Things to Know

- Rory McIlroy joined Tiger Woods and Henrik Stenson as the only players to win at least one FedExCup, THE PLAYERS, a major and a World Golf Championships event
- Jim Furyk (67) birdied two of his last three holes to secure his second runner-up finish at THE PLAYERS and 31st in his PGA TOUR career
- Dustin Johnson became the first player since Steve Elkington in 1997 to record all four rounds in the 60s at THE PLAYERS; posted his first career top-10 at THE PLAYERS in his 11th appearance
- Jhonattan Vegas shot a bogey-free 66 and holed the longest putt in at No. 17 tournament history (69 feet, 7 inches)
- The 2019 tournament had three holes-in-ones, the most since 2006 (4)

- Wins 15th PGA TOUR title in 156th start at age 29 years, 10 months, 14 days. Most recent title came at the 2018 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, nearly one year ago on March 18, 2018
- Began the week at No. 11 in the FedExCup standings and moved to No. 1 for the first time since winning the 2016 FedExCup.
- Moves to No. 4 in the Official World Golf Ranking, his best position since August 27, 2017
- Began the final round one stroke back of 54-hole leader Jon Rahm; marks eighth come-from-behind victory in a PGA TOUR stroke-play event, including the fourth consecutive
- First player from Northern Ireland to win THE PLAYERS and 15th international champion
- Becomes the third player to win at least one FedExCup, THE PLAYERS, a major and a World Golf Championships event joining Tiger Woods and Henrik Stenson
- McIlroy has won PGA TOUR events at three Pete Dye courses:
 - o 2012 PGA Championship The Ocean Course at Kiawah Island
 - 2012 BMW Championship Crooked Stick Golf Club
 - 2019 PLAYERS Championship THE PLAYERS Stadium Course at TPC Sawgrass

- Marks his sixth consecutive top-10 on the PGA TOUR, which bests his previous streak of five in 2015: THE PLAYERS Championship (win), Arnold Palmer Invitational (T6), WGC-Mexico Championship (2), Genesis Open (T4), Farmers Insurance Open (T5), Sentry Tournament of Championship (T4)
- Led the field in par-3 scoring average (2.69); finished at 5-under for the week
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (13.262); finished second in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (5.309) behind Tommy Fleetwood

Jim Furyk (2nd/-15)

- One of eight players with two runner-up finishes at THE PLAYERS (2014); fifth top-10 in 23 career appearances
- Earned his 31st career runner-up finish on the PGA TOUR and sits tied for second in total runner-up finishes among active players:
 - o Phil Mickelson 36
 - Tiger Woods 31
 - Jim Furyk 31
 - Davis Love III 30
 - Vijay Singh 28
- Finished T9 at The Honda Classic to earn enough FedExCup points to qualify for THE PLAYERS, one of the last three players in the field
- First back-to-back top-10s since 2016 (Travelers Championships/T5, Wyndham Championship/T10)
- One of 24 players in the 2019 field who played THE PLAYERS when it was held in March; he was one of 11 to make it to Sunday
- Was looking to become first the Ponte Vedra Beach resident to win THE PLAYERS since Fred Funk (2005); would have surpassed Funk as oldest champ in tournament history at age 48 years, 10 months, 5 days

Eddie Pepperell (T3/-14)

- Holed five birdies on the back nine for a 66 after beginning the final round seven strokes back
- T3 finish marks the best result among 22 first-time participants at THE PLAYERS
- Was looking to become the third player to win THE PLAYERS in his first appearance, not including the inaugural event (Hal Sutton/1983, Craig Perks/2002)
- Best finish in nine career PGA TOUR starts; previous best: T6/2018 Open Championship

Jhonattan Vegas (T3/-14)

- Final-round 66 was one of two bogey-free final rounds (J.T. Poston)
- Set the record for the longest putt made at No. 17 (69 feet, 7 inches), surpassing Bernhard Langer's putt from 59 feet, 9 inches in 2008/R2
- Marks second top-10 in seven starts at THE PLAYERS (T7/2012)
- Second top-10 in 11 starts this season (T10/Waste Management Phoenix Open)
- Tied his best score at TPC Sawgrass in 24 total rounds (2015/R3)

Miscellaneous notes

- Holding the 54-hole lead for the first time of his PGA TOUR career, **Jon Rahm** carded a 4-over 76 to finish T12; 2006 champion **Stephen Ames** remains the last 54-hole leader to shoot a final round in the 60s
- It took 11 starts at THE PLAYERS Championship for World No. 1 **Dustin Johnson** to record his first top-10 (T5). Johnson (69-68-69-69) became the first player since **Steve Elkington** in 1997 to record all four rounds in the 60s at THE PLAYERS.
- First-time participant Abraham Ancer and Brandt Snedeker led the field in birdies with 23
- Two-time PLAYERS champion **Tiger Woods** recorded his first sub-70 round of the week a final-round 69 to finish T30; he did not have a three-putt this week
- After opening with a 2-over 74 (T104), 2018 FedExCup champion Justin Rose posted rounds of 66-68-68 to get to 12-under 276 (T8).
- Sergio Garcia (24) and Adam Scott (23) have the most rounds in the 60s in THE PLAYERS history
- Defending champion Webb Simpson carded rounds of 70-70-70-68 to finish T16
- Highest score at No. 17 this week was a quadruple-bogey 7 made by three players (Sam Ryder/R1, Paul Casey/R1, Tiger Woods/R2)
