Miguel Angel Jimenez, 32-32 – 64

- This is the second year in a row Jimenez has been a first-round leader/co-leader at the Chubb Classic. In 2017, he opened with a 65 and was part of a three-way tie. He shot a second-round 67 and led by one going into the final round, but he settled for a runner-up finish after a final-round 71.
- This is the fifth time he has been a first-round leader/co-leader, and the first since the 2017 Regions Tradition. The only time he has converted a first-round lead into a victory was at the 2014 Mitsubishi Electric Classic, where he led wire-to-wire in his PGA TOUR Champions debut.
- The 8-under 64 is his lowest first round in relation to par, and ties for his career-best first-round score. He opened with a 6-under 64 en route to a runner-up finish at the 2017 Shaw Charity Classic.
- Jimenez has one win in each of his four seasons on PGA TOUR Champions. In 2017, he won the Rapiscan Systems Classic and finished the year with 10 top-10s en route to a sixth-place finish in the Charles Schwab Cup.

Gary Hallberg, 33-32 – 65

- Making his season debut and playing as a sponsor's exemption, Hallberg rebounded from a bogey on No. 1 with nine birdies, including his last three holes.
- He is making his eighth start at the Chubb Classic, and his 7-under 65 is his best score in 21 rounds. In fact, it was only his fourth score under-par in 16 rounds at The TwinEagles Club.
- He posted three straight top-25 finishes in the middle of his 2017 season, with his best being a T13 at the DICK'S Sporting Goods Open.

David Frost, 35-30 – 65

- Starting on No. 10, Frost carded four birdies and an eagle and made the turn at 6-under 30. He closed with a 1-under 35 on his second nine en route to a 7-under 65, his best score in 25 rounds at the Chubb Classic.
- Frost has three top-10s in eight previous starts at the Chubb Classic, with his best being a T5 in 2013.
- In 2017, Frost tallied five top-10s, including a T4 finish at the season-ending Charles Schwab Cup Championship, which helped him move to No. 15 in the final standings.

Other Notes

- Three of the top-six players from last year's Charles Schwab Cup are in the top five after the first round. Joining Jimenez in the top five are **Kevin Sutherland**, the 2017 Charles Schwab Cup champion, and **Scott McCarron**, who finished third. Both Sutherland and McCarron are T4 at 6-under.
- Lee Janzen is part of the five-way tie for fourth at 6-under, and he leads the trio of past champions in the field. Janzen is followed by three-time champion Bernhard Langer (T21, -3) and 2014 winner Kirk Triplett (T37, 1-under).
- Langer's round of 3-under 69 was his 34th straight round of par or better. The PGA TOUR Champions record is 38, set by Jay Haas (2014) and Colin Montgomerie (2016-17).
- Glen Day and Jesper Parnevik round out the quintet tied for fourth at 6-under.
- **David Toms** is T12 after a first-round 68, his 11th consecutive round in the 60s (four last year, seven this year). Last week's fourth-place finish at the Boca Raton Championship was his fourth straight top-five dating back to last year. He finished 11th in the 2017 Charles Schwab Cup, and he is currently No. 3 in the standings.
- **Steve Stricker** opened with a 4-under 68, his 17th straight under-par round on PGA TOUR Champions. In 2017, all 16 of his rounds were under par, and his scoring average was 67.75.
- In his first round as the Charles Schwab Cup leader, **Jerry Kelly** shot 4-under 68 and is T12. The reigning Rookie of the Year won the season-opening Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai, his third win on PGA TOUR Champions.
