



Today – A less active day is expected over the Plains with shower/T-storm coverage likely lower than yesterday. Activity will also be slower to develop with isolated showers/T-storms not developing over the Front Range until early this afternoon. Some of these cells could eventually drift towards the course but this would most be after 5pm. Temperatures will once again climb into the 90s with winds becoming east to southeast at 7-14 but could become variable after 3-4pm. **Sunrise: 5:40am / Sunset: 8:30pm**

Extended Forecast – The threat for any showers/T-storms will end by 10pm tonight with partly cloudy skies overnight. The most favorable setup for showers/T-storms this week is expected on Sunday as moisture levels climb to their highest levels. Showers/T-storms should develop over the Front Range late Sunday morning and then eventually drift onto the Plains. The period between 3-7pm will have the highest chances of impactful weather at the course. The threat for afternoon showers/T-storms will again be in place Monday. Gusty outflow winds over 25 mph are possible both days.
