Q. Here with Woody Austin, six birdies, three bogeys today. I loved how aggressive you were today from start to finish. Was that part of your game plan?

I've got to attack flags, I've got to hit it inside 10 feet a lot to give myself enough chances and that's the way I play. Sometimes it hurts on the back nine coming down the stretch, you hit a couple wayward shots, but I'll never back off.

Q. Always known as a really good ball-striker out here, but the putter was working today, especially your up-and-down at 18.

WOODY AUSTIN: Yeah. Well, I got a good break, you know? I'm not afraid to admit it when it happens. It was a tough chip shot. I hit a pretty damn good chip shot, it just hit really hard and started -- but it hit the flag, so gave me a chance and I made it.

Q. Well, we appreciate it. You survived Bernhard Langer. We've got Jay Haas out there, we'll have to wait and see, but I kind of like your chances.
