TOURNAMENT HISTORY

The Copperheads' history of sponsoring professional competitions began in 1977 with a mixed-team event pairing PGA TOUR and LPGA pros together. In 2000, Tampa Bay earned a spot on the official PGA TOUR schedule. The tournament gained further prestige in 2007 when it moved from the fall and joined the Florida Swing of the FedExCup championship season in March.



The final group in 2010 - Two-time winners K.J.Choi and Retief Goosen were paired with Jim Furyk who joined them as a tournament champion with a final round 69.

2018 VALSPAR CHAMPIONSHIP SMASHED RECORDS

The 2018 Valspar Championship, featuring the name of Tiger Woods high on a leaderboard for the first time in several years, set attendance records for the event and was one of the most-watched PGA TOUR events in recent years.

Tournament attendance for the week was up to 150,000, from 112,000 in 2017.

The tournament's coverage on NBC and Golf Channel was the highest-rated for a PGA TOUR event since 2013.

The following from Darren Rovell of ESPN.com summarized the impact:

With Tiger Woods looking to be on the cusp of winning his first PGA TOUR tournament in more than 4 1/2 years, media coverage soared this weekend.

Woods finished tied for second at the Valspar Championship, but the Tiger Effect meant that Woods received 4 1/2 times the amount of media coverage from Thursday through Monday morning than any of the winners of the four previous tournaments. The comparison is based on stories done on the champions, according to Eric Smallwood of Apex Marketing Group, a sponsorship evaluation and media tracking company.

In fact, Smallwood said Woods received 12 percent more exposure than the four previous winning golfers combined and three times more

exposure than Valspar winner Paul Casey. The four previous winners includes Phil Mickelson, as well as Ted Potter Jr., Bubba Watson and Justin Thomas.

"When Tiger is at the top of the leaderboard in a tournament, the sports content he provides increases the viewership and attention that the media outlets crave and thrive off of," Smallwood said. "This makes him an anomaly in sports and has made him a 'must watch' when he plays."

Third-round coverage on Saturday of the event by NBC delivered a 3.26 overnight rating, the highest third round on any broadcast network since the 2006 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational. The final round had a 5.1 overnight rating on NBC, the highest non-major PGA TOUR broadcast since the 2013 PLAYERS Championship.

And those who didn't watch on TV got their fix elsewhere. On Saturday, nearly 5.5 million minutes were streamed on Golf Channel and NBC Sports digital networks,

up more than 600 percent compared to the Saturday of the same event last year. The Valspar saw 27.2 million minutes streamed across Golf Channel / NBC Sports' digital platforms, which made it the most-streamed PGA TOUR event ever for the network, according to Adobe Analytics.

"We have so many people and things to be thankful for," says Tournament Director Tracy West. "First, to the golf fans of the Tampa Bay area. They came out in great numbers, they understood the situation and they were respectful and supportive of all the golfers. We had a lot of challenges to get ready for so many more patrons and our tournament staff and volunteers did a great job. We think our operations got better every day and from what we hear the vast majority of our fans had a great time. The result of all of it should be a substantial improvement in our final amount of money generated for charity which we will announce in a couple of months."

CASEY RALLIES TO EDGE WOODS AND REED

Paul Casey, winner of 13 European Tour events and a three-time Ryder Cup participant, shot a final round 65 to climb back from five shots off the pace and win the 2018 Valspar Championship. His 274 total of 10 under par was one ahead of Tiger Woods and Patrick Reed. The victory vaulted Casey to 12th in the Official World Golf Rankings.

"It just was a great week," said the 40-year-old Englishman afterwards. "The buzz, everything about it, the roars, the course. I loved it. As soon as I turned up (here this week), I had a good feeling and obviously I'll be back next year. But it is one tournament I now will probably have on the schedule forever."

Casey finished early and watched from the locker room as Woods came up one putt short of forcing a playoff. It was the closest Woods has come to winning in nearly five years. After the first hole, Woods went 15 holes without a birdie until he made a birdie putt from just inside 45 feet at the par-3 17th, leaving him one shot behind with one hole to play.

