Q. That was an interesting 18.

JERRY KELLY: Yeah, I hit the ball really well. You know, all the putts that dropped yesterday didn't drop today. Sometimes it's tough when you're expecting to see them go in just like they did the day before. I was just short and burning edges. It was good putting again, they just didn't go in.

Q. Was there pressure after that front nine to kind of get on your horse and --

JERRY KELLY: Well, no. Had 6 under on the back nine yesterday, so I was like, all right, just be patient, don't worry about it, they'll start dropping. I was hitting it good enough that I should have had all those opportunities, but the ball bouncing out a little bit more, I just didn't get it as close. I hit just as good of shots as yesterday, but I didn't leave myself close at the beginning.

Q. So it had nothing to do with maybe the change of speed of the greens from yesterday to today, that wasn't part of the problem?

JERRY KELLY: I don't think they were too far off. I gave them too much credit today. I didn't think -- I mean, look at what time it is. They've grown. They were probably great this morning.

Q. That's when everybody was scoring.

JERRY KELLY: But we're not playing in the morning. They're still softer, they're a little bumpier in the afternoon but still great surfaces. I should have made more.

Q. Personally, do you feel any expectations when you come into this event? You pick up the Rookie of the Year trophy before this starts.

JERRY KELLY: No, I wouldn't call it expectations, but I just want to give myself a chance every week. I figure if I hit the ball in the fairway, my iron game is very good. If the putter's hot, you know, I should be up there close. It's just nice to compete week in and week out.
