Things to Know

- 75 players made the 36-hole cut at 1-over 143 from a field of 156 professionals
- Jason Dufner ties his career-low score with a 63
- 18-hole co-leader Joel Dahmen records a second straight 66 and holds best career 36-hole position
- Phil Mickelson shoots 76, misses cut for first time in 16 tournament starts
- Rory McIlroy inside the top five despite a double-bogey, bogey finish

- Second-round 63 ties his career-low score (seventh instance; most recent: R2/2013 PGA Championship/won)
- 63 marks his lowest score in relation to par since posting first- and third-round 8-under 64s at the 2016 Desert Classic, his fourth of five wins on the PGA TOUR
- When holding at least a share of the 36-hole lead on the PGA TOUR, has converted for the win five of 11 times, most recently at the 2017 Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide
- Made 134 feet, 10 inches of putts in round two (25 putts)
- Is working towards his first top-10 finish since a T5 at the 2018 PLAYERS Championship
- Best finish in 15 starts this season is T21 at the Mayakoba Golf Classic
- In five previous starts at the Wells Fargo Championship, has a T5 (2009), a T42 (2018) and three missed cuts

Max Homa (T2/-10)

- Made eight birdies and no bogeys to follow a 2-under 69 with a 63, tying his career-low (R3/2015 Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Was one of just three players to avoid a bogey in round two
- Is making his third start at the Wells Fargo Championship (T76/2015, MC/2017)
- Made a return to the PGA TOUR by virtue of finishing 15th on the 2018 Web.com Tour Finals money list
- Two-time Web.com Tour winner remains in search of his first TOUR victory in his 69th start.
- Best of three career top-10 finishes is T6 at the 2015 Sony Open in Hawaii
- 2013 University of California-Berkeley alum earned All-America honors with the Bears and won the 2013 NCAA individual championship

Joel Dahmen (T2/-10)

- Offset one bogey with six birdies to post a second consecutive 66
- T2 is his best 36-hole position of his PGA TOUR career (previous: T6 – 2019 Farmers Insurance Open, 2019 Valspar Championship)
- Making third start at the event (MC/2017, T16/2018)
- Currently 65th in the FedExCup, with lone top-10 of the season coming at the Farmers Insurance Open (T9)
- Advanced to the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time in the 2017-18 season (80th in the final standings)
- Best finish in 63 career PGA TOUR starts: T2/2018 John Deere Classic

Miscellaneous notes

- **Rory McIlroy**, the event's only two-time winner (2010, 2015), finished double-bogey, bogey on Nos. 8 and 9, respectively, to post a 1-under 70. Is T4 at 6-under 136
- Looking to improve on last year's eighth-place finish at the Wells Fargo Championship, **Patrick Reed** is at 6-under 136 and T4. Reed is now a perfect seven-for-seven in cuts made at the event
- **Justin Rose**, who has top-fives in each of his last two starts at the event, posted a bogey-free 67 to move to 5-under 137 (T6)
- Defending champion **Jason Day (T6)** is at 5-under 137 and six strokes back
- **Phil Mickelson** missed his first cut at the Wells Fargo Championship after scores of 71-76—147 (+5). He was making his 23rd TOUR start in the state of North Carolina this week, where he has never won. In addition to 16 starts at the Wells Fargo Championship, he played the Wyndham Championship in Greensboro in 1993 (T50), 1997 (T9) and 1998 (T6). He also played the U.S. Open at Pinehurst in 1999 (2nd), 2005 (T33) 2014 (T28), as well as the PGA Championship at Quail Hollow in 2017 (MC)
- **Mickelson's** 6-over 41 on his outgoing nine marks his highest nine-hole score on the PGA TOUR since posting a 9-over 44 on the back nine of the 2018 U.S. Open in round three
