- Introduced 30,000 square feet of wildflowers in the native areas as a pollinator.
- Aggressive agronomic practices include aerification, top dressing and verticutting fairways, along with raising and leveling more than 1,500 sprinkler heads, which has reduced water usage of more than 120 acres for each of the past three years.
- Wildlife includes bald eagles, deer, elk, red tail hawks, coyotes, racoons and ducks.
