#### Things to Know

- Justin Rose wins 10<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR title to become the winningest player from England since 1945
- Rose becomes first player since Ben Crane (2010) to win after playing North Course in opening round
- Rose becomes first player since Tiger Woods (2013) to convert 54-hole lead/co-lead at Farmers Insurance Open
- Rose and Adam Scott each surpass \$50 million in PGA TOUR career earnings, the sixth and seventh players to do so
- Talor Gooch, lone American among leading seven finishers, posted second consecutive top-10 on TOUR
- After one bogey-free round on Saturday, there were none on Sunday

### **Third-Round Lead Notes**

- Occasions since 2000 on which a player has converted a 54-hole lead to victory; Justin Rose (2019), Tiger Woods (2003, 2008, 2013), John Daly (2004) and Phil Mickelson (2000)
- 8 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win on TOUR in 2018-19 (most recent: Justin Rose/Farmers Insurance Open)

Rose is the first player since Tiger Woods (2013) to turn 54-hole lead into a victory at Farmers Insurance Open. The previous five winners had been at least two shots off the lead entering the final round:

- 2019 Justin Rose (led by 3)
- 2018 Jason Day (trailed by 3)
- 2017 Jon Rahm (trailed by 3)
- 2016 Brandt Snedeker (trailed by 6)
- 2015 Jason Day (trailed by 2)

# After the week

#6 FedExCup #1 OWGR

10 Starts at Farmers Insurance Open

- 1 Wins at Farmers Insurance Open (2019)
- 326 PGA TOUR starts
- 10 PGA TOUR wins
- 3 PGA TOUR starts in 2018-19
- 2 Top-10s in 2018-19 (3<sup>rd</sup>/WGC-HSBC Champions, Won/Farmers Insurance Open)
  - Wins 10<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR title in 326<sup>th</sup> start on PGA TOUR at 38 years, 5 months, 28 days
  - With 500 FedExCup points for the win, reigning FedExCup champion moves from No. 40 to No. 6 with 720 points, 408 points behind leader Xander Schauffele (1,128)
  - First player since Ben Crane (2010) to win after playing North Course in opening round
  - Equaled 36-hole tournament record of 129 and 54-hole tournament record of 198 en route to victory, but comes up one stroke shy of 72-hole tournament record of 266
  - Becomes first player from England with 10 PGA TOUR titles since 1945: Rose (10), Nick Faldo (9), Luke Donald (5), Ian Poulter (3)
  - Converted 54-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR five of 16 times, most recent before this week/2018 Charles Schwab Challenge
  - With \$1,278,000 winner's check, surpasses \$50 million in PGA TOUR career earnings (\$51,023,355)
  - Ranked No. 5 in Strokes Gained: Approach The Green, hitting 16/18 GIR in rounds 1 & 2, and 12/18 in rounds 3 & 4
  - Wins with Gareth Lord (Henrik Stenson's caddie) on the bag in just his second week while regular caddie, Mark Fulcher, recovers from recent heart surgery
  - In his 10<sup>th</sup> start at the Farmers Insurance Open has finished top-10 three consecutive years (2019/1<sup>st</sup>, 2018/T8, 2017/T4)
  - Won twice in 2017-18, his second season with multiple wins (2010)
  - In two previous starts on TOUR this season, finished third (WGC-HSBC Champions) and T34 (Desert Classic)

#### **Adam Scott**

- Birdied final four holes for 4-under 68 and runner-up finish at 19-under 269, three strokes back in his first start in the Farmers Insurance Open
- For comparison, in 1999, Billy Ray Brown posted 268 (-20) to finish runner-up, two shots back of Tiger Woods
- Finished T26 at the 2008 U.S. Open at Torrey Pines
- Was seeking to become the first player to win the Farmers Insurance Open in his first start since Jon Rahm in 2017
- With check of \$766,800, becomes first Australian to surpass \$50 million in career earnings on PGA TOUR (\$50,184,193)
- Moves to No. 15 in FedExCup after starting the week No. 84

## Hideki Matsuyama

- Finished T12 at the 2018 Farmers Insurance Open, his best showing in five appearances before T3 this week
- Moved up 73 spots in the FedExCup, biggest jump of any player (No. 114 to No. 41)
- Last of five TOUR wins came at 2017 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational
- Hit 17/18 GIR after hitting just 11/18 in both second and third rounds at South Course
- Two-putt birdies at par-5 ninth and 18<sup>th</sup> holes after reaching green on both holes with second shot from fairway bunkers (21' 4" at No. 9, 17' 4" at No. 18)

#### **Talor Gooch**

- Former Oklahoma State University golfer finished No. 139 in the FedExCup in his rookie season on the PGA TOUR (2017-18). Currently sits No. 27 in FedExCup
- Owns back-to-back top-10s on TOUR for the first time. Fourth-place finish at last week's Desert Classic was his first career top-10 in 33<sup>rd</sup> start on TOUR
- Started the final round six strokes behind leader Justin Rose. Came from five strokes back to win the Web.com Tour's 2017 News Sentinel Open in Knoxville
- Owns nine consecutive rounds in the 60s on TOUR

#### **Jason Day**

- Finished T5 as defending champion. Best result from a player defending a title this season: Patrick Cantlay/2<sup>nd</sup>/Shriners Hospitals for Children Open. Last player to defend a title: Brooks Koepka/2018 U.S. Open
- Between his wins at the Farmers Insurance Open (2015/2018), missed the cut in both starts. Owns five top-10s in 10 starts at Torrey Pines (T9/2013, T2/2014, 1st/2015, 1st/2018, T5/2019)
- Earns second top-10 in fourth start of the 2018-19 PGA TOUR Season (T5/THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES, T5/Farmers Insurance Open)

## **Rory McIlroy**

- Sat T74 after opening-round 71 in his first start at the Farmers Insurance Open and followed with 65-69-69 to finish T5
- Finished T4 in his most recent TOUR start, his tournament debut at the Sentry Tournament of Champions

## Jon Rahm

- 2017 Farmers Insurance Open winner made one birdie (No. 6) and one bogey (No. 11) in the final round for a T5 result
- In defense of his Farmers Insurance Open title in 2018, closed with a 5-over 77 to finish T29
- Closed with a 5-under 67 at last week's Desert Classic to finish sixth

#### **Additional Player Notes**

- In first start since winning the 2018 TOUR Championship, **Tiger Woods** played his final eight holes in 5-under to shoot 67 and finish T20 at 10-under. Last nine rounds at Farmers Insurance Open are par-or-better
- **Gary Woodland** fired 66 for his first sub-70 final-round at Farmers Insurance Open to finish T9 his second top-10 in 10 appearances (T10/2014). Has advanced to the weekend in each of 10 starts at Torrey Pines. Recorded three eagles this week, the most by any player
- Cameron Smith (T9) posted the low round of the day (65) with an eagle (No. 18), seven birdies and two bogeys
- Ryan Palmer, part of last year's three-man playoff (Jason Day, Alex Noren), finished T13 at 11-under
- **Jim Knous** (T29) made his first hole-in-one on TOUR at No. 3 (193 yards, 8-iron), the first ace at Farmers Insurance Open since 2015. Knous' 3-under 69 featured a 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 on his scorecard
- Former Ole Miss standout Braden Thornberry finished T52 in his first PGA TOUR event as a professional (71-67-72-74)
