Things to Know

- Si Woo Kim aced No. 16 en route to his second 36-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR; eyes the PGA TOUR's first wire-to-wire win of the season
- Kim's four-stroke lead is the largest after 36 holes on TOUR this season
- 2015 Valero Texas Open champion Jordan Spieth and Rickie Fowler headline a group of players in second place
- Notable players to miss the cut: defending champion Andrew Landry (71-74), Billy Horschel, Davis Love III, Smylie Kaufman, Luke Donald

• At 12-under 132, tops the 36-hole record at the Valero Texas Open by two strokes (since the event moved to TPC San Antonio in 2010); previous mark held by Ben Curtis (2012) and Brendan Steele (2016)



- Following second-consecutive 6-under 66, in search of the PGA TOUR's first wire-to-wire win since Brandt Snedeker won the 2018 Wyndham Championship
- Aced the par-3 16th hole with a 9-iron from 167 yards (only other ace on the PGA TOUR came at the 2016 Travelers Championship)
- Two players have recorded aces en route to winning this season: J.B. Holmes (Genesis Open), Francesco Molinari (Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)
- Four-shot lead the largest 36-hole lead on TOUR since the 2018 U.S. Open (Dustin Johnson/4 strokes)
- Now has the largest 36-hole lead this season; previous benchmark was 3 strokes (five players, most recently Justin Rose at the Farmers Insurance Open)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (5.847)
- Takes his second 36-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR (2016 Wyndham Championship/won)
- Making his fourth consecutive start at the Valero Texas Open: T45/2018, T22/2017, MC/2016
- Season highlighted by three top-10 finishes: 3rd/Genesis Open, T4/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T10/CIMB Classic
- In search of his third career PGA TOUR win and first since the 2017 PLAYERS Championship

Miscellaneous Notes

- 11-time PGA TOUR winner Jordan Spieth (T2) owns matching 4-under 68s in his fifth start at the Valero Texas Open (T41/2012, MC/2013, 10/2014, 2/2015); recorded two hole outs from off the green, one for eagle on the par-5 eighth hole (113 yards) and another for birdie on the par-4 11th hole (69'8"); in search of his first top-10 on the PGA TOUR since the 2018 Open Championship (T9)
- Despite back-to-back bogeys on Nos. 15 and 16, Rickie Fowler (who made 127' of putts Friday) posted a 68 to move to T2; seeking to become the first player to win the Valero Texas Open in his first start since Ben Curtis (2012)
- Corey Conners fired a 5-under 67 to move to T2; hoping to become the first Monday Qualifier to win on the PGA TOUR since Arjun Atwal won the 2010 Wyndham Championship
- Harold Varner III (T2) had six top-25 finishes in his first eight starts this season, but has three missed cuts, a T51 at The Honda Classic and T65 at the Valspar Championship in his last five starts
- Adam Schenk (T2) had six birdies in a nine-hole stretch (Nos. 12, 14, 15, 17, 18, 2) for a 5-under 66, two shy of his
 career-low round on the PGA TOUR (64/2018 RBC Canadian Open/R1); marked his first score in the 60s in five
 rounds at TPC San Antonio
- Despite a bogey on his final hole (No. 9), Kyoung-Hoon Lee's 5-under 67 moved him to T2; in 17 previous PGA TOUR starts, has one top-10 finish (T7/2019 The Honda Classic)
- Graeme McDowell, winner of last week's Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship, stands T15 as he seeks
 to become the first player since Bryson DeChambeau to win back-to-back weeks (2018 THE NORTHERN TRUST,
 2018 Dell Technologies Championship); the last player to win back-to-back starts was Xander Schauffele (2018
 World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions, 2019 Sentry Tournament of Champions)
- Playing in the last group of the day, University of Texas graduate Dylan Frittelli's eagle (6'10") and Oklahoma
 State University graduate Kristoffer Ventura's birdie (15'7") helped both players make the cut on the number
- Smylie Kaufman (71-73) missed the cut in his first start since withdrawing from last season's A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier
- Julian Etulain withdrew during the round with a wrist injury
