Completed Second-Round Notes – Saturday, February 9, 2019

Weather: Second-round play was suspended for the day Friday at 2:11 p.m. PT due to heavy rain in the area. The second-round resumed Saturday at 7:10 a.m. PT, with the third round beginning as scheduled at 8:00 a.m. PT. Mostly sunny for the conclusion of the second round. Wind WSW 5-10 mph. High of 48.

Things to Know

- 44 players were left on the course and returned Saturday at 7:10 a.m. PT to complete the second round; the second round concluded at 8:23 a.m.
- Phil Mickelson has converted for the win 17 of 33 times on the PGA TOUR with the 36-hole lead/co-lead
- Jordan Spieth fell out of a tie for the lead with a bogey on the par-4 ninth hole Saturday morning (his
 final hole of the day and first bogey of the round)
- This week marks the fourth event this season with a suspension of play due to weather
- Since 2000, the second-round leader/co-leader has held on for the win seven times: Jordan Spieth (2017), Brandt Snedeker (2015, 2013), Jimmy Walker (2014), Dustin Johnson (2010), Phil Mickelson (2007, 2005)
- Phil Mickelson has four wins at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, one shy of Mark O'Meara's tournament record of five; most recent win at Pebble Beach came in 2012

Phil Mickelson (-10/133/T1)

- Starting on the back nine at Spyglass Hill, played his first 14 holes in 6-under to take the solo-lead before three consecutive bogeys on Nos. 6-8. Added a birdie at the last for a 68 to take a share of the 36-hole lead
- This week marks the 34th time Mickelson has held the 36-hole lead/co-lead
- Mickelson has not converted any of his last four 36-hole leads/co-leads to victory (most recently finishing T2 at the 2019 Desert Classic after holding the 36-hole lead)
- Of his four victories (1998, 2005, 2007, 2012) at the tournament, two have come when holding the 36-hole lead/co-lead 2005, 2007. In 1998, he trailed by one entering the third round, which was the final round at the time. In 2012, he trailed by five shots after 36 holes before closing with rounds of 70-64 for a two-shot victory
- After hitting all 13 fairways in the first round at Monterey Peninsula, only hit 6 of 14 fairways in round two at Spyglass Hill
- Has hit 31 of 36 greens through two rounds, which ranks T2 in the field
- Missed the cut in last week's Waste Management Phoenix Open (68-75) as he looks to reach his 500th
 official made cut on TOUR

- Is in search of his 14th win in the state of California, which would tie him with Tiger Woods, who has the most PGA TOUR wins in California since 1983
- Opened with a 65 at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am. All three previous times he opened with 65 or better, he went on to win: 1998/65/Win, 2005/62/Win, 2007/65/Win
- After four seasons without a win (2014-2017), picked up his 43rd TOUR win at the 2018 World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship

Paul Casey (-10/133/T1)

- Starting on the back nine at Monterey Peninsula, carded three consecutive pars before playing the final six holes of the back nine in 6-under to turn in 6-under 31. Recorded eight pars and a birdie on the front nine for a bogey-free 7-under 64 the best round of the day
- Has held a share of the 36-hole lead/co-lead five times previously in his career and converted it into victory once previously (2009 Houston Open)
- Missed the cut in his first two starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (2001, 2002) before a T8 in 2018
- Earned his second PGA TOUR victory at the 2018 Valspar Championship, nine seasons after his first TOUR win, the 2009 Houston Open

Scott Langley (-10/133/T1)

- Has held the second-round lead/co-lead three times previously but has never gone on to win in those events (T11/2014 Travelers Championship, T12/2014 Wyndham Championship, T13/2015 Greenbrier Classic)
- Langley won the 2018 Panama Championship, this week's week Web.com Tour stop, on his way to his third-place finish on the 2018 Web.com Tour Regular Season money list.
- As an amateur at the 2010 U.S. Open at Pebble Beach, tied Russell Henley for low amateur honors. The T16 was his best career finish in a major championship.

Lucas Glover (-10/134/T1)

- Three-time PGA TOUR winner has held the 36-hole lead/co-lead six times previously but hasn't converted any into victory
- 10-under 134 is his lowest 36-hole total in six career appearances at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am.
- After missed cuts in each of his first four starts at this event, finished T11 in his last start in 2016.
- Has finished inside the top 20 in five of six starts this season, with a season-best T7 at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open

Jordan Spieth (-9/134/T5)

- Came back Saturday morning with two holes to play at Spyglass Hill and tied for the lead at 10-under; only bogey came on the par-4 ninth hole (his final hole of the round) and dropped him to T5
- Held a share of the 36-hole lead at 10-under par in his 2017 victory with Jason Day and Derek Fathauer, closing with rounds of 65-70 for a four-shot victory over Kelly Kraft
- Has finished inside the top 25 in all six career appearances at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Seeking his first win since the 2017 Open Championship

Jason Day (-9/134/T5)

- Played the first 10 holes at Spyglass Hill in 1-over before carding four birdies over his next five holes before play was suspended with Day on the 16th hole; went bogey-birdie-par to cap off his round Saturday morning to remain at 9-under
- Making his 10th career start in the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am; He finished runner-up in 2018, one of five top-six finishes in the event. In 36 rounds at this event, has just four over-par scores

Additional Player Notes

After opening with a double bogey, Roger Sloan (T147) made a double eagle at the par-5 second hole –
the first of the 2018-19 PGA TOUR Season – with a 3-wood from 243 yards. It was the first double eagle
on the PGA TOUR since Satoshi Kodaira at the 2018 Fort Worth Invitational

- Dustin Johnson and Beau Hossler held a share of the 36-hole lead in 2018 on their way to T2 and T43 finishes, respectively. Ted Potter Jr., the 2018 champion, was seven shots back of the lead after 36 holes (T23) but closed with rounds of 62-69 to win by three shots
- Defending champion Ted Potter Jr. sits T152 after the first two rounds
- Cameron Champ (T59) carded two eagles in the second round at Pebble Beach with eagles on the par-5 2nd and par-5 6th
- After opening with a 1-over 72 at Monterey Peninsula, Ho Sung Choi (T126) carded a 3-over 75 at Spyglass Hill in the second round of his PGA TOUR debut
