

Q. Joe, the ebbs and flows of tournament golf. Can you believe this day? You're standing in the 13th fairway, hit a quality golf shot. Did you think something might turn at that point in time?

JOE DURANT: I felt like if I could make the three there, I had a shot. I was just so nervous today, and it showed on the first few holes. I missed some short putts. My goal was to just hang in there. If you can stay around it, you never know what's going to happen the last three or four holes, and that's all I really tried to do.

Q. You made your worst swing of the week there on 16. I know you were in between clubs, it looked like. Momentum kind of switched again, but that second shot at 17, you must be proud of that.

JOE DURANT: Yeah, I very was fortunate I put a new 3-wood in my bag this week. It doesn't have any left in it typically, so I knew the water was probably out of play. Right wasn't very good, but hit a good shot there, and I couldn't be more happy with my second shot on 18. That's one of the best iron shots I've hit in a long time.

Q. Visually intimidating for sure. You've won your third PGA TOUR Champions win. It's early in the season. Does this change your goals for the rest of the year?

JOE DURANT: Well, my number one goal was to get back to Hualala. I think we all love going there so much. Now I get to go back there. Just keep trying to play quality golf and see what happens.
