Things to Know

- Defending champion Paul Casey holds the 54-hole lead in his bid to become the first back-to-back winner of the event
- Casey has converted one of five 54-hole leads/co-leads entering the week
- Dustin Johnson sits one shot back, seeking his 21st TOUR victory, which would move him in a tie for 30st in the all-time TOUR winners list
- Jason Kokrak made an ace on the par-3 15th hole from 219 yards to move into third place

- 9 Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win the Valspar Championship (most recent: Adam Hadwin/2017)
- Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win in 2018-19 (most recent: Dustin Johnson/WGC-Mexico Championship)

Paul Casey (1st/-9)

- Seeks to become the first player to successfully defend Valspar Championship title
- Represents his sixth 54-hole lead/co-lead of his PGA TOUR career; has converted one of the previous five to victory

- Earlier this season, began the final round of the 2019 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am with a three-shot lead over Phil Mickelson before carding a 1-under 71 to finish runner up
- Seeking to join K.J. Choi and Retief Goosen as multiple winners of the event
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (10.059)
- Top-three finishes in the 2018-19 season: 2nd/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T3/World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship

Dustin Johnson (2nd/-8)

- Seeking his 21st TOUR victory in his 248th career start, which would move into a tie for 30st in the all-time TOUR winners list with Davis Love III, Willie Macfarlane, Lanny Wadkins and Craig Wood
- With a victory, would record his fourth consecutive season with multiple wins
- Eight of his 20 TOUR victories have been come-from-behind wins
- Missed the cut in his two previous starts at the Valspar Championship (2008, 2010)
- Extended his streak of rounds in the 60s to 14 (longest active on TOUR and his career-long)
- Has finished inside the top 10 in four of his last five starts, highlighted by a win at the WGC-Mexico Championship

Jason Kokrak (3rd/-7)

- Made an ace on the par-3 15th hole from 219 yards with an 8-iron, recording the 11th ace in tournament history
- Recorded his second ace on TOUR, followed by an ace at the 2013 RBC Canadian Open in the third round on No. 4
- Seeking his first TOUR victory in his 197th career start; owns two runner-up finishes (2016 Genesis Open, 2012 Safeway Open)
- Has not missed a cut since the 2018 Open Championship (span of 17 starts)
- Owns two top-10 finishes (T7/2015, T8/2018) in nine starts at the Valspar Championship

Miscellaneous Notes

- Former World No. 1 Luke Donald (T4) sits three shots back of the leader and entered the week tied with K.J. Choi, Jim Furyk and Charles Howell for most top-10 finishes at the event (T4/2014, T4/2013, 1st/2012, T6/2010)
- Louis Oosthuizen (T6) tied the lowest round of the day with Jason Kokrak with a 5-under 66
- Following a runner-up finish at THE PLAYERS Championship, 2010 Valspar Championship winner **Jim Furyk (T6)** carded a 3-under 68 to move inside the top 10; looking for his third consecutive top-10 finish of the season