Woods played conservatively with an iron off the 442-yard, uphill 18th. From 185 yards, his approach came up some 40 feet short, and his birdie putt to force a playoff was two feet short. He closed with a 70 — the first time since The Barclays in 2013 that he posted all four rounds under par on the PGA TOUR — and tied for second. That was his best finish since he tied for second at that Barclays tournament.

"I keep getting a little bit better," Woods said. "I had a good shot at winning this golf tournament. A couple putts here and there, it could have been a different story."

Casey had three straight birdies early on the back nine to take the lead, and he closed with four par saves to post at 10-under 274. When no one caught him, he had his second PGA TOUR title and his first since the Houston Open in 2009. Casey had gone 132 starts on the PGA TOUR since winning in Houston, though he had won five times worldwide, including the European Tour's flagship event at the BMW PGA Championship.

Corey Connors, the Canadian rookie who started the final round with a one-shot lead, fell back quickly after opening with a bogey. He shot 77 and tied for 16th.

CANADA'S HADWIN CLAIMS FIRST PGA TOUR WIN

Continuing a breakthrough 2017 season that had previously included a rare 59, Adam Hadwin won his first PGA TOUR event at the 2017 Valspar Championship. The 29-year-old Canadian survived a 16th hole double bogey, to win by one stroke over Patrick Cantlay.

Hadwin held a 4-shot lead going into the final round and still led by two shots over Cantlay with three holes to play despite the latter's barrage of five birdies in a six-hole stretch. However, Hadwin's drive at 16 wandered right into the water for the six that tied things up. After mutual pars at 17, the final pairing went to 18 tied at 14 under.

In a dramatic finish, Cantlay bogeyed after he was unable to get up-and-down from the right greenside bunker while Hadwin was able to make par from the back fringe with a skillful chip.

Hadwin had enjoyed a string of solid finishes throughout the season including runner up at the CareerBuilder Challenge. With the win, he earned an invite to his first Masters. He was married in the intervening three weeks, but postponed his honeymoon to play in Augusta.

Hadwin's winning total of 270 was the lowest for a Valspar Championship winner since Gary Woodland shot 269 in 2011. He is the fourth player to win his first PGA TOUR title on the Copperhead, although each of the other three (Carl Pettersson in 2005, Woodland in '11 and Kevin Streelman in '13) would win again.

He is the tournament's eighth international champion (the 10th total time with K.J. Choi and Retief Goosen winning twice) and the first from Canada. Hadwin is the 14th Canadian to win on the PGA TOUR.

The tournament enjoyed its largest crowds with an estimated attendance of 112,000 for the week. Saturday's activities, including a concert by Toby Keith, resulted in the first sellout in Valspar Championship history...2016 champion Charl Schwartzel conducted a spirited defense of his title, closing with 67-68 on the weekend to finish in 6th place at -9...Tony Finau had the best round of the final day, shooting 7-under 64 and finishing 5th...It was the eighth time in nine tournaments that the Valspar Championship has been decided by one shot or in a playoff. The exception was Kevin Streelman's two-shot win in 2013.

SCHWARTZEL COMES FROM 5 BACK TO WIN

Five years after his victory in the Masters, South Africa's Charl Schwartzel overcame a five-shot deficit to win the 2016 Valspar Championship. Spurred by birdies at the 13th (65 feet) and 17th (25 feet), he rallied to catch overnight leader Bill Haas in regulation with a 4-under 67, the best score of the final round. Haas had a two-shot lead with three holes to play but bogeyed the 16th as Schwartzel birdied 17. Then, Schwartzel won on the first playoff hole, the 18th, when he parred after Haas could not get up and down from a bunker. Coming up on five years since winning the Masters, Charl Schwartzel was starting to wonder if he would ever win again on American soil.

"I just needed to get over the hurdle of winning out here again," Schwartzel said. "And I think the way today played out with it being really difficult, you're grinding just to make pars and keep the ball in play. I just needed to put it together on the weekend when it counted."

