Third-Round Suspension Summary

- Round three began Saturday at 3:04 p.m. and was suspended due to darkness at 8:10 p.m.
- 12 players completed their third rounds on Saturday
- Round three resumed at 7:32 a.m. Sunday and was completed at 10:27 a.m.

Things to Know

- Sung Kang equals the 54-hole tournament record and takes a three-stroke lead into the final round after resuming the third round Sunday morning on the 10th hole one stroke back
- Every opened with a front-nine 30 but four consecutive bogeys on the back nine leaves him three back
- Brooks Koepka birdies three of his final five holes to move within five strokes of the lead
- Scott Piercy is bogey-free through 54 holes after recording an 8-under 63 in round three
- Nicholas Lindheim cards a career-low 9-under 62 to move into a tie for ninth

Third-Round Lead Notes

- Thirteen third-round leaders/co-leaders have gone on to win this season, most recently Max Homa at the Wells Fargo Championship (does not include Zurich Classic team event)
- The 54-hole leader/co-leader has won 11 times at the AT&T Byron Nelson since 2000, most recently Aaron Wise (2018)

- Seeking his first PGA TOUR win in his 159th career start
- Second time holding the 54-hole lead on the PGA TOUR: 2017 Houston Open (2nd)
- Equals the opening 54-hole record of 194 (Loren Roberts, 1999; Brooks Koepka, 2016)

- R3 stats: 13/14 fairways hit, 12/18 greens in regulation, 28 putts
- Played the par 5s in 1-under in round three; had birdied or eagled every par 5 entering the third round
- Entered the third round with a four-shot lead and trailed Every by one when play was suspended Saturday evening
- Seeking to become the 10th Korean-born player to win on TOUR
- In the second round, posted a course-record-tying, bogey-free 10-under 61 (Marc Leishman, 2018/R1), including a career-best six consecutive birdies on Nos. 5-10
- Set the opening 36-hole record at the AT&T Byron Nelson of 16-under 126
- Two top-10 finishes this season: 2019 Sony Open in Hawaii (T10), 2019 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard (T6)
- Career-best finish on the PGA TOUR: 2017 Houston Open (2nd)

Matt Every (2nd/-16)

- Holed out for eagle on the par-5 first hole from 97' 11' prior to posting four more birdies in his first nine holes for a front-nine 30
- Held a one-stroke lead through nine holes when play was suspended Saturday evening
- Recorded two birdies on Nos. 11 and 16, but added four consecutive bogeys on Nos. 12-15 over his final nine holes Sunday morning
- R3 stats: 11 of 14 fairways hit, 14 of 18 greens in regulation, 28 putts
- Came from behind to win both of his PGA TOUR titles; overcame a three-stroke deficit at the 2014 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard and a four-stroke deficit in the same event in 2015
- Seeking his third TOUR win and his first since 2015 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard
- One top-10 finish this season: 2019 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (T3, partnered with K.H. Lee)
- Has missed the cut in his previous three starts at the AT&T Byron Nelson

Additional Player Notes

- Brooks Koepka (T3) rallied with birdies on three of his final five holes to sit five back; largest final-round comeback is three strokes at the 2015 Waste Management Phoenix Open
- Scott Piercy shot an 8-under 63 (T3) and is the only player in the field without a bogey this week; three top-10 finishes on the season is highlighted by a T3 at the RBC Heritage
- In his 53rd career start on TOUR, Tyler Duncan carded a 1-under 70 to sit T5; career-best finish on TOUR is a T5 at the 2017 Safeway Open
- Nicholas Lindheim (T9) holed a career-best nine birdies in a single round en route to a 9-under 62; previously made eight birdies during the final round of the 2017 Barbasol Championship
- Defending champion Aaron Wise shot a 5-under 66 and sits T27
