Scott Parel, 93 points (34-27-32)

- Parel made eight birdies Sunday, and his two-putt birdie on No. 17 gave him 93 points. Needing to par on the par-3 18th to win by one point over Scott Dunlap, Parel missed the green and failed to get up-and-down, sending the tournament into a playoff. Parel missed the green in the playoff, but an up-and-down par sealed the victory after Dunlap hit his tee shot into the water.
- It is Parel's first professional victory since winning the 2013 Air Capital Classic in Wichita, Kansas, on the Web.com Tour at age 48. In 2016, he was co-medalist at PGA TOUR Champions Q-School and earned full status for 2017.
- Last year, he tallied six top-10s and finished 21st in the final Charles Schwab Cup standings to remain fully exempt for 2018. His best finish last year was a tie for second at the Regions Tradition.
- On the week, he scored 37 points on the front nine (six birdies, 19 pars) and 56 points on the back nine (16 birdies, eight pars).
- Parel's next start on PGA TOUR Champions will be at the Boca Raton Championship, February 9-11.

Notes – Professional Field

- **Scott Dunlap** and **John Daly** both scored 34 points Sunday, the highest totals in the field. Dunlap birdied the last three holes of regulation to earn a spot in the playoff, while Daly made six birdies on the back nine to finish third (88 points).
- Daly will play next week at the PGA TOUR's CareerBuilder Challenge.
- Defending champion **Woody Austin** finished eighth with 79 points.
- Next week, six players in the field will travel from Orlando to Hawaii for the season-opening Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai: Austin, **Mark Calcavecchia** (T17, 66 points), **Joe Durant** (6th, 82 points), **Jeff Maggert** (12th, 76 points), **Jeff Sluman** (T9, 77 points) and **Duffy Waldorf** (T13, 72 points).
- **Brooke Henderson** carded four birdies, one bogey and 13 pars en route to a 28-27-25 – 80 total and a seventh-place finish. **Brittany Lincicome** (14-23-23 – 60), **Brittany Lang** (12-20-20 – 52) and **Gerina Pillar** (13-19-11 – 43) were the other three LPGA players in the field.

Notes – Celebrity Field

- **Mardy Fish**, who also won this event in 2016, scored the most points in the celebrity field all three days. He scored 24 points Sunday (four birdies, two bogeys, 12 pars) and won by 14 over **Jeremy Roenick**.
- Fish is a six-time winner on the ATP Tour and was the silver medalist in men's singles at the 2004 Summer Olympics. He will be a commentator during ESPN's coverage of the Australian Open.
- **Jack Wagner** also scored 24 points Sunday, tying Fish for the day's best score. He finished fourth with 58 points.
- Mulder, the defending champion, tallied 15 points on Sunday and finished third with 60 points. He is the three-time defending champion of the American Century Celebrity Golf Championship.
- PGA TOUR Champions Ambassador **Alfonso Ribeiro** finished T20 (32 points) out of 52 celebrities.
