Q. Did you ever play here when it was BellSouth or AT&T?

VIJAY SINGH: I think so, I think I did. I cannot remember the course, it was so long ago. But it's a nice course, suits me. A long hitter's golf course. If you drive the ball well, you're going to score.

Q. Did you play the past two days?

VIJAY SINGH: I played on Tuesday and then today's the second time.

Q. Any gaps in between, take a break between Augusta and here, stay in Georgia?

VIJAY SINGH: No, I went back to Florida and came in Tuesday morning. One day rest. I like the course, I like the layout. I'm looking forward to contending on Sunday. I think if I just play the way I know how, I should be just fine.

Q. You won last month in Newport.

VIJAY SINGH: Different golf course, but it kind of took away a lot of pressure of trying to win. I'm kind of a little bit more free now and just, you know, I can freewheel it more than guiding it. I'm looking forward to it.

Q. Is there any trick to balancing the Tour events and the Champions Tour?

VIJAY SINGH: This is the first time where I made a choice playing here and not down in Savannah, so that was a big move. I played Hilton Head all the time before and this is the first time I haven't. I'm kind of leaning towards playing more over here. I think that this is the first step that I chose this one.

Q. So there was the thought that this might be your last Masters.

VIJAY SINGH: I don't know, maybe. Depends how I feel when I -- next year if I'm playing well and if I feel like I can contend, then I will probably play. I'm not going to go up and just make the numbers.

Q. Any good restaurants, where are you eating?

VIJAY SINGH: Just around this area. We had a couple of Korean barbecues, I like that. There's a lot of Asian restaurants here so that suits me fine.

Q. Looking ahead to next week, you're going back to the Legends of Golf with your partner, Carlos, defending. What are your thoughts on going back? That was your first year there.

VIJAY SINGH: It's a very nice place. It's in the middle of the jungle, you know, kind of. It keeps you very relaxed. The golf course is -- you play two par-3 golf courses this year and you didn't play the long one, the 18-hole last year. And Carlos is a fun guy to be with, he's so relaxing. We kind of have the same way of walking and swings are kind of the same, long and limber, so our makeup is both the same there. We get along well, I know Carlos very well. I'm looking forward to it. I wouldn't mind winning again.
