Things to Know

- Paul Casey has converted for the win one of four times on the PGA TOUR with the 54-hole lead/co-lead
- Phil Mickelson made the 54-hole cut for his 500th official made cut on TOUR
- 2017 winner Jordan Spieth posted two double bogeys on the back nine at Pebble Beach en route to a 2-over 74, his third over-par score in 27 rounds. He is eight shots off the lead.
- Since 2000, the 54-hole leader/co-leader has gone on to win 11 times, including four of the last six winners: Ted Potter Jr./2018, Jordan Spieth/2017, Jimmy Walker/2014, Brandt Snedeker/2013
- Paul Casey and his amateur partner Don Colleran, EVP and CSO of FedEx Corp, lead the team competition at 28-under, four shots clear of Josh Teater and Ryan Smith.

- Missed the cut in his first two starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (2001, 2002) before a T8 in 2018
- Making his sixth start of the 2018-19 TOUR Season, with four consecutive top-25 finishes before missing the cut at the Sony Open in Hawaii in his most recent start
- Is in search of his third PGA TOUR title; Earned his second TOUR victory at the 2018 Valspar Championship, nine seasons after his first win, the 2009 Houston Open
- At 41 years, 6 months, 20 days, would be the oldest winner of the 2018-19 PGA TOUR Season, joining Matt Kuchar (who won twice) as players in their 40s with wins this season

Phil Mickelson (-12/203/2nd)

- Was six shots back after the third round in 2012, before carding a final-round 8-under 64 for a two-shot victory
- With a win, would join Mark O'Meara with five wins at Pebble Beach, the most in tournament history
- Held a two-shot lead after 54 holes at the Desert Classic three weeks ago, but finished one shot back of Adam Long after a final-round 3-under 69
- Is in search of his 14th win in the state of California, which would tie him with Tiger Woods, who has the most PGA TOUR wins in California since 1983
- Opened with a 65 at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am. All three previous times he opened with 65 or better, he went on to win: 1998/65/Win, 2005/62/Win, 2007/65/Win
- After four seasons without a win (2014-17), picked up his 43rd TOUR win at the 2018 WGC-Mexico Championship

Additional Player Notes

- Scott Piercy (T3) has three top-10s in nine starts this season
- After missed cuts in his first four appearances at Pebble Beach, Lucas Glover finished T11 in his most recent start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am in 2016
- After sitting one-shot back of the lead through 54 holes, Jordan Spieth finished three over in his last two holes at Pebble Beach for a 2-over 74; He has finished inside the top 25 in all six career appearances
- Through 13 events in the 2018-19 PGA TOUR Season, nine players have converted a 54-hole lead/co-lead into victory, including the last two winners (Justin Rose/Farmers Insurance Open; Rickie Fowler/Waste Management Phoenix Open)
- Defending champion Ted Potter, Jr. missed the cut with rounds of 82-74-781—227 (+12)
- Ho Sung Choi missed the 54-hole cut with rounds of 72-75-77—224 (+9) in his PGA TOUR debut
