Friday, June 29, 2018

Course Setup: Par 70 / 7,265 yards (R2 Scoring average: 75.28, Cumulative: 75.53)

Weather: High of 95 with 5-10 mph winds out of the west and east in the morning and 5-15 mph winds out of the south and southwest past noon.

Note: Due to potential inclement weather on Saturday, June 30 during the Fox Sports' championship coverage will shift one hour earlier – now airing Saturday's third round action from 3:30 to 8:00 p.m. EST on FS1.

Jerry Kelly, 66-69—135 (-5)

- Charles Schwab Cup leader, **Jerry Kelly** leads the U.S. Senior Open Championship after the second round by one-stroke. Kelly carded a 1-under-par 69 on Friday to add to his 4-under-par 66 in the opening round. His 36-hole total of 135 ties for the fourth-lowest leading score after the second round in championship history (record owned by Kirk Triplett and Kenny Perry in 2017 with 129).
- Kelly holds the leading position after 36-holes in a major championship for the first time in his PGA TOUR Champions career. He has led/co-led a non-major event after 36-holes three times on PGA TOUR Champions. One of those times was converted into a victory (2017 Boeing Classic).
- Following the second round, Kelly ranks third with Davis Love III in driving accuracy hitting 28/36 greens in regulation.
- Friday was Kelly's 16th consecutive round under par, a steak that spans the last four tournaments. He has top-10 finishes in each of his last four tournaments.
- The 51-year-old owns three victories on both the PGA TOUR and PGA TOUR Champions. He has never won a major on either Tour. Kelly's best finish at the U.S. Open was T7 in 2007 at Oakmont Country Club in Oakmont, Pennsylvania.

Miguel Angel Jimenez, 68-68—136 (-4)

- For the second day, **Miguel Angel Jimenez** recorded a 2-under-par 68, but this time it was bogey-free round, just his second bogey-free round in a U.S. Senior Open Championship, but his 10th of the season.
- Jimenez has made the cut in all three U.S. Senior Open Championship appearances. His best finish was in 2016 when he finished runner-up to Gene Sauers by one-stroke.
- This season, Jimenez won his first PGA TOUR Champions major at the Regions Tradition over Joe Durant by three-strokes. In 11 starts, he has six top-10s and is No. 6 in the Charles Schwab Cup.

Tim Petrovic, 72-65—137 (-3)

- In his U.S. Senior Open debut, **Tim Petrovic** rebounded from a first round 2-over-par 72 with back-to-back birdies on Nos. 3 and 4 to open his second round. Petrovic followed with three birdies in a row from Nos. 5-7 before landing his sixth on the final hole for a 6-under-par 30 second nine. This score ties for the third-lowest nine-hole score in championship history (28 by Tom Kite in 2012).
- He finished with a 5-under-par 65 total score for the lowest round of the day and ties for the third-lowest second round score in championship history (63 by Michael Allen in 2013). Petrovic moved up the leaderboard 23 places to sit in the top-three headed into the weekend.
- This season, Petrovic has recorded two runner-up finishes (Chubb Classic, Senior PGA Championship) and seven top-25 finishes in 10 starts. He has not yet won a major on PGA TOUR Champions.

Other Notes

- A total of 24 amateurs are in this year's field and at least one amateur has now made the cut in 14 U.S. Senior Opens. The low amateur through 36-holes of play is **Jeff Wilson** at 7-over-par 147 (T50).
- Nine players who are making their first start at the U.S. Senior Open made the cut.
- In his U.S. Senior Open debut, **Davis Love III** recorded a 1-over-par 71 in the opening round, followed by a 2-under-par 68 on Friday for a 139 total (T4). Should Davis go on to win, he would be the ninth player to win the U.S. Senior Open title in his first appearance.
- With birdies before the turn on Nos. 7-9, **Philip Golding** carded a 3-under-par 67 on Friday. He recorded a 36-hole total of 139 moving up the leaderboard 68 places to enter the weekend T4.
- Jay Haas continued his streak of cuts made Friday when he carded a 1-under-par 69 in the second round. In 14 U.S. Senior Open starts, he has never missed a cut, but this is just the third time he enters the weekend in the top-five. At 64-years-old, Haas is the oldest player in the field to make the cut.

- **Paul Goydos** came from behind to card a birdie-eagle-birdie on Nos. 13-15 to finish 3-under-par 67 in the second round to sit T4. This is the first time Goydos has entered the weekend in the top-five in a major on PGA TOUR Champions.
- By one-stroke, **Bernhard Langer** kept his streak alive of cuts made in a major on PGA TOUR Champions. The Champions Tour all-time major winner (10) has now failed to miss a cut in 51 major appearances.
- MLB Hall of Famer, **John Smoltz** carded a second round 7-over-par 77, missing the cut in his first U.S. Senior Open by 14-strokes.
- Making his U.S. Senior Open debut, Tod Bailey carded the second-lowest round of the day opening with birdies
 on Nos. 1-3 en route to a 4-under-par 66. The Head Golf Professional at Troom Golf at Rock Creek in Fairhope,
 Alabama enters the weekend T12.
