Things to know

- With the shift from four FedExCup Playoffs events to three, THE NORTHERN TRUST is more pivotal than ever in the race for the FedExCup, as only the top 70 will advance to the second Playoffs event
- Brooks Koepka enters the FedExCup Playoffs in the No. 1 position in the FedExCup standings
- Justin Rose enters the week at No. 11 in the standings in his attempt to become the first FedExCup champion to defend his title
- Two players played their way into THE NORTHERN TRUST following the Wyndham Championship: Patton Kizzire (No. 118 from No. 129) and Andrew Landry (No. 132 to No. 123)
- Pat Perez enters the week at No. 125 in the FedExCup standings
- Nine players have qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs in each season since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007: Charley Hoffman, Charles Howell III, Matt Kuchar, Phil Mickelson, Ryan Moore, Justin Rose, Adam Scott, Brandt Snedeker and Bubba Watson
- Tiger Woods is in search of PGA TOUR victory No. 82, which would tie Sam Snead for the most all-time; The last two times Liberty National hosted THE NORTHERN TRUST, Woods finished T2; Woods earned his fourth win in the FedExCup Playoffs at the 2018 TOUR Championship. Woods has never won THE NORTHERN TRUST in nine prior starts but holds the
- 2015 FedExCup champion Jordan Spieth enters No. 69 in the FedExCup standings; he missed the TOUR Championship in 2018 for the first time in his career
- Two events remain for players to move into the top eight in the Presidents Cup standings. After the top eight earn their spots on their respective teams following the BMW Championship on Sunday, August 18, International Team Captain Ernie Els and U.S. Team Captain Tiger Woods will have the opportunity to each make four additional Captains' selections following the conclusion of the World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions in November.

THE NORTHERN TRUST and the FedExCup

- New in 2019, the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings following THE NORTHERN TRUST will advance to the BMW Championship; when there were four Playoffs events, the top 100 moved on to the Dell Technologies Championship (120 in 2007 and 2008)
- Six players played their way into the next round of the Playoffs in 2018; full history of player movement can be found below
- For reference, since 2009, 73 players have entered the THE NORTHERN TRUST outside the top 70 in the FedExCup standings and moved inside
- Only Vijay Singh in 2008 has won THE NORTHERN TRUST and the FedExCup in the same season

- Bryson DeChambeau finished third in the final 2017-18 FedExCup standings following his win
- Each of the last four winners of the event entered the week in the top 10 of the FedExCup standings

- Bryson DeChambeau picked up his third PGA TOUR victory and would go on to win the following FedExCup Playoffs event, the Dell Technologies Championship
- DeChambeau took over the No. 1 spot in the FedExCup standings
- Six players played their way into the Dell Technologies Championship

Player notes - Top three in the FedExCup standings

No. 1 Brooks Koepka

- Took the lead in the FedExCup standings for the first time in his career following The Open Championship (T4)
- Earned third win of the season and first World Golf Championships title at the WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational (other wins: THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES, PGA Championship)
- First three-win season of his career and only player with three wins in the 2018-19 season
- Won the top spot in the Wyndham Rewards Top 10 by finishing the Regular Season No. 1 in the FedExCup standings
- Has two career top-10s in 15 starts in the FedExCup Playoffs (6th/2017 TOUR Championship, T8/2018 THE NORTHERN TRUST)
- Has advanced to the TOUR Championship three times highlighted by ninth-place result in the FedExCup in 2017-18

No. 2 Rory McIlroy

- Leads the PGA TOUR in top-10s (12) and Scoring Average (69.090)
- Two wins during the 2018-19 season (THE PLAYERS Championship, RBC Canadian Open)
- Four career wins in the FedExCup Playoffs, tied with Dustin Johnson and Tiger Woods for the most all-time (2012 Dell Technologies Championship, 2012 BMW Championship, 2016 Dell Technologies Championship, 2016 TOUR Championship)
- THE NORTHERN TRUST is the only FedExCup Playoffs event that he has not won; best result: T19/2013
- 2016 FedExCup Champion

No. 3 Matt Kuchar

- 2010 THE NORTHERN TRUST Champion
- Two-time winner during the 2018-19 season (Mayakoba Golf Classic, Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Held the lead in the FedExCup standings for a 16-week stretch during the Regular Season, the longest streak this season
- Missed the TOUR Championship in 2018 for the first time since 2009
