Scott Parel, 61 points (34-27)

- Parel earned 27 points by making five birdies, one bogey and 12 pars. Through 36 holes, he has made 22 points on the front nine (three birdies, 13 pars) and 39 points on the back nine (11 birdies, six pars).
- While the Diamond Resorts Invitational is not an official PGA TOUR Champions tournament, a win on Sunday would be Parel's first professional victory since winning the 2013 Air Capital Classic in Wichita, Kansas, on the Web.com Tour at age 48. In 2016, he was co-medalist at PGA TOUR Champions Q-School and earned full status for 2017.
- Last year, he tallied six top-10s and finished 21st in the final Charles Schwab Cup standings to remain fully exempt for 2018. His best finish last year was a tie for second at the Regions Tradition.
- In 2017, Parel ranked third on Tour in total birdies made (330) and birdies per round (4.52).

Notes – Professional Field

- Defending champion **Woody Austin** is sixth with 57 points. He made five birdies, one eagle and 12 pars to score 33 points Saturday, the most points by a player in the second round.
- Next week, six players in the field will travel from Orlando to Hawaii for the season-opening Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai: Austin, **Mark Calcavecchia** (T15, 45 points), **Joe Durant** (T2, 60 points), **Jeff Maggert** (10th, 53 points), **Jeff Sluman** (T7, 55 points) and **Duffy Waldorf** (11th, 51 points).
- At this event last year, Durant totaled 96 points and finished second, eight points behind Austin's winning score of 104. He has scored at least 28 points in all five of his rounds at the Diamond Resorts Invitational.
- Golf Channel commentator **Charlie Rymer** tallied 11 points Saturday and is T29 with 32 points. He turned 50 on December 18, 2017, and he plans on making his PGA TOUR Champions debut at the Boca Raton Championship.
- **Brooke Henderson** carded six birdies, one double-bogey and 11 pars en route to a 28-27 – 55 total and a T7 position through 18 holes. **Brittany Lincicome** (14-23 – 37), **Gerina Piller** (13-19 – 32) and **Brittany Lang** (12-20 – 32) are the other three LPGA players in the field.

Notes – Celebrity Field

- **Mardy Fish**, the 2016 champion of this event, has 51 points and leads by six over **Mark Mulder**. Fish scored 25 points in the second round after making four birdies, one bogey and 13 pars, and he scored the most points among celebrities for the second day in a row.
- Last year, Fish was third (46 points) through 36 holes and finished T2 with 67 total points. Fish is a six-time winner on the ATP Tour and was the silver medalist in men's singles at the 2004 Summer Olympics.
- Mulder, the defending champion, tallied 24 points on Saturday (four birdies, 12 pars) and has 45 total. Last year, he was second and trailed by three points entering the final round. He went on to score 30 on Sunday and won by 10 with 77 points. He is the three-time defending champion of the American Century Celebrity Golf Championship.
- PGA TOUR Champions Ambassador **Alfonso Ribeiro** has 24 points (12-12 – 24) and is T18 out of 52 celebrities.