Another big story of the week was amateur Lee McCoy, the 22-year-old senior from the University of Georgia who grew up near Innisbrook. Playing with the world's No. 1 player Jordan Spieth in the final round, he finished fourth, the best finish by an amateur in a PGA TOUR event of top players since 17-year-old Justin Rose tied for fourth at the British Open in 1998 at Royal Birkdale.

The winning total of 7-under-par was the highest score to par to win on the PGA TOUR since Spieth won the U.S. Open at 5 under... Schwartzel became the seventh Valspar winner in the last nine years to come from behind in the final round to win...the Schwartzel-Haas playoff marked the Valspar Championship's third playoff, and second consecutive. The first occurred in 2012 when Luke Donald defeated Jim Furyk, Robert Garrigus and Sangmoon Bae, while Jordan Spieth defeated Sean O'Hair and Patrick Reed in 2015... Schwartzel became the seventh international winner of the Valspar Championship, combining for nine wins.

SPIETH'S WORLD-CLASS SHORT GAME CLINCHES VICTORY

Jordan Spieth capped off an afternoon of back-nine charges, clutch putts and unseemly par saves by making a 30-foot birdie putt on the third extra hole of a playoff at Innisbrook Resort's Copperhead Course to beat Patrick Reed and Sean O'Hair. "A crazy back nine," said Spieth, who won for the second time in his PGA TOUR career and fourth time worldwide to reach a career-high No. 6 in the world.

The 21-year-old Spieth was three shots behind with six holes to play when he made two birdies to catch a faltering Ryan Moore, and then saved par on his final three holes for a 2-under 69 to join the playoff. And these par saves were not what anyone would call routine. With his right foot in the bunker and his left foot on grass well above the ball in the sand, he blasted out to 3 feet on the 16th. From deep rough on a hill, he hit a flop shot to a short pin to 6 feet to stay tied for the lead. And he holed a 12-foot par putt on the 18th that fell in the left side of the cup.

Reed was just as impressive with his short game to keep his hopes alive in the eighth and perhaps most compelling playoff on the PGA TOUR this season. He buried a 30-foot birdie putt on the 18th hole for a bogey-free 66, pumping his fist as if he were still in Gleneagles at the Ryder Cup. On the 18th hole in a playoff, he was buried in the lip of a bunker, blasted out to just under 10 feet and made par to stay in the game after Spieth missed from 10 feet. On the next playoff hole, the tough 16th, Reed had no chance well behind the green in grass so deep he could barely see his ball. That came out perfectly for another par. Reed, who went the final 29 holes without a bogey on the Copperhead Course, never had a chance to try for a third par save when Spieth hit the winner.

Not to be overlooked was O'Hair, who has had to earn his full PGA TOUR card the last two years in the Web.com Tour Finals. He poured in a pair of big birdies on the back nine, including a 30-footer on the 16th, and made a tough par save on the 18th in regulation. O'Hair had a 12-foot birdie putt for the win on the second extra hole, and the putt caught the right side of the cup.

Spieth earned a small measure of redemption against Reed, a friend and Ryder Cup partner. Reed beat him in a playoff at the Wyndham Championship in 2013 for the first of Reed's four PGA TOUR wins.

SENDEN SURVIVES SNAKE PIT WITH BIRDIES AT 16 AND 17

John Senden ended a seven-year victory drought on one of his favorite courses in the 2014 Valspar Championship presented by BB&T. A final afternoon of tight competition ended with a one-shot victory for the 42-year-old Australian whose final round 70 left him at 7 under par 277, just ahead of Kevin Na.

The big shot for Senden came on the 16th hole, the toughest on the course, when he chipped in for birdie from just off the green and 70 feet from the pin. He added another birdie on the 17th, this time with a more conventional 20 foot putt, then sealed the win with par at the last. He played the difficult Snake Pit holes in 2 under for the day and 3 under on the weekend.

