Things to Know

- Paul Casey becomes the first player to successfully defend Valspar Championship title
- Europeans have won in three consecutive weeks on the PGA TOUR for the first time since 2010
- Jason Kokrak collects his third runner-up finish on TOUR
- Sungjae Im collects his second top-five in his last three starts
- There were no bogey-free rounds Sunday and just five all week

Age: 41 (July 21, 1977)

Wins (3): 2009 Houston Open, 2018 Valspar Championship, 2019 Valspar Championship

- Claims his third career PGA TOUR title in his 250th start at the age of 41 years, 8 months, 3 days
- With the win, collects 500 FedExCup points and moves from No. 16 to No. 4 in the standings
- Is projected to move to No. 11 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Becomes the first player to successfully defend a Valspar Championship title and third player to win the event multiple times, joining K.J. Choi (2002, 2006) and Retief Goosen (2003, 2009)
- Becomes the first player on the PGA TOUR to successfully defend a title since Brooks Koepka (2017, 2018 U.S. Open)
- Becomes the second player to win on TOUR during the 2018-19 season with an over-par score in the final round (joins Rickie Fowler/74/Waste Management Phoenix Open)
- Becomes the third consecutive European to win on TOUR (Francesco Molinari/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, Rory McIlroy/THE PLAYERS Championship), which had not occurred since 2010 (Justin Rose/the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide, Lee Westwood/FedEx St. Jude Classic, Graeme McDowell/U.S. Open)

- Wins in his 10th start of the 2018-19 season, with other top-three finishes coming at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
 (2nd) and WGC-Mexico Championship (T3)
- Has now converted two of six 54-hole leads/co-leads on the PGA TOUR into victory (2009 Houston Open, 2019 Valspar Championship)
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (11.238)

Jason Kokrak (T2/-7)

- Was seeking his first TOUR victory in his 197th career start
- Now owns three runner-up finishes (2019 Valspar Championship, 2016 Genesis Open, 2012 Safeway Open)
- Collected top-10 finishes in three of the four Florida events on the PGA TOUR during the 2018-19 season: T9/The Honda Classic, T10/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by MasterCard, T2/Valspar Championship
- Collects his third top-10 finish in his ninth start at the Valspar Championship (T7/2015, T8/2018, T2/2019)
- Has not missed a cut since the 2018 Open Championship (span of 17 starts)

Louis Oosthuizen (T2/-7)

- Making his seventh start in the Valspar Championship, eagled the par-5 first hole en route to a 69
- Following three straight missed cuts in the event from 2013-2015, finished T7 in 2016 and T16 in 2018
- Collects his second top-five finish in his seventh start of the 2018-19 season (T5/CIMB Classic, T2/Valspar Championship)
- Lone PGA TOUR victory came at the 2010 Open Championship

Dustin Johnson (T6/-5)

- Was in search of his 21st TOUR victory and second of the 2018-19 season (WGC-Mexico Championship)
- Most recently failed to record a birdie in the final round of the 2017 WGC-HSBC Champions, where he lost a six-shot lead
- Last over-par score in the final round of a PGA TOUR event before this week was the 2018 Genesis Open
- Scoring on Nos. 1-4 in the first three rounds: 5-under; final round: 2-over
- Streak of rounds in the 60s ended at 14 (was longest-active on TOUR and his career-longest)
- Has finished in the top 10 in five of his last six starts, highlighted by the win at the WGC-Mexico Championship
- Missed the cut in each of his two previous starts at the Valspar Championship (2008, 2010)

Miscellaneous Notes

- Sungiae Im's T4 marked his second top-five showing in his last three starts (T3/Arnold Palmer Invitational)
- In his eighth start at the Valspar Championship, **Bubba Watson** closed with a 3-under 68 to finish T4. His only previous top-10 showing at Innisbrook was solo-third in 2010
- Following a 4-under 32 on his outgoing nine, **Sergio Garcia** (T54) posted a 6-over 41 on his inward half, including a quintuple bogey on the par-4 16th
