is that kind of the --

PAUL GOYDOS: I don't attack, I really don't do that. I just -- I don't know that I'm -- I don't know if I'm an aggressive player or conserve -- I don't know. I just play. I try to pick the best shot to hit in that situation regardless kind of where I stand. I don't think I would change too much unless -- that's a situational thing that might happen on the back nine on Sunday, but tomorrow, just keep trying to play, keep trying to make birdies. There are situations on this golf course, too, where par's pretty good. There's some holes that if you're not careful you can take a big number on. I've just got to pick my spots.

Q. What's it going to take to win over the weekend?

PAUL GOYDOS: I'm going to need to tighten it up a little bit. I think I've relied a little too much on my putting the first two days and that's a tough thing to rely on. I would much rather be relying on my ball-striking. So I need to probably hit it a little bit better if I'm going to want to -- I played with Tim today. Tim really didn't have a great day putting. He shot 4 under, he could have shot 7 or 8 under today, and obviously McCarron played very well and he's playing very well and he obviously has a lot to play for. He's got a chance to win the Charles Schwab Cup and he's going to be ready to go. It's going to be a pretty exciting weekend.
