

JERRY KELLY (-18)

Q. How are you feeling right now?

JERRY KELLY: I've had the best mental attitude that I ever have and I put it to the test on 16, I'll tell you that.

Q. Where did that come from?

JERRY KELLY: It was shocking. I tried to -- I stayed really solid within myself all week and I tried to hit the crap out of that one and it cost me right away, so it shows me going forward. And I knew that that was an anomaly so I could still make great swings coming down the stretch. It wasn't something like, oh, I tried to make a -- I knew exactly what I did wrong. I took a big old backswing and I couldn't come back from it, so it showed me a lot.

Q. Have you ever done that there in any of your rounds?

JERRY KELLY: I mean, I've -- yeah, I've been in that lava before, but it's also been blowing 50 from left to right when I put it in that lava when we almost drove this green, it was blowing so hard that way. On a calm day, no, I've never been over there.

Q. Can we go through your scorecard real quick just to kind of get a -- if you can remember?

JERRY KELLY: I hope you've got it.

Q. I don't, but I was out there so I think I remember.

JERRY KELLY: I'm so bad at that.

Q. Okay, then let's don't do it.

JERRY KELLY: I'm so bad at that, but if you bring up which ones they are, and I'll tell you the one that meant the most was probably 13.

Q. You didn't have a very good approach there, did you?

JERRY KELLY: No, no. I thought those guys were much further past the hole so I thought they misjudged the wind, so I hit it a little easier than I should have. It should have been an absolute balls-out 60-degree and I hit it really easy. That looked like a pitch shot. You know, to get that one to go in --

Q. How far was that, do you think?

JERRY KELLY: That was probably 25 feet, something like that. After missing my second eagle on the par 5 from about eight feet maybe, I mean I was close.

Q. Let me ask you, did you hear the horn go off when you were putting there?

JERRY KELLY: Yeah. (Laughs.) No, I didn't. Let me blame it on something. No, I didn't hear it.

Q. Because there was a car alarm right in your putt.

JERRY KELLY: No. My head must have heard it, that must have been what happened.

Q. You played the par 5s very well, though, don't you think?

JERRY KELLY: Yeah, because I drove the ball very well so I left myself manageable shots in most of the time. So yeah, you have to get those out here because there's some easy par 4s but there's also some tough ones and I was just striking the ball well. I didn't put myself in tough positions too often, I was pretty consistent.

Q. That one on No. 7, you probably couldn't see from where you were but that ball wasn't tracking. If it had been maybe two feet, that might have been an albatross or double eagle, whatever they call them. That was close.

JERRY KELLY: I've had two of them, so I'm waiting for that third. That was probably my best shot of the day. I mean, pinpoint exactly where I wanted.

Q. (No microphone.)

JERRY KELLY: Yes, I was walking that one down. I was short all week. I figured I hammered that one and I still didn't get there. I thought I hammered this and this one just rolled in.

Q. How many feet on this one?

JERRY KELLY: I would say it was 17.

Q. Okay. Did you impress yourself after trying to make it there after the tournament and didn't go in?

JERRY KELLY: It's just so cool. It's amazing how many times that kind of stuff happens. I can't explain it. But you know, King Kamehameha may have had something to do with that one because I always say a lot, I talk to the spirit of the islands all the time and it means a lot

to me to win here again. They did it for me in '02 and they've been with me ever since. It's just fantastic, I love it.

Q. Special for Brendan Moynihan, too, that you won, you guys being friends?

JERRY KELLY: I mean, seeing Brendan over there on Lanai, it was the first time that we met. You know, we hit it off right away. Then he came over here and I basically followed him over here.

Q. He told us the story, yeah.

JERRY KELLY: He's been great to me. He has given me the ability to warm up on the islands for the Sony, and if he hadn't given me that opportunity, I wouldn't be coming back here all the time, so I owe him a lot.
