

SCOTT DUNLAP (-10)

Q. Good to see you. So further proof today that par is a good score on number 18?

SCOTT DUNLAP: Always has been, always will be, yeah, no doubt. I hit a good tee ball, easy form, got out of dodge. My day was pretty inconsistent, but I didn't shoot myself in the foot so we hung in there and my partners didn't go crazy although they did a little better than I did. So live to fight another day tomorrow.

Q. You said yesterday that your familiarity with this course wasn't necessarily an asset for you because you hadn't played great here, but you played pretty well for two days?

SCOTT DUNLAP: I had good rounds, it's just never been put together. I'm sure I've had a good score on each hole, but the trick is shooting good scores. You don't play these places enough to think of a trend. If you've only been someplace five times, where is there a law you have to win one or finish in the top five. I always liked the golf course, looked forward to coming here. So far, so good.

Q. Sure. What do you think about the position you're in headed into tomorrow?

SCOTT DUNLAP: Like I said, given the day I had, which was pretty uneven and not great, but at least I hung in there. Just goes to show you at least you're not dropping shots while you're kind of stuck in (Inaudible) you can hang in there. I made a couple birdies on the back nine. I mean, I missed two real makeable putts on the front nine. If not for that I'd be leading, but I'm one back.

Q. Given how things went before you ended up with a par on 17, the drive was kind of long and you put yourself in a position, then you hit over the green. Were you okay with the par on that?

SCOTT DUNLAP: Big time, yeah. It was such a momentum killer to make six there, but, you know, once again you hope to make a four there, but it's so downwind you've got to go way left and bring the whole lake into play. I just didn't have enough guts to do that. I was struggling, didn't have to blade it over the green but all the sudden it becomes a proper par 5 if you're not going to stand up there and go left when it's downwind, which I didn't.

Q. Tommy did.

SCOTT DUNLAP: Yeah, that was great.

Q. That was a Tin Cup kind of shot, wasn't it?

SCOTT DUNLAP: Even though I was going 3-wood I knew I could go over the whole lake. Took it over maybe half of it, then pushed it over only a quarter of it. Not a good shot.

Q. Supposed to be a little bit cooler tomorrow, maybe 10 degrees. Is it going to affect things out there do you think?

SCOTT DUNLAP: Well, one would imagine with some cooler weather maybe the winds will be blowing from a different direction so we might have a different golf course that way. It did shift already. I mean, we've gone from kind of a southerly wind to westerly wind it seemed like during the round so maybe, but I don't know.
