






Today – Better moisture streaming into the area today will set the stage for more widespread showers/T-storms this afternoon. Activity will initially develop over the Front Range and then eventually push into the Plains. Lightning and gusty outflow winds will be a concern. Hot temperatures will again be in place with highs in the middle 90s. Winds should predominantly be out of the north to northeast but may become erratic and gusty during the afternoon **Sunrise: 5:40am / Sunset: 8:30pm**

Extended Forecast – A daily afternoon shower/T-storm threat will remain in place through this weekend. Initial activity will fire in the mountains early in the afternoon with isolated to scattered showers/T-storms tracking into the Plains. Gusty outflow winds upwards of 30 mph could occur with these cells. Temperatures should climb into the 90s each day with generally light winds outside of T-storms/outflows.
