Things To Know

- This season's TOUR Championship is weighted by FedExCup Starting Strokes. The FedExCup leader heading into East Lake began at 10-under, second place at 8-under, third 7-under, fourth 6-under and fifth at 5-under. Players ranked Nos. 6-10 started at 4-under, 11-15 at 3-under, 16-20 at 2-under, 21-25 at 1-under and 26-30 at even par
- Brooks Koepka birdied No. 18 to claim seventh career 54-hole lead/co-lead
- Rory McIlroy and Brooks Koepka will play together for the seventh time on the PGA TOUR; first time in the final round since 2019 World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational
- Should Brooks Koepka win the FedExCup, he would join Tiger Woods (2007) as only the two players to win a major, World Golf Championships and FedExCup in the same season
- The last three final round pairings have a combined 45 career PGA TOUR wins (Koepka/McIlroy; Schauffele/Casey; Thomas/Matsuyama)

Third-Round Lead Notes

- 20 of 32 third-round leaders/co-leaders have converted for the win at the TOUR Championship (most recent: Tiger Woods/2018)
- 25 of 42 third-round leaders/co-leaders have converted for the win on PGA TOUR in 2018-19 (most recent: Justin Thomas/BMW Championship)

Birdied his last hole to claim solo possession of the lead

- In six prior tries holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead, Koepka has converted four times for the win (most recent: 2019 PGA Championship)
- Through 54 holes, has hit 23 of 42 fairways in regulation (ranked T14)
- Has shot par or better in his last 15 rounds this season
- If he were to win the FedExCup, would join Tiger Woods (2007) as the only two players to win a major, World Golf
 Championships and FedExCup in the same season (Tiger Woods/2007: PGA Championship, WGC-Mexico Championship,
 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational)
- Seeks his eighth career PGA TOUR victory and first in the FedExCup Playoffs
- Making fourth start in the TOUR Championship (T26/2018, 6th/2017, T18/2015)
- Best career finish in the FedExCup, ninth, came last season

Rory McIlroy

- Led the field in driving accuracy (12 of 14 fairways) in round three
- Leads the field in Driving Distance (316.5) through 54 holes
- The 2016 FedExCup and TOUR Championship winner is one stroke back in his bid to join Tiger Woods as the second player to win the FedExCup more than once
- No player has ever won THE PLAYERS Championship and the FedExCup in the same season
- Through 54 holes in 2016, was two strokes off the lead at 6-under 204
- Has finished inside the top 10 in four of five starts at East Lake (1st/2016, T2/2014, T7/2018, T10/2012)
- Claimed his 15th and 16th PGA TOUR victories earlier this season at THE PLAYERS Championship and RBC Canadian Open

Xander Schauffele

- Hole-in-one on the par-3 ninth (used a 5-iron from 240 yards) was his first-ever hole-in-one; marked the second ace of the week, third in tournament history at East Lake and fifth overall
- Through 54 holes, leads the field in Strokes Gained: Approach The Green (+6.898)
- The 2017 TOUR Championship winner has shot under par in 14 of 15 career rounds at East Lake Golf Club
- Has reached the TOUR Championship in his first three seasons on the PGA TOUR; only rookie to win at East Lake (2017)
- Seeks third win of the season (World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions, Sentry Tournament of Champions) and fifth career PGA TOUR victory

Miscellaneous Player Notes

- First-round co-leader and 2017 FedExCup champion **Justin Thomas** finished with a 1-over 71 and moved to 11-under par (T4); second over-par score in 19 career rounds at East Lake
- Making his sixth start at the TOUR Championship, where he owns four top-5 finishes, **Paul Casey** posted 2-under 68 to move to 11-under (T4). He began the week at 2-under (T16).
- Making his sixth start at the TOUR Championship, **Hideki Matsuyama** finished with three birdies to post a 4-under 66 to move to 6-under (T6). He began the week at 3-under (T11).
- 2018 FedExCup champion **Justin Rose** is T25 and 16 strokes behind the leaders in his bid to become the first player to successfully defend as FedExCup champion
- Of the 30 players in the field, only 11 managed to break par in round three; no bogey-free rounds after completion of round three

Rookies in the FedExCup Playoffs
