**First-Round Lead Notes**

Since 2000, the first-round leader/co-leader at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am has held on for the win just five times: D.A. Points (2011), Dustin Johnson (2009, 2010) and Phil Mickelson (2005, 2007).

**Phil Mickelson (65/MPCC/T3)**

- Marks the fourth time he opened with a 65 or better at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am. All three previous times, he went on to win: 1998/65/Win, 2005/62/Win, 2007/65/Win
- Marks his eighth round of 65 or better in the tournament, the most of any player since 1998 (next best player in Dustin Johnson at five)
- Hit all 13 fairways at Monterey Peninsula CC, marking the seventh career round on TOUR he hit all fairways, and first since round three of the 1998 Farmers Insurance Open
- Missed only one green in round one (No. 9), but saved par
- Missed the cut in last week's Waste Management Phoenix Open (68-75) as he looks to reach his 500<sup>th</sup> official made cut on TOUR
- Has four wins at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, one shy of Mark O'Meara's tournament record of five; most recent win at Pebble Beach came in 2012
- Is in search of his 14<sup>th</sup> win in the state of California, which would tie him with Tiger Woods, who has the most PGA TOUR wins in California since 1983

- Finished runner-up three weeks ago at the Desert Classic
- After four seasons without a win (2014-2017), picked up his 43<sup>rd</sup> TOUR win at the 2018 World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship

#### **Additional Player Notes**

- Brian Gay holds the first-round lead/co-lead for the fourth time in his career, with the last time coming in his victory at the 2009 FedEx St. Jude Classic. Today's 7-under 64 is his lowest score in 36 rounds at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am.
- Scott Langley holds the first-round lead/co-lead for the fourth time, but has never converted an 18-hole lead/co-lead to victory. Langley won the 2018 Panama Championship, this week's Web.com Tour stop. As an amateur at the 2010 U.S. Open at Pebble Beach, tied Russell Henley for low amateur honors. The T16 was his best career finish in a major championship.
- Jason Day is making his 10<sup>th</sup> career start in the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am. He finished runner-up in 2018, one of five top-six finishes in the event. In 35 rounds in the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, has just four over-par scores.
- Matt Every's 6-under 65 at Monterey Peninsula was his best round in 25 rounds at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am.
- Keith Mitchell posted a 5-under 66 at Monterey Peninsula while paired with PGA TOUR Commissioner Jay Monahan. The Mitchell/Monahan team is T4 in the pro-am competition after a 9-under 62 at Monterey Peninsula, while Scott Langley/Dan Rose lead the pro-am competition following a 12-under 59 at Monterey Peninsula.
- After making the turn in 3-over 37, Ho Sung Choi birdied three of his last eight holes en route to a 1-over 72 in his PGA TOUR debut. He hit 9/13 fairways, 11/18 greens and had 29 putts at Monterey Peninsula.
- Defending champion Ted Potter Jr. posted a 10-over 82 at Spyglass Hill.
- Sean O'Hair withdrew after nine holes at Spyglass Hill. He was replaced in the pro-am portion of the field by Joe Horowitz.
