Weather: Hot and humid, with severe afternoon thunderstorms. High of 88. Wind SW 6-12 mph. Play was suspended due to a dangerous weather situation at 2:07 p.m. with 32 players left to complete their round. Play resumed at 5:14 p.m. for a total delay of 3 hours, 7 minutes.

Things to Know

- Jim Herman’s 72-hole total of 26-under 262 breaks the Barbasol Championship scoring record previously held by Grayson Murray in 2017
- Herman betters his career-low 72-hole score by three strokes
- Lexington native and local favorite Josh Teater finishes T6, his best finish since 2013
- Sepp Straka finished in third place, a career best for the Austrian
- Anders Albertson carded a career first ace on the PGA TOUR at the par-3 ninth hole
- 114 eagles marks the most at a PGA TOUR event since 1990 (single course events)

- Wins second PGA TOUR title in his 175th career TOUR start at the age of 41 years, 8 months, 16 days
- Establishes new 72-hole scoring record at the Barbasol Championship (26-under 262)
- Bests his previous 72-hole career-low on TOUR by three strokes (2017 Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Became the fourth player to win by one stroke or in a playoff in the tournament’s five-year history
- Final round 70 marks the highest finish by a winner in tournament history
- Led the field in scrambling (8 of 9)
- Claimed his second victory on PGA TOUR (2016 Houston Open)
- Converted a 54-hole lead into a victory for the second time on TOUR (2016 Houston Open)
- Moved to No. 134 in the FedExCup standings
- Marked his first top 10 finish this season (last top-10: 2017 Valspar Championship, T3)

Miscellaneous Notes

- Lexington native and local favorite **Josh Teater** finished T6, his best finish since a T6 at the 2013 Genesis Open

- Austrian **Sepp Straka** posted the best finish of his career in third place (previous best: T11, 2019 Rocket Mortgage Classic)
- **Anders Albertson** carded his first ace on the PGA TOUR at the par-3 ninth hole with a 5-iron from 191 yards. Finished T18, his third top-20 finish this season
- Among players who finished inside the top 10, the following began the week outside of the top 125 and have moved inside that number with just two weeks remaining in the regular season: **Kelly Kraft** (No. 114), **Sepp Straka** (No. 119), **Austin Cook** (No. 121), and **Martin Laird** (No. 123).
