

Q. Great finish today. Walk us through those last few holes.

MIGUEL ANGEL JIMÉNEZ: Yeah, playing solid the last -- the back nine. Par for hole No. 8, missed my driver there. Missed yesterday, too. On the 18th tee, I manage to make a birdie short there, follow in there, and then three birdies in a row on 17, 16 and 15. I made birdies there. Played solid, good, first nine is a little bit -- not getting there, not getting some putts, not getting good enough, you say, I don't know.

Q. Is it tough to stay patient after a front nine like that?

MIGUEL ANGEL JIMÉNEZ: That's the key thing, you need to let things come to you. Sometimes you trying to push too hard probably it be won't happen, and when you push it, you see people making birdies, you only want to make birdies, and then sometimes we need to think and let things come to you. And the back nine played much nice, and obviously started making birdies there, no? Hit several shots there, and you have to make your shots, you know?

Q. This is the second year in a row you're going to play in Sunday's final group. Last year you were the leader, now you are a couple shots back. Does it matter to you?

MIGUEL ANGEL JIMÉNEZ: 18 holes to play. Tomorrow is going to be a fight, it's going to be nice. As long as you are around the lead, one shot behind, one shot ahead, you know? A lot of golf to come. Just play golf, let everything come;

Q. All that matters is you're in the last group, and you're near the lead?

MIGUEL ANGEL JIMÉNEZ: No, no, I don't mind, I don't mind. Last group, second group or third group. That means you are closer, better. That's good.