The victory earned Senden a trip to Augusta for his third consecutive Masters and boosted him from 123rd in the Official World Golf Ranking to 60th. He began the tournament with indifferent rounds of 71-72, before shooting the lowest round of the tournament, a bogey-free 64 on Saturday. His 70 on Sunday was good enough on a windy day that elevated scores throughout the field. Senden finished at 7-under 277, the third straight tournament on the Florida swing won with a single-digit score under par.

- * Senden had finished 2nd on the Copperhead in 2007 and '08 (although he missed the cut in '13). He now ranks 3rd on the tournament's career money list with winnings of \$1,956,899.
- * It was the second time in four years that Garrigus finished in the top four. He was part of the four-man playoff won by Donald in '12.
- * The Copperhead played tough in '14 with Senden's winning score of 7 under par the second highest in tournament history (Sean O'Hair, 4 under in 2008). The average score for the tournament of 72.43 was also the second highest (72.97 in '08).

STREELMAN BREAKS THROUGH WITH BIRDIE-FREE WEEKEND

Kevin Streelman, a 34-year-old pro from the Chicago area, scored his first PGA TOUR victory in the 2013 event on the Copperhead with a 10-under-par 274, good for a two-shot victory over Boo Weekley.

After playing the first two rounds in even par, Streelman made 10 birdies and not a single bogey in the final two rounds. He jumped into the lead for good with a birdie on the 13th hole on Sunday and added another at the 17th, to assure he would remain ahead of Weekley who had finished a stellar 63 a few hours earlier.

"This is the culmination of a lot of hard work and a lot of time spent late into the evening, and getting up early in the morning," he said, recalling his travels on the mini-tours and his work at a country club. "And it's really a dream come true."

"Hopefully, we can do it again," Streelman added. "This is a lot of fun." While his second victory did not come in 2013, he did enjoy a stellar season that included three consecutive top 10s shortly thereafter, including a 2nd at the prestigious THE PLAYERS Championship. He ended up 13th in the season-long FedExCup competition while winning more than \$3 million.

Cameron Tringale had a 66 on Sunday to finish alone in third while Justin Leonard, who started the final round tied for the lead with Streelman, tied for fourth with defending champion Luke Donald (69) and Greg Chalmers (70).

The other big winner was Jordan Spieth, the 19-year-old from Texas who holed a 50-foot chip for birdie on the 17th hole on his way to a tie for seventh. That gave him enough money to earn special temporary membership on the PGA TOUR for the rest of the year. "It's nice to get the crowd excited on 17. That was one of the coolest shots I've ever hit. That was as loud as it gets. Hair on the back of your neck stands up."

The 34-year-old Streelman had the 14th consecutive win by an American in official PGA TOUR events, dating to Tommy Gainey at Sea Island last fall. Americans have won the first 12 events of the season, their best streak since winning 13 in a row in 1989.

DONALD WINS FOUR-MAN PLAYOFF

Holing a six-foot birdie on the first playoff putt after his rivals had missed, Luke Donald won the 2012 tournament in a four-man playoff, and in the process regained the top spot in the Official World Golf Ranking.

It was the only playoff in tournament history, and with four participants, the most crowded on the PGA TOUR in 2012. Donald was joined in the playoff by Jim Furyk, Robert Garrigus and Sang-Moon Bae - and was the only one to miss the fairway with his drive on the 18th hole which was used in the playoff. But his 7-iron from the rough was the closest to the pin and his putt was sure.

"That shot just came out perfectly," Donald said. "You never quite know out of the rough. Sometimes it comes out soft and sometimes it comes out a little hot. That one, just when it was in the air, looked good to me."

It was his fifth win in his last 31 starts around the world, and earned a tweet from Rory McIlroy whom he unseated, "Well I enjoyed it while it lasted! Congrats @LukeDonald! Impressive performance!"

Donald's win captured a wild Sunday that saw numerous other players challenge besides the four playoff competitors.

Ernie Els, needing a win to avoid missing the Masters for the first time in nearly 20 years, got to 14-under but missed a short birdie putt at 16 and then bogeyed 17 and 18 to fall one shot back. Ken Duke was another competitor who ended up one shot back after bogeying 17.

