### David Frost, 32-34--66 (-6) | Pebble Beach

- David Frost hit 14 of 14 fairways (T1) and carded five birdies on his back nine en route to a 6-under 66 for a solo-lead after the first round.
- It is the first time Frost has led or shared the lead after 18-holes since the opening round of the 2016 Shaw • Charity Classic. He has converted a first round lead into a 54-hole victory once dating back to the 2013 Toshiba Classic.
- Frost is making his eighth start at the PURE Insurance Championship with his best finish being two sixth-place finishes back-to-back years (2015, 2016).
- In 21 starts this season, Frost has finished inside the top 10 three times including a T5 finish at the Insperity • Invitational. He is No. 20 in the Charles Schwab Cup.

## Marco Dawson, 33-34--67 (-5) | Pebble Beach

- Making his fifth start at the PURE Insurance Championship, Marco Dawson carded a bogey-free opening round • of 5-under-par 67. It is his lowest score at the event.
- Dawson is making his 20th start on Tour this season. His best finish (T3) came at the DICK'S Sporting Goods ٠ Open where he opened with a 7-under 65, his lowest round of the year.
- He owns a pair of PGA TOUR Champions titles from 2015 at the Cologuard Classic and the Senior Open • Championship. He is No. 23 in the Charles Schwab Cup.

### Ken Tanigawa, 33-34--67 (-5) | Pebble Beach

Making his PURE Insurance Championship debut, Ken Tanigawa carded four birdies with an eagle on No. 2 (his • 11th hole) en route to a 5-under 67 in the opening round.

- At T2, this is just the highest placing Tanigawa has exited the opening round of an event.
- Tanigawa was a medalist at PGA TOUR Champions Q-School in December 2017 and earned fully-exempt status for this season.
- He is making his 18th start on PGA TOUR Champions this season. His highest finish came at the Boeing Classic (T3). He is No. 33 in the Charles Schwab Cup.

#### Olin Browne, 33-34--67 (-5) | Pebble Beach

- Olin Browne carded a bogey-free round with three birdies and an eagle on No. 2 (his 11th hole) en route to a 5under 67 in his 10th appearance at the PURE Insurance Championship.
- He owns four top-10s in 10 starts at this event. His best came last year when he finished T4.
- Browne is making his 22nd start of the season. Last week he finished T9 at the Sanford International, one of his two top-10 finishes this year. He is No. 41 in the Charles Schwab Cup.

#### Hale Irwin, 30-37--67 (-5) | Pebble Beach

- World Golf Hall of Famer, **Hale Irwin** carded an eagle on No. 2 (his 11th hole) and birdies on Nos. 4,5, and 6 en route to besting his age with a 5-under 67.
- At 73-years, 3 months and 25 days old, this is the 39th time he has bested his age on Tour.
- It is his lowest round since besting his age at the 2014 3M Championship (6-under 66).
- Irwin is the all-time PGA TOUR Champions leader in career victories with 45. His last came in 2007 at the Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai.
- He has seven starts this year on Tour, with his best finish coming at Bass Pro Legends of Golf at Big Cedar Lodge with Wes Short Jr (T23).

#### **Other Notes**

- Leading the Pro-Junior division (gross best ball) after the first round is the team of **Hale Irwin** and 17-year-old Kendall Wallace (The First Tee of Columbia) after carding a 9-under-par 63 at Pebble Beach. Reigning Charles Schwab Cup champion **Kevin Sutherland** and his nephew 17-year-old Matthew Sutherland (The First Tee of Sacramento) trail by one after finishing with a 8-under-par 63 at Poppy Hills.
- Playing a net best ball with their juniors and pros, two amateur teams are tied at -14 after the first round: Sammy MacFarlane-Sam Reeves (Poppy Hills) and Jeff Harmening-Don Mulligan (Pebble Beach).
- Defending champion Bernhard Langer finished with a 4-under 67 at Poppy Hills and is T6 after 18 holes.
- Hole No. 12 was the most difficult on Friday at Pebble Beach with an average score of 3.488 (+.488). It yielded just four birdies. Hole No. 2 was the easiest with an average score of 4.488 (-.512) yielding three eagles and 16 birdies. At Poppy Hills, No. 6 was the most difficult with an average score of 3.325 (+.325) and just two birdies, while No. 18 was the easiest at 4.550 (-.450).
- After 36 holes, the low 50 (and ties) professionals, top 23 pro-junior teams and top-10 amateur teams will advance to the final round at Pebble Beach.
