

GENE SAUERS (-12)

Q. Another good round, it's good to be talking to you again.

GENE SAUERS: Thank you.

Q. How did you carry the momentum? What was good about your game today?

GENE SAUERS: I just played solid today and I made a birdie on the par 5, No. 4. It's kind of -- it was kind of a boring round. And I made eagle on 7, so that kind of sparked me a little bit. Hit a great shot to 8, missed that putt. I played solidly. I think the putt I lipped out here, I think my putting kind of left me on the back nine, but I'm still in it and right there, so just hopefully they'll fall tomorrow.

Q. I think a lot of people are having trouble with that par 3 No. 5.

GENE SAUERS: Oh, the one over water? Yeah, it's an intimidating little par 3. They had the tees a little bit up today which made it a little bit easier, but when they get those tees back and that wind's howling, you've got to hit it solid.

Q. It's considered one of the toughest on the Tour, isn't it?

GENE SAUERS: Pretty much so, yes. That's a good one, especially when that wind blows, it's scary.

Q. Are you happy the wind stayed down a little bit today, I guess?

GENE SAUERS: Yeah, I am. I hate playing in the wind, but sometimes if you go out and keep it under control, you could pass a lot of people that way.

Q. The fact that the greens went from not being mowed yesterday to being mowed today, was that anything that you noticed?

GENE SAUERS: Yeah, it was a little bit. I ran a few by today, four, five feet today and it scared me. Oh, where'd that come from? They were a little smoother today. They're fine, great greens. They're tough to read. You think they break a certain way and they stay dead straight. Like that putt right there, I thought it might go a little right, but I said I'm going to play it dead straight and of course it did go a little right, but they're tricky, yeah.