Donald started the final round three shots out of the lead, then swiftly moved into position with four birdies in a seven-hole stretch around the turn, showing off his polished iron play on a couple of those birdies.

Garrigus birdied the last two holes for a 64 and was the first to finish at 13-under 271, which turned out to be enough for the playoff. Bae, the South Korean with the fluid swing, made a 6-foot par putt on the final hole for a 68. Furyk had a 69 and was the last one to join the four-man playoff.

HOT PUTTER LEADS TO WOODLAND'S FIRST WIN

The only par of a wild back nine, courtesy of a testing 10-foot putt at the 18th hole, brought Gary Woodland his first PGA TOUR victory in the 2011 Transitions Championship. It capped a four-underpar 67 that otherwise included five birdies and three bogeys from the 10th hole on.

Woodland's win at 15 under par was only assured when Webb Simpson, playing in the next group, missed a similar par attempt a few minutes later.

Known for his prodigious length off the tee, Woodland's first triumph came courtesy of a conservative game plan and deft putting. He went 17-for-17 on putts under 20 feet in length in the final round.

Finishing third behind Woodland and Simpson was another young pro, Scott Stallings, who received a sponsor's exemption. By year's end, the trio would all be well known for other TOUR achievements.

Each tasted victory, with Woodland teaming with Matt Kuchar for a win in the WGC World Cup, Simpson taking two tourneys and finishing second in the final FedExCup standings and Stallings winning the Greenbrier Classic.

Some of the largest galleries in tournament history enjoyed an up-and-down four-day event that featured exceptional weather, relatively low scores and a different set of leaders each day.

Paul Casey had a 64 on Thursday for the first round advantage. Chris Couch and Garrett Willis shared the midway lead at 9 under, eight shots ahead of the 1-under cut which was the lowest in tournament history. After Saturday's third round it was Justin Rose with a oneshot advantage over Simpson and Brendon de Jonge. But it was Woodland who closed for the win from two shots off the pace.

FURYK'S WIN SERVES AS SPRINGBOARD TO PLAYER OF YEAR HONORS

A world-class player who had inexplicably lost his winning touch, Jim Furyk closed the deal after nearly three years out of the winner's circle to win the 2010 Transitions Championship by one shot over K.J. Choi.

The victory, the 14th of his distinguished career, seemed to jump start Furyk's 2010 season as he went on to win the Heritage Classic and TOUR Championship. The three wins made him the FedExCup champion and earned him the players' vote as the PGA TOUR Player of the Year.

His final round 69 was not without its moments of excitement down the stretch as he had to make a tough sand save on 17 and survive two wayward shots on 18 to take the win with a score of 13 under par 271.

"I made it difficult, there's no doubt," said Furyk, who also had to deal with a rain delay that saw the final hole played in the day's last light. "It seemed like every time K.J. got close ... I was able to bounce right back and hit some really good shots, make a bunch of birdies and get some more distance. And then as soon as I got the distance, I went back to making that same mistake again, or he played well."

Furyk started the final round with a three-shot lead, but Choi erased it with four birdies through six holes. The turning point for Furyk came at the par-3 eighth, when he rolled in a birdie and Choi missed the green and made bogey, a two-shot swing that Choi never made up.

GOOSEN TRIUMPHS FOR SECOND TIME

Retief Goosen shot a one-under-par 70 in the final round to win the first Transitions Championship by one shot with a score of 276. Along with his triumph in 2003, he joined K.J. Choi (2002 & 2006) as the only two-time winners on the Copperhead. It was the seventh PGA TOUR win of his career with the U.S. Open (2001 & '04) as the only other event he has won twice.

Goosen entered the final round one shot behind 49-year-old Tom Lehman, but Lehman made three bogeys on the front nine and fell to a tie for eighth with his total of 280.

Charlie Wi took the lead with a birdie at the 11th hole, but made three bogeys thereafter as Goosen, playing in the final group, took command of the tournament with an eagle at the 11th.

