Things to Know

- Chez Reavie converts largest 54-hole lead in Travelers Championship history into first victory in nearly 11 years
- Reavie's win comes 250 starts and 3,983 days since his first TOUR victory at the 2008 RBC Canadian Open
- Keegan Bradley narrowed gap to a stroke before taking a double bogey at No. 17
- Paul Casey claims fourth top-5 finish in fifth Travelers Championship start
- Defending Travelers Championship winner Bubba Watson shoots final-round 71, finishes T54
- Last week's U.S. Open runner-up Brooks Koepka posts over-par scores on the weekend, settles for T57

Best 2018-19 results: 1st/Travelers Championship, T3/2019 U.S. Open, T3/2019 Sony Open in Hawaii, T4/2019 Waste Management Phoenix Open, T7/2018 THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES)

- On the heels of a T3 finish at the U.S. Open, posted a 1-under 69 in the final round to hold off a hard-charging Keegan Bradley and claim his second career PGA TOUR victory, by four strokes, in his 278th PGA TOUR start at the age of 37 years, 7 months, 11 days
- Travelers Championship win comes 250 starts and 3,983 days since winning the 2008 RBC Canadian Open. By comparison, the longest time between a first and second win on the PGA TOUR since 1900 is 6,860 days (Francis Ouimet). Reavie ranks 11th on that list
- With the win, collects 500 FedExCup points and moves from No. 35 to 12th with 1,272 points. It took 377 points to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs in 2018, 809 for the BMW Championship and 1,432 for the TOUR Championship
- Since 2007, all 12 winners of the Travelers Championship have advanced to the FedExCup Playoffs, with nine advancing to the TOUR Championship
- Steady progression in the FedExCup since returning to the PGA TOUR after wrist surgery: 2014-15 (No. 166), 2015-16 (No. 81), 2016-17 (No. 39), 2017-18 (No. 34), 2018-19 (No. 12)

- With the win, is fully exempt through the 2020-21 season
- Among the 2019-20 fields in which he earns a spot are the Sentry Tournament of Champions, PLAYERS Championship and Masters Tournament
- Earns 1,000 points towards making the 2019 U.S. Presidents Cup team, placing him inside the top 15
- Becomes just the seventh player since 2000 to convert a 54-hole lead/co-lead into victory at the Travelers Championship and first since Jordan Spieth in 2017
- Becomes the 19th player on the PGA TOUR this season to convert a 54-hole lead/co-lead into victory
- 16-under 194 through three rounds fell one shy of the 54-hole record at the Travelers Championship (Tim Norris/1982, Mark Calcavecchia/2000)
- Took just three bogeys this week (par-4 fourth in round one, par-5 sixth in round three, par-3 eighth in round four)
- Scoring breakdown for the week: front nine (5-under), back nine (12-under)
- Had never finished better than T11 (2012) in eight previous starts at Travelers Championship

Keegan Bradley (T2/-13)

- Narrowed a six-stroke deficit to within one through 16 holes, before a double bogey at No. 17 met by a Reavie birdie resulted in a T2 finish, four strokes back
- The T2 finish marks his sixth runner-up finish on the PGA TOUR
- Was in search of his fifth career PGA TOUR victory and first since the 2018 BMW Championship in the FedExCup Playoffs
- Has come from behind in the final round en route to each of his four victories
- Claims his second top-10 finish in ninth start at the Travelers Championship (T8/2017)
- Now has three top-10 finishes in 20 previous starts this season (*T2/Travelers Championship*, 6th/2018 WGC-HSBC Champions, T10/2019 WGC-Mexico Championship)
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (+9.848)

Zack Sucher (T2/-13)

- Playing on a sponsor invitation, 18-hole co-leader and 36-hole leader birdied four of his last six holes to close with a 3-under 67 and finish T2 at 13-under 267
- Entered 2018-19 PGA TOUR season playing on a Major Medical Extension with six events available to earn 347 FedExCup points. In three PGA TOUR starts this season, had earned just 25 FedExCup points, before collecting 245 points for T2 finish this week, bringing his total to 270. Requires 77 points in two remaining starts to satisfy Medical Extension
- Went 13 months in 2017-18 without hitting a golf shot while recovering from surgery on his left knee and ankle. 2017 Travelers Championship was his last PGA TOUR event before taking Major Medical Extension for surgery
- Missed the cut at both previous appearances at Travelers Championship (2015/70-72, 2017/74-69)

Additional Notes

- En route to a solo-fourth result, **Vaughn Taylor** birdied his last five holes to post a 5-under 65 and finish 12-under 268. It marks his best showing since winning the 2016 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am. Played the front nine at TPC River Highlands in even-par for week and the back nine in 12-under par
- Paul Casey played his last six holes in 4-under par, highlighted by an eagle-2 at No. 15, to shoot 5-under 65 and finish T5 at 11-under 269. The finish marked his fourth top-5 showing in the event (2nd/2015, T17/2016, T5/2017, T2/2018, T5/2019)
- First-year PGA TOUR member **Joaquin Niemann** posted four rounds in the 60s to finish T5 at 11-under 269 in his first Travelers Championship. The T5 finish ties his best of six top-10s in 36 TOUR starts (2018 A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier)
- **Abraham Ancer** birdied five of his last eight holes to shoot 63 and tie the week's low score. Finished T8 at 10-under 270, good for his third top-10 finish of the season
- Defending champion and three-time Travelers Championship winner **Bubba Watson** posted over-par scores on the weekend (73-71) to finish T54 at 1-under 279
- Coming off last week's runner-up finish at the U.S. Open, Brooks Koepka finished T57 at even-par 280
- Four unrestricted sponsor exemptions: Viktor Hovland (T54/-1), Collin Morikawa (T36/-4), Matthew Wolff (MDF), Justin Suh (MC). Since 2009, six players have advanced to the weekend while making their professional TOUR debut at Travelers Championship (Kyle Stanley/2009/T19, Morgan Hoffmann/2011/T43, Patrick Rodgers/2014/T46, Nick Hardy/2018/T61, Hovland/2019/T54, Wolff/2019/MDF)
