Things to Know

- Matt Kuchar has held the 54-hole lead/co-lead seven times previously in his career and converted three into victories
- Andrew Putnam continues to lead the field in Strokes Gained: Putting as he seeks his second TOUR win
- Keith Mitchell has played his last 21 holes in 12-under
- Davis Love IIII sits T5 as he seeks to become the oldest winner in TOUR history
- Bryson DeChambeau cards his 13th consecutive under-par round on TOUR
- Defending champion Patton Kizzire trails by 10 in attempt to become first repeat winner of Sony Open since 2014-15

1 Win in 2018-19 (Mayakoba Golf Classic)

- Holds the third-round lead/co-lead for the eighth time; has won three of the previous seven (2009 Turning Stone Resort Championship, 2013 the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide, 2018 Mayakoba Golf Classic)
- 192 opening 54-hole score is the best of his career (193/2018 Mayakoba Golf Classic, 196/2015 Sony Open in Hawaii, 196/2011 THE NORTHERN TRUST)
- In search of ninth PGA TOUR victory and second of the season (2018 Mayakoba Golf Classic)
- Enters the final round with a two-stroke lead; led by four after 54 holes en route to 2018 Mayakoba Golf Classic victory
- Has just one bogey through 54 holes (par-4 15th in round two)
- Victory Sunday would come at the age of 40 years, 6 months, 23 days
- In search of his 100th top-10 career finish on the PGA TOUR
- Bidding for his second multiple-win season (won twice in 2013: WGC-Dell Match Play, the Memorial Tournament)

- Seeking to become the third Mayakoba Golf Classic defending champion to win the Sony Open since 2011 (Johnson Wagner: 2011 Mayakoba Golf Classic/2012 Sony Open; Patton Kizzire: 2017 Mayakoba Golf Classic, 2018/Sony Open)
- 192 total falls four shy of Justin Thomas' 54-hole record at the Sony Open (188/2017)

Andrew Putnam (-16/2)

Age: 29 (January 25, 1989)

Entering the week

- #31 FedExCup #67 OWGR
- 2 Starts at Sony Open in Hawaii
- 0 Top-10s at Sony Open in Hawaii
- 57 PGA TOUR starts
- 1 PGA TOUR win
- 4 PGA TOUR starts in 2018-19
- Top-10 in 2018-19 (T4-WGC-HSBC Champions)
- 194 is his career-low opening 54-hole score (195/2018 FedEx St. Jude Classic, 199/2018 BMW Championship)
- Leads the field with 19 birdies
- Through 54 holes, has made 388 feet, 3 inches of putts (most in the field; second-most, 345'2" by Brian Stuard)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (10.708)
- Seeking second PGA TOUR victory (2018 Reno-Tahoe Tournament)
- Making third start at the Sony Open in Hawaii (MC/2015, T69/2018)
- Victory Sunday would come at the age of 29 years, 11 months, 19 days

Keith Mitchell (-14/T3)

- 63 equals his best round on TOUR (final-round 63 at the 2018 AT&T Byron Nelson)
- Will make his first appearance in a final grouping on TOUR, playing with Matt Kuchar and Andrew Putnam
- Dating to his ace-birdie-eagle finish in round two, is 12-under in his last 21 holes
- 196 opening 54-hole score is four shots better than his previous-best mark (200/2018 Wyndham Championship)
- Proximity to the hole on the par-3 seventh hole this week, which he has played in five strokes (birdie-ace-birdie): R1 (5'8"), R2 (0'0"), R3 (3'9")
- Finished T25 in 2018 in his only other Sony Open start
- Career-best finish is runner-up effort at the 2018 Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship
- Victory Sunday would come at the age of 27 years, 6 days

Chez Reavie (-14/T3)

- Followed matching 5-under 65s in the opening two rounds with a 4-under 66 to remain T3
- Notched lone PGA TOUR victory at the 2008 RBC Canadian Open
- Seeking second top-10 finish in nine starts at the Sony Open in Hawaii (T8/2017)
- Victory Sunday would come at the age of 37 years, 2 months, 1 day
- Week highlighted by becoming the first player with three hole-outs for eagle from 100+ yards during the same round in the ShotLink era (since 2003); No. 10/101 yards, No. 16/149 yards, No. 6/135 yards
- First player on record (since 1983) on TOUR with three eagles on par-4s in the same round

Davis Love III (-11/T5)

- Following a 6-under 64 Saturday, hoping to become the PGA TOUR's oldest winner at the age of 54 years, 9 months
- Oldest winners in TOUR history: Sam Snead (52-10-8 at the 1965 Wyndham Championship), Art Wall (51-7-10 at the 1975 Greater Milwaukee Open), Love III (51-4-10 at the 2015 Wyndham Championship)
- Owns four top-five finishes in 16 Sony Open starts (2/1994, T2/1999, 3/2004, T5/2010)

Bryson DeChambeau (-11/T5)

- His 7-under 63 Saturday marked his 13th consecutive under-par score on the PGA TOUR
- The last time he failed to post an under-par round was during the second round of the 2018 TOUR Championship (75)
- Dating to the beginning of the 2018 FedExCup Playoffs, has now recorded 25 of 27 rounds at par-or-better
- Five-time PGA TOUR winner is making his second start at the Sony Open in Hawaii (T49/2017)

Charles Howell III (-11/T5)

• At T5, is well-positioned for his 10th top-10 in 18 starts at the Sony Open in Hawaii; has never missed a cut at the event

- Since 2002, is a TOUR-best 165-under at the Sony Open
- Seeking fourth PGA TOUR victory after winning earlier this season at The RSM Classic; prior to winning at Sea Island Golf Club, his last win came at the 2007 Genesis Open, a span of 11 years, 9 months and 333 starts between titles.

Miscellaneous Notes

- Defending champion Patton Kizzire sits T21 in his quest to become the first player since Jimmy Walker (2014-15) to win back-to-back at the Sony Open
- Making his seventh start at the Sony Open, Brian Stuard (T5) is in search of his fourth top-10 finish (T4/2018, T5/2013, 6/2014)