His lead fell to one ahead of Brett Quigley and Charles Howell III with a bogey at 16, but he made two clutch pars to finish out the victory.

Calcavecchia overcame an opening round 75 to win the tournament, with his big move coming on Saturday when he tied the Copperhead Course record with a sizzling 9-under-par 62.

On Sunday, Calcavecchia played steady golf after a birdie on the second hole. At one point his lead expanded to three shots, but it was down to just one over playing partner Slocum as they played the final hole. Calc missed a seven-foot par putt to give Slocum a chance to force a tie with a par, but Heath's four-foot attempt slid by the hole and Calcavecchia was the winner. NOTEWORTHY: Mark Calcavecchia's opening-round 75 was the highest start by a tournament winner since Jeff Sluman's 75 in the first round of the 1995 Tucson Chrysler Classic.

SINGH TOPS \$10 MILLION WITH RECORD WIN

Vijay Singh further established himself as the top player in the world in winning the second Chrysler Championship in record fashion on October 31, 2004. Firing a 6-under-par 65 in the final round, Singh pulled away from fellow competitor Tommy Armour III on the back nine for a five-shot win. His 72-hole score of 266 was a tournament record by one shot over K.J. Choi's total in 2002.

With the win Singh pocketed \$900,000 and became the first PGA TOUR golfer to win \$10 million in one season. It was his 9th victory of the year and the 24th of his career.

Singh was a major figure in the tournament from the opening round when he shot 65, although the Thursday lead belonged to Jeff Sluman who shot a course-record 9-under 62. Singh moved into the lead in the 3rd round with a 67, one ahead of Armour. He furthered his advantage with birdies on the first two holes Sunday and carried a 3-shot advantage into the final hole. He ended the tournament with a flourish making birdie, while Armour took bogey to fall into a second-place tie with Jesper Parnevik.

GOOSEN CRUISES TO WIN

Retief Goosen, the 10th-ranked player in the world coming into the event, vaulted into the top 10 on the 2003 PGA TOUR Money List with a three-shot victory on November 1, 2003 in the first Chrysler Championship. Goosen matched TOUR money leader Vijay Singh, who finished second, with a final round 1-under par 70 to finish at 12-under 272.

Singh closed to within one shot of Goosen after 12 holes, but Goosen birdied the 13th and 14th holes while Singh parred to build back his lead to three. Goosen won \$864,000 for his efforts while Singh banked \$518,400. Singh widened his lead on the Money List to \$768,494 and went on to clinch his first money title the following week at the TOUR Championship.

The victory was the third for Goosen on the PGA TOUR and his 19th worldwide. Three of the top eight finishers in the tournament rank in the top 10 of the Official World Golf Ranking - Singh 2nd, Davis Love III 4th and Goosen 10th.

THE VALSPAR CHAMPIONSHIP AND THE COPPERHEADS

A HISTORY OF GOLF & GIVING



THE COPPERHEADS - PROFESSIONAL GOLF SINCE 1977

The 2019 Valspar Championship marks 43 years in which the Copperheads have presented professional golf to the Tampa Bay area.

THE BEGINNING

The organization now known as the Copperheads began as an effort to acquire professional golf by the government of Pinellas County. The St. Petersburg Open on the PGA TOUR had ended in 1964 and the Pinellas Chamber of Commerce was looking to bring professional golf back to the area. A young county employee named Dick Dailey successfully enlisted the support of Jack Lake, the publisher of the St. Petersburg Times, and Jim Dowdle, the general manager of WTOG-TV, in the effort.

They were among those who formed The Founder's Club, the forerunner to the Copperheads, and successfully persuaded the Pepsi Mixed Team Championship to move from Doral Country Club in Miami to Bardmoor Country Club in Largo. The St. Petersburg Times reported on the first tournament:

Dec. 4, 1977: For the first time in 13 years, since the last St. Petersburg Invitational, the stars of the PGA TOUR returned to Tampa Bay, none with more of a flourish than 1976 U.S. Open winner Jerry Pate and 1977 U.S. Women's Open champion Hollis Stacy. They captured the Pepsi Mixed Team Championship (which later became the JCPenney Classic), born a year earlier in Miami, by one stroke over Curtis Strange and Nancy Lopez.

