#### **Things to Knos**

- 2011 Jack Nicklaus Award winner Patrick Cantlay claims his second PGA TOUR victory
- Cantlay fires the low final round score (64) by a winner at the Memorial Tournament
- Five-time Memorial Tournament winner Tiger Woods ties Jay Haas for most top-10 finishes at the event (9)
- Adam Scott finishes runner-up for the 13<sup>th</sup> time on TOUR as he sought his first victory since 2016
- Second- and third-round leader Martin Kaymer falls to a third-place finish, as Jack Nicklaus and Tiger Woods remain the only players to win the U.S. Open, PLAYERS Championship and Memorial Tournament in a career
- Three past Memorial Tournament winners finish inside the top 10 (Tiger Woods, Hideki Matsuyama, Jason Dufner)
- Jordan Spieth (T7) picks up third-consecutive top-10 finish in a season for the first time since 2017
- One year after being involved in a Friday night car accident following a missed cut at the Memorial Tournament, Bud Cauley finishes T9
- Nick Price was named on Sunday as the 2020 Memorial Tournament Honoree, with Gene Littler and Ted Ray to be honored posthumously

**PGA TOUR Wins (2):** 2017 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, 2019 the Memorial Tournament **Best 2018-19 results:** Won/the Memorial Tournament, 2/Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, T3/RBC Heritage, T3/PGA Championship

- Entered the final round trailing Martin Kaymer by four before a bogey-free 8-under 64 led to a two-stroke win over Adam Scott; scorecard included birdies on Nos. 2, 5, 7, 8, 9, 11, 14, 15
- 64 marks lowest final-round score by a winner in event history (65 Jim Furyk/2002, K.J. Choi/2007, Tiger Woods/2009)
- Claims his second PGA TOUR victory in his 78<sup>th</sup> start at the age of 27 years, 2 months, 16 days

- Earns 500 points and moves from No. 12 to No. 6 in the FedExCup; seeking third trip to the TOUR Championship in as many seasons (29<sup>th</sup>/2017, 20<sup>th</sup>/2018)
- 2011 Jack Nicklaus Award winner joins Tiger Woods as the only past Nicklaus Award winner to also win the Memorial Tournament
- Notches career-best eighth top-10 of the season (previous-best was seven last season)
- If not otherwise eligible, earns entry into the following 2019-2020 events: Sentry Tournament of Champions, Desert Classic, Genesis Invitational, Arnold Palmer Invitational, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament, RBC Heritage, PGA Championship, Charles Schwab Challenge, the Memorial Tournament
- Just three players have come back from larger deficits than his four-stroke deficit over the final 18 holes at the Memorial Tournament (5 strokes: David Edwards/1992, Jim Furyk/2002, K.J. Choi/2007)
- Equals the second-best 72-hole score at the Memorial Tournament: 20-under 268 (Tom Lehman/1994), 19-under 269 (Greg Norman/1995, Tiger Woods/2000, Patrick Cantlay/2019)
- Wins in his third appearance at the Memorial Tournament (T35/2017, 4/2018, Won/2019)
- Is the last player to make an ace at this event, doing so on the par-3 eighth hole in the third round in 2018
- With a T9 at the Masters Tournament and T3 at the PGA Championship, is one of just three players (Brooks Koepka and Dustin Johnson) with a pair of top-10s in the first two major championships in 2019

#### Additional Player Notes

- Five-time Memorial Tournament champion **Tiger Woods** carded a final-round 5-under 67 to finish T9; most top-10 finishes at the Memorial (9/Jay Haas, Tiger Woods; 8/Tom Watson)
- Adam Scott finished solo-second in his 63<sup>rd</sup> start since his last PGA TOUR victory (2016 WGC-Mexico Championship); now has four top-10 finishes in 12 starts at the Memorial Tournament (T4/2006, T5/2007, T4/2014, 2/2019); was looking to match Steve Stricker (2012) for the most starts at the event before winning
- After holding the second- and third-round lead, **Martin Kaymer** posted a final-round even-par 72 to finish solo-third, his first top-10 finish since The Honda Classic in 2017 (T4); was in search of his fourth PGA TOUR victory and first in 62 starts since last winning the 2014 U.S. Open; was seeking to join Jack Nicklaus and Tiger Woods as the only players to win the U.S. Open, THE PLAYERS Championship and the Memorial Tournament
- **Kevin Streelman** (4<sup>th</sup>) closed with four birdies on his last five holes for a 6-under 66, marking his third top-10 finish in 11 starts at the event (T7/2011, T8/2016, 4/2019); now has 40 top-10s in 320 TOUR starts
- Australia's Marc Leishman (currently No. 1 in the Presidents Cup International Team standings) finished fifth his fourth top-15 finish in his last five starts at the event (T5/2015, T11/2016, T15/2017, T62/2018, 5/2019)
- 2014 champion **Hideki Matsuyama** finished sixth for his fourth top-15 finish in six starts at the Memorial Tournament (won/2014, T5/2015, T13/2018, 6/2019)
- **Jordan Spieth** finished T7 in his 45<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR start since his last victory at the 2017 Open Championship; following the PGA Championship (T3) and Charles Schwab Challenge (T8), posts three consecutive top-10s in the same season for the first time since 2017 (2<sup>nd</sup>/Dell Technologies Championship, T7/BMW Championship, T7/TOUR Championship)
- Despite a double bogey on the 72<sup>nd</sup> hole, 2017 champion **Jason Dufner** (T7) picked up his second top-10 at the event
- **Bud Cauley** (T9) earns his second top-10 finish (2018 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open/T10) of the season; in 2018, he missed the cut at the Memorial Tournament before suffering injuries in a car accident on Friday night, causing him to miss the remainder of the season
- After missing the cut in his last two starts at the Memorial Tournament, **Billy Horschel** (T9) finishes in the top 10 for the first time in six starts at Muirfield
- Reigning FedExCup champion and 2010 champion of the Memorial Tournament **Justin Rose** (13<sup>th</sup>) turns in his ninth top-15 finish in 13 appearances at Muirfield Village
- **Rickie Fowler** finished T14 as he sought his third-consecutive top-10 finish at the Memorial Tournament (T2/2017, T8/2018); additional runner-up finish came in his debut appearance at the event in 2010
- 2011 champion **Steve Stricker** (52 years, 3 months, 10 days) finished T22 as he sought to become the second oldest player to finish in the top 10 at the Memorial Tournament (Jack Nicklaus, 57)
- Defending champion **Bryson DeChambeau** (T22) was hoping to become just the second repeat winner at the Memorial Tournament (Tiger Woods won three in a row from 1999-2001)
- Jason Kokrak finished T62 as he made the cut this week for a PGA TOUR-leading 23<sup>rd</sup> consecutive time
