Today – A hot day in store for the Colorado Plains with sunny to partly cloudy skies and temperatures reaching the middle 90s. Environmental conditions are more favorable for isolated showers/T-storms over the Front Range this afternoon. It is very unlikely measurable rainfall occurs at lower elevations, however lightning can't be ruled out near the course. Gusty outflow winds could also occur which would likely bring a wind switch and a period of elevated winds. **Sunrise: 5:40am / Sunset: 8:31pm**

Extended Forecast – Moisture levels will be on the increase this weekend with an increasing chance for showers/T-storms. The most widespread activity is expected to remain over the Rockies, however isolated to scattered showers/T-storms will push into the Plains as well. Saturday still appears to be the most active day. Winds will favor an easterly direction during the morning hours, with a switch to the westerly or northerly direction during the afternoon. Wind gusts over 30 mph are possible with T-storm outflow boundaries, especially Friday/Saturday.