TWO KINDS OF TOURNAMENTS

The first 23 tournaments sponsored by the Copperheads were mixed team events of PGA TOUR and LPGA pros, usually held the week after Thanksgiving. The JCPenney Company took over the sponsorship in 1978 and forged a strong relationship with the Copperheads through the final event in 1999.

The Copperheads then turned to the PGA TOUR. The first two tournaments in 2000 and 2002 were "opposite" events played against World Golf Championship events. In 2003, the tournament moved to October as the final full field event of the year. Then in 2007, the Copperheads fulfilled a dream by taking their current spot on the Florida Swing in March. The 2019 Valspar Championship marks the organization's 19th PGA TOUR event, not including the 2001 event

which was cancelled.

2001

The field was gathered at Innisbrook for the Tampa Bay Classic when the tragic events of Tuesday, September 11, 2001 occurred. The tournament was subsequently cancelled, meaning that although this is the 43rd year for the Copperheads, the 2019 Valspar Championship is the 42nd event.

HALL OF FAMERS

More than 30 members of the World Golf Hall of Fame, including Arnold Palmer, Annika Sorenstam, Nick Faldo, Nancy Lopez, Curtis Strange, Beth Daniel, Phil Mickelson, Nick Price, Juli Inkster, Davis Love III, Meg Mallon, Laura Davies and Fred Couples have played in events sponsored by the Copperheads. Tiger Woods, future Hall of Famer, played in the 1996 JCPenney Classic and the 2018 Valspar Championship.

A HISTORY OF EXCELLENCE

Sixteen men have won PGA TOUR events sponsored by the Copperheads - and among them a winner of each Major Championship is represented. Vijay Singh, Charl Schwartzel and Jordan Spieth have The Masters; Spieth, Retief Goosen (twice) and Jim Furyk have claimed the U.S. Open; Mark Calcavecchia and Spieth won the British Open and Singh has two TOUR Championship victories. THE PLAYERS Championship, is also represented with K.J. Choi winning in 2011.

Winners of the JCPenney Classic also know their way to the victory ceremony at the Majors. Davis Love III, Jerry Pate, John Mahaffey and John Daly claimed PGA Championship titles (with Daly adding a British Open), Fred Couples won The Masters and Tom Kite and Curtis Strange are U.S. Open champions.

On the LPGA side, Laura Davies, Meg Mallon, Donna Andrews, Beth Daniel, Pat Bradley, Nancy Lopez, Juli Inkster, Hollis Stacy, Jan Stephenson, JoAnne Carner and Dottie Pepper have 36 Women's Majors among them.

Three PGA TOUR winners on the Copperhead have gone on later in that year to claim PGA TOUR Player of the Year honors - Spieth in 2015, Singh in 2004 and Furyk in 2010.

ARNOLD PALMER

The King played in four JCPenney Classics, the first in 1977 and the last in 1994. Look inside the Copperhead Clubhouse for an iconic picture of Palmer's last tee shot at Innisbrook.

PADRAIG HARRINGTON

The popular Irish star liked the Copperhead so much from watching on TV, he said he had to play it. He was 8th in his first try in 2010 - then set the course record with an opening round 61 in '12.

PGA TOUR EVENT TWO-TIMERS

Retief Goosen (2003 & '09) and K.J. Choi ('02 & '06) are the only two pros to win PGA TOUR events twice on the Copperhead. They were in contention for a third in '10, playing in the final group, but it was Jim Furyk who won. Not surprisingly, Goosen has won the most money on the Copperhead at \$2.372 million followed closely by Choi.

DAVIS LOVE III AND BETH DANIEL

These two Carolinians formed a mighty team, winning the first tournament on the Copperhead, the 1990 JCPenney Classic. Then, five years later they did it again. They also had a 2nd in '92.

