

JEFF MAGGERT (-7)

Q. So, thoughts?

JEFF MAGGERT: It was a struggle. You know, I felt like my ball-striking was better today actually than yesterday, but I wasn't close to the hole like I was yesterday. Yesterday I had six birdies that were just tap-ins basically. Today I was hitting some pretty good shots but just wasn't making the putts. It was nice to get that birdie on the last hole, kind of puts a good taste in your mouth. There were some good scores today, but the top half of the leaderboard didn't run away with it. So just two shots behind, anything can happen on this course. I feel good here, so just go out and play aggressive tomorrow and make some birdies.

Q. It was a little bit like yesterday where you kind of lost a couple shots and sort of battled back?

JEFF MAGGERT: Yeah, putting is everything in this game. When you're making those 10, 15, 18 footers, if you can get four or five to go in in a round, that really helps. Today was just two-putt after two-putt after two-putt. It kind of wears on you when you're hitting it well enough to be making birdies and you just keep two-putting everything. But I feel good for tomorrow. Ball-striking, like I said, is good. Just go out, be patient and take some birdies when I can get them.

Q. How exciting is it to have so many guys within a few shots of the lead here going into the final round?

JEFF MAGGERT: Well, it is. It will be a little bit of a shootout. It's going to be hard to predict the winner. Obviously Bernhard plays tough, he's going to be probably right near the end. It's a strong leaderboard, so a lot of guys that have won tournaments out here. Just have to play hard and try to shoot a low score.

Q. Were you surprised he didn't run away with it today or it was just so difficult out there?

JEFF MAGGERT: It wasn't really that difficult. I don't know. It's a golf course that challenges you. You've got to hit good shots all day long. Bernhard's putting probably was maybe a little off like the rest of us. Scott played well. They both birdied the first hole and I was like, oh, here they go, going to have to make some birdies today, and that was kind of the end of it for our whole group. No one really got in a run of making three or four birdies to get the momentum going. We were all just two-putting every hole.
