36-hole cut: 81 professionals at 2-under 138 from a field of 142 professionals and two amateurs.

Things to Know

- Matt Kuchar has held the 36-hole lead/co-lead 12 times previously in his career converted two into victories
- Kuchar is the first player in the last four seasons to start a TOUR event with consecutive scores of 63 or better
- Andrew Putnam has made one bogey through two rounds en route to a career-low 36-hole score
- Chez Reavie is the first player on record (since 1983) on TOUR with three eagles on par-4s in the same round
- Defending champion Patton Kizzire sits T20 at the halfway point
- Steve Stricker made his 371st cut on the PGA TOUR and 14th at the Sony Open in Hawaii

Age: 40 (June 21, 1978)

Entering the week

- #9 FedExCup
- #32 OWGR
- 13 Starts at Sony Open in Hawaii
- 5 Top-10s at Sony Open in Hawaii
- 429 PGA TOUR starts
- 8 PGA TOUR wins
- 3 PGA TOUR starts in 2018-19
- 1 Win in 2018-19 (Mayakoba Golf Classic)

- Holds the second-round lead/co-lead for the 13th time; has won two of the previous 12 (2012 THE PLAYERS Championship, 2018 Mayakoba Golf Classic)
- The last time led after the second round went on to capture victory at the 2018 Mayakoba Golf Classic
- Becomes first player since Jason Day at the 2015 BMW Championship (61-62) to start a TOUR event with consecutive scores of 63 or better
- 126 ties career-low 36-hole score (2008 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open/finished 2nd)
- With a victory, would become the third defending champion of the Mayakoba Golf Classic to win the Sony Open in Hawaii since 2011 (Johnson Wagner: 2011 Mayakoba Golf Classic/2012 Sony Open; Patton Kizzire: 2017 Mayakoba Golf Classic, 2018/Sony Open)

- Seeking 100th top-10 career finish on the PGA TOUR

Andrew Putnam (-13/2nd)

- 127 marks career-low 36-holes (previous: 131/2018 FedEx St. Jude Classic/finished 2nd)
- Through 36 holes, has made 287 feet, 3 inches of putts (most in the field; second-most: Adam Svensson, 115'3")
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (8.897)
- Scoring breakdown for the week: front nine (8-under), back nine (5-under)
- Has made one bogey through 36 holes (par-4 15th/R1)

Chez Reavie (-10/T3)

- 5-under 65 included eagle-2s at the 10th, 16th and sixth holes
- First player with three hole-outs for eagle from 100+ yards during the same round in the ShotLink era (since 2003); No. 10/101 yards, No. 16/149 yards, No. 6/135 yards
- First player on record (since 1983) on TOUR with three eagles on par-4s in the same round
- Marks second career round with multiple eagles (2/R1/2012 Open Championship)
- First TOUR player with three eagles in one round since Keegan Bradley and Tommy Fleetwood at the 2018 RBC Canadian Open
- First time in career with three eagles during the same round in 842 career rounds

Stewart Cink (-10/T3)

- 8-under 62 ties career-low round on the PGA TOUR (R1/2016 The RSM Classic, R4/2018 Travelers Championship)
- Recorded nine birdies; his career-best is 10 (R4/2018 Travelers Championship)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Around The Green through 36 holes (3.592)

Miscellaneous Notes

- Keith Mitchell played his final three holes (Nos. 7-9) in 5-under; first to do so since Keegan Bradley on Nos. 16-18 in the second round of 2018 RBC Canadian Open
- Mitchell notched second career ace, doing so on the par-3 No. 7 with an 8-iron from 176 yards (previous: 2017 Mayakoba Golf Classic)
- Steve Stricker made a 55-foot, 9-inch putt on No. 18 to make the cut on the number, marking his 14th made-cut in 15 starts at the event
- Defending champion Patton Kizzire sits T20 at the halfway point as he seeks to become the first player since 2014-15 to win back-to-back at the event
- At T20, Charles Howell III made his 18th cut in as many starts at the Sony Open in Hawaii; in search of his 10th top-10 finish in his 18th start at the event