LOCAL HERO HUSTON

The first full-field PGA TOUR event on the Copperhead tee off on October 19, 2000 with Mike Hulbert's opening round 64 setting the first PGA TOUR Tournament course record. By Sunday, local hero John Huston, a graduate of nearby Dunedin High School, was the first tournament winner. He closed with a blistering 65 to win by 3 shots.

Huston also teamed with another local, Amy Benz, to win the 1988 JCPenney Classic at Bardmoor. He is the only player to win in both the mixed team event and on the PGA TOUR in an event organized by the Copperheads.

PLAYOFFS

The playoff won by Charl Schwartzel in 2016 over Bill Haas was the eighth in an event organized by the Copperheads. The other two in PGA TOUR events came in 2012 as Luke Donald won a 4-way playoff with Jim Furyk, Robert Garrigus and Sang-Moon Bae and 2015 as Jordan Spieth beat Patrick Reed and Sean O'Hair.

In the last JCPenney Classic in 1999, John Daly and Laura Davies outlasted Paul Azinger and Se Ri Pak in the fifth mixed team playoff.

NUMBER 1

With his dramatic win in 2012, Luke Donald became the first winner on the Copperhead to move to the top spot in the Official World Golf Ranking by virtue of his victory.

In '04, Vijay Singh entered and left the tournament as the World #1.

Jordan Spieth became the OWGR's number one player later in the year he won the 2015 Valspar Championship. His victory advanced him to sixth at the time.

\$10 MILLION MAN

One of the greatest individual years in golf history had a storied landmark at Innisbrook. In the final regular PGA TOUR event of the season, Vijay Singh became the first golfer ever to win \$10 million in a season with a dominating win in the 2004 Chrysler Championship. With a tournament-record score of 18-under 266, it was Singh's 9th win of the year.

MOVING DAY ADVENTURE

Mark Calcavecchia was in the parking lot Friday night heading home to West Palm Beach when he learned his 142 had made the cut for the weekend. He fired a then-course-record 62 on Saturday and went on to win the 2007 PODS Championship by one shot.

BIG HITTER HAS HOT PUTTER

Gary Woodland is a big hitter even by the inflated standards of the PGA TOUR, but he put on a putting clinic to win for the first time in the 2011 Transitions Championship. Seventeen times he attempted a putt of up to 20 feet - and he made every single one to edge Webb Simpson by one shot.

THE IRON MEN

With his appearance in the 2015 Valspar Championship, Kenny Perry matched Rocco Mediate for the most appearances in events sponsored by the Copperheads at 22. Both played in 12 mixed team and

10 PGA TOUR events. John Huston is the only other player to participate in 20 events organized by the Copperheads.

MULTIPLE WINNERS

All but one of the 16 individuals to win PGA TOUR events on the Copperhead have also won other titles, topped by Vijay Singh with 34. Adam Hadwin (2017) is the exception. Carl Pettersson (2005), Gary Woodland (2011) and Kevin Streelman (2013) are the other three winners whose first PGA TOUR title came in the Valspar Championship.

LARRY PACKARD

The Copperhead was the masterpiece of noted architect Larry Packard who worked on more than 600 courses in his career. He designed the Copperhead with championship golf in mind, and saw his dream come to fruition in 1990 when the first JCPenney Classic was held on it. The course was recently selected in a survey of PGA TOUR pros as one of the 10 best on the PGA TOUR.

Packard made his home at Innisbrook for many years and was a familiar figure during tournament competition, almost always attired in a plaid jacket. He passed away in 2014 at age 101.



BIRDIES FOR TAMPA BAY CHARITIES

Now in its 19th year, the Birdies for Tampa Bay Charities program of the Valspar Championship has become one of the most successful of its kind in the country.

Birdies for Tampa Bay Charities is a fundraising program designed to give charities an opportunity to raise money for their organizations based on the number of birdies made by contestants during the Valspar Championship. Charities retain 100% of the pledges collected for their organization. Birdies for Tampa Bay Charities allows any locally-based non-profit organization to be a part of the Valspar Championship.
